## **TAYLOR COUNTY ASSOCIATION OF KENTUCKY BAPTISTS**

### **CONSTITUTION**

**Article 1.** This body shall be called the Taylor County Association of Kentucky Baptists.

**Article 2.** Each cooperating church shall be entitled to four (4) messengers, one of whom shall be the pastor, and one additional messenger for each fifty (50) members or fraction thereof, above the first one hundred (100) members, plus four (4) messengers from each mission sponsored.

**Article 3.** The business of this body shall be, when assembled, to hear reports from the churches with regard to their condition as to members, prosperity, etc., to consult together for their development and growth in all matters pertaining to the evangelism of the world, and shall hold and control such property as shall come into possession of the association.

**Article 4.** The body shall exercise no authority over the local churches, and recognizes their complete autonomy. The Association reserves the right, as final action, to sever relations with any cooperating church for engaging in practices not considered Biblical.

**Article 5.** The Time, Place, and Preacher Committee shall, in addition to the annual meeting, select a time and place for a spring session for the purpose of electing officers for the next associational year, at which time the body shall elect by nomination and private ballot, or raising hand vote: Moderator; First Assistant Moderator; Second Assistant Moderator; Clerk; Assistant Clerk; Treasurer; Assistant Treasurer; and Auditor; whose duties shall be as custom imposes on their respective offices. The Nominating Committee shall also make its report at this time and all auxiliary directors shall be elected. All officers shall continue in office until superceded by their successor, but none shall be eligible to the office of moderator for more than two successive terms.

**Article 6.** Churches desiring fellowship in the association must make application to the executive board at least six (6) months prior to the annual meeting. The application shall be referred to a Credentials Committee who shall be responsible for examining the church's articles of faith and record of mission support. The committee will also be responsible for bringing a preliminary report to the Executive Board and a final report to the Annual Meeting.

**Article 7.** The Executive Board of the Association shall be composed of all pastors of cooperating churches and missions and one lay member from each church. All general associational officers and auxiliary heads will by virtue of their office be members of the Executive Board. The retiring Moderator will be a member of the Executive Board for the year following his active service as a moderator. Each associational officer shall hold the same office in the sessions of the Executive Board. The Executive Board shall be responsible for the work of the association between the annual sessions. Quorum of the Executive Board consists of nine (9) members.

**Article 8.** In the appointment of committees, individuals shall be named instead of churches, and on each committee named, one or more members shall be laymen. The Promotional Committee shall consist of Moderator, Clerk, Treasurer, heads of the Associational Organizations, and such other members as the occasion demands.

**Article 9.** This body shall meet annually, according to adjustment, but in case of emergency, the Executive Board may call a special session, and also change the time and place of the meeting. In addition to the annual meeting, the body shall meet in spring session for the purpose of electing officers for the following associational year.

**Article 10.** This Constitution may be altered or amended (except Article 4) at any meeting of the body, upon one year's notice, by concurrence of two-thirds of the members present.

Parliamentary Rules: Kerfoot's Parliamentary Rules of Order is a guide of the parliamentary order followed by the association.

## BY-LAWS

### ARTICLE 1--DUTIES OF OFFICERS

1. Officers elected at the spring session shall assume their duties at the close of the last session in the fall meeting.
2. The Clerk shall keep a record of the proceedings of the Association and the Executive Board, superintend the printing and distribution of the minutes of the Association which shall include statistics from August 1 through July 31 immediately preceding the annual meeting covered by the minutes, send five copies to the Secretary of the Kentucky Baptist Convention, send copies to various other Baptist agencies, and keep a file of the minutes and other important papers of the association.
3. The Treasurer shall receive all money contributed by the churches to the Association or money received from other sources, shall make reports to the Association and the Executive Board and shall make disbursements as authorized by the Association and the Executive Board, and shall be authorized to pay all bills and salaries established by the budget adopted at an annual meeting until the next budget is adopted at the following annual meeting. He shall be bonded and the bonding fee paid by the association.
4. An auditor shall be secured by the Executive Board to audit the Treasurer's books and attest his annual report. The auditing expense, if any shall be paid by the Association.

## ARTICLE II--COMMITTEES

1. The Promotion Committee shall be responsible for planning, developing, and promoting a program of activities for the year in all phases of church work. This committee shall give a monthly report on the progress of their program.
2. The Program Committee will plan the programs for the annual meetings and shall report as far in advance as possible.
3. The Nominating Committee, after consulting with the Auxillaries of the Association, shall recommend to the Association at its annual meeting nominations for all Associational Sunday School Officers, Associational W. M. U. Officers, Associational Church Training Officers, Associational Brotherhood Officers, Church Music Officers, and such other officers as the body may from time to time assign them.
4. 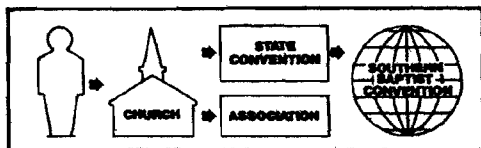

## PROCEEDINGS

### ROBINSON CREEK September 15, 1986 7:00 P. M.

1. The twenty-ninth annual session of the Taylor County Association of Baptists in Kentucky was called to order at 6:58 P. M. by the Moderator, Bro. Darrell Hunt.
2. The congregation was led in singing the hymn, "To God Be the Glory," by Miss Lisa Gupton, Music Chairman for the association.
3. Host Pastor, Bro. Steve James, welcomed those present, read Acts 20:17-28, and led in prayer.
4. The clerk moved that the presently registered messengers and those who would be registering later in the meeting and at later meetings be seated as the messengers to the twenty-ninth annual meeting of Taylor County Baptists. The motion was seconded by Dr. J. Chester Badgett and was approved.
5. Bro. Harold Smith made the motion that the printed program distributed at the door as the people entered be accepted as the program for the meeting with any changes, deletions, or amendments to be made as needed. This motion was adopted after a second by Bro. Steve James.
6. The clerk, after the roll-call of churches, announced that all twenty of the churches in the association were represented at the meeting. A total of 129 messengers and 31 visitors were registered for the first session.
7. Bros. Boyd Robertson, Phillip Ronk, Mike Moynahan, Charles Harris, and J. V. Mullen were introduced as new pastors who had accepted churches in the association since the 1985 session. Visitors from outside the association, Bros. Grady Randolph and Tom Moore, were also welcomed to the meeting.
8. The moderator announced the appointments of the Time, Place, and Preacher Committee and the Resolutions Committee which he had appointed at the August Session of the Executive Board. The Time, Place, and Preacher Committee is composed of Bro. Bob Martin, Chairman; Bro. Arthur Antle; and Bro. Randy Smith. The Resolutions Committee was named with Dr. James E. Jones as chairman, and serving with him were Bros. Tom Gupton and Roger Alford.
9. The clerk moved that the Digest of Letters, the Table of Historical Events, and the Executive Board Report which had been distributed at the door be adopted into the minutes of the association. This motion was seconded by Bro. Tom Gupton and was approved by voice vote.
10. The Treasurer's Report was presented by the Treasurer, Bro. Jim Fox, who moved for its approval. Duly seconded, the motion carried.
11. Bro. E. Poe Young brought the Auditor's Report and moved for its approval. The motion carried after a second by the clerk.
12. The Time, Place, and Preacher Committee report was made by Bro. Bob Martin, who made the motion it be approved. Duly seconded, the motion carried. The Spring Session will meet at Good Hope on 11 May, 1987, with Bro. Randy Smith to bring the message. Alternate preacher will be Bro. Steve James. The Fall Sessions will be on 7 and 8 September, 1987, at Eastside and Pleasant Hill respectively with Dr. James Jones to bring the message. The alternate preacher for this session will be Bro. Phillip Ronk.

13. The "In Memoriam" report was given by Bro. Thurmon Eaton, who made several comments about the brevity of life. After reading a list of the members of the association's churches who went to be with the Lord during the past associational year, Bro. Eaton sang "When They Ring Those Golden Bells." After this, the Director of Missions, Bro. Henry Parrott, read a letter which he had received from Bro. L. M. Hamilton, who was recovering from a heart attack. Bro. Gilbert Sapp then led in a prayer for the recovery of Bro. Hamilton.
14. The Associational Music Chairman, Miss Lisa Gupton, led the congregation in the singing of "Give of Your Best to the Master."
15. Bro. Boyd Robertson presented the Home Mission Report and made several comments concerning his years both as a home and a foreign missionary. He moved for the approval of his report. Seconded by the clerk, the motion carried.
16. A. Bro. Tom Moore presented the Child Care Report. He made several comments concerning the contributions Kentucky Baptists have made to the betterment of children's lives who have come in contact with the program.  
B. Bro. Grady Randolph then made a few comments concerning the plight of retired ministers who have served Southern Baptist Churches and the money which they receive now that they have retired. He was representing the Annuity Board.
17. Dr. J. Chester Badgett presented the Christian Education Report, and after he made several comments of the impact which Kentucky Colleges have had on the lives of his family and acquaintances, a motion was made for its approval. The motion was duly seconded and carried.
18. Dr. W. R. Davenport reported on the impact of Christian Education over its three hundred fifty year history in the United States and the part which Campbellsville College has had in this impact. His report included the statistics that Campbellsville now has fifty percent of its professors with Doctorates.
19. The special music, "Whatever It Takes," was sung by Miss Lisa Gupton.
20. Bro. George Gaddie brought the annual sermon. His topic and a brief outline are as follows:

**"Southern Baptists Are a Great People."**

Text: I Peter 2:9, 10.

PROPOSITION--Southern Baptists are a great people because they are a people of the Book with a sense of a mission.

I. Southern Baptists are a people of the Book.

A. They may differ concerning theories of inspiration but all believe in inspiration.

B. They may differ in interpretation of some scripture, but all agree on basic belief concerning the plan of salvation.

II. Southern Baptists are a great people because they are a people with a sense of a mission.

A. We may differ in methods we use to fulfill that mission but we are all committed to it.

B. Some may be involved more than others, but we are all involved.

21. The closing prayer was brought by Bro. Jerry Parker, a member of the host church, Robinson Creek.
22. There being no further business, the first session of the twenty-ninth Annual Meeting of Taylor County Baptists in Kentucky was adjourned until the following afternoon at Green River Memorial.

23. The second session of the annual meeting of Taylor County Association of Baptists in Kentucky was called to order at 3:30 P. M. by the moderator, Bro. Darrell Hunt.
24. Bro. Ed Garr, Minister of Music at Campbellsville, led the congregation in the singing of "Since Jesus Came Into My Heart."
25. Host pastor, Bro. Don Gowin, welcomed those in attendance, introduced them to the facilities, read Matthew 28:18-20, and led in prayer.
26. **DEPARTMENT REPORTS**
  - A. The Sunday School report was brought by Bro. Gowin, the Associational Sunday School and Vacation Bible School Director, who moved for its approval. Seconded by the clerk, the motion carried.
  - B. Bro. Gowin then gave the Vacation Bible School report and moved for its approval. This motion was carried after a second by Dr. J. Chester Badgett.
  - C. Bro. L. D. Kennedy, Associational Church Training Director, gave the Church Training report and moved it be approved as read. After a second, he spoke to the report. The report was approved.
  - D. The Women's Missionary Union report was brought by the director, Mrs. Jane Fox. She moved for its adoption, and after being duly seconded, the motion carried.
  - E. The Brotherhood report was given by the Associational Royal Ambassador Director, Bro. Glen Canada. He moved for its approval, and with a second by the clerk, the report was adopted.
  - F. Bro. Ed Garr read the Music Report prepared by the Music Director, Miss Lisa Gupton, and moved that it be adopted. This motion carried after a second by the clerk.
  - G. The associational Youth Director, Bro. Tony Rodgers, made the Youth report and moved for its adoption. Bro. Bob Martin seconded the motion, which carried.
27. **COMMITTEE REPORTS**
  - A. The Missions Committee report was given by the chairman, Bro. David Turner. With his motion for adoption and a second by Dr. J. Chester Badgett, the report was adopted.
  - B. Bro. Tom Gupton, Chairman of the Evangelism Committee, made that committee's report and moved for its approval. Seconded by Bro. Lynwood Kessler, the report was approved.
  - C. The Stewardship and Cooperative Program and the associational Stewardship reports were given by Bro. Homer Kirtley, who made the motion that they be adopted. Seconded by Dr. Badgett, the motion carried and they were approved.
  - D. In the absence of a report from the Singles ministry of the association, Bro. Don Gowin made a report on the concerns of the Christian Life Committee which was appointed by the moderator about two years ago in the Executive Board. After several comments by Bro. Gowin, Dr. J. Chester Badgett made the following motion: I move that the Taylor County Baptist Association go on record as supporting any effort to control the use of alcohol and drugs in Taylor County, realizing the tragedy that is coming to children, and calling on adults to set the right kind of example for our young people. This motion was seconded by Bro. Gowin and carried unanimously.

28. Bro. Ed Garr led the congregation in the singing of "Serve the Lord with Gladness."
29. Bro. Jesse Stricker, representing the Kentucky Baptist Convention, brought a message, building on the scripture reading by Bro. Gowin at the beginning of the service. He added another verse to Matthew 28:18-20 as the basis of his message, Acts 1:8. He emphasized that Jesus had used the last few moments of his time on earth to remind his followers to be about the main task.

### 30. MISCELLANEOUS BUSINESS SESSION

- A. Bro. L. D. Kennedy, Nominating Committee Chairman, made nominations to fill some vacancies which have arisen since the spring meeting. These nominations were as follows: Brotherhood Director--Bro. Willard Wise, Evangelism Committee--Bro. Paul Pike (1 year unexpired term of Bro. Bill Clement), and Missions Committee--Bro. Raymond Bell (1 year unexpired term of Bro. Darrell Hunt). He moved that these be approved. Bro. Marshall Black seconded the motion and these men were approved for their respective offices.
- B. A proposed ammendment to Article 6 in the constitution which was referred from the 1985 session was read by the Chair. Bro. Jerry Kibbons moved that it be adopted. Bro. George Gaddie seconded the motion and it was adopted. Article 6 now reads as follows: Churches desiring fellowship in the association must make application to the executive board at least six (6) months prior to the annual meeting. The application shall be referred to a Credentials Committee who shall be responsible for examining the church's articles of faith and record of mission support. The committee will also be responsible for bringing a preliminary report to the Executive Board and a final report to the Annual Meeting.
- C. A proposed ammendment to Article 7 in the constitution received its first reading at this session. The proposed change will make Committee Chairmen Executive Board Members. The Executive Board had already gone on record as interpreting this article to include the Committee Chairmen. The proposed new wording is bold faced and underlined. The Executive Board of the Association shall be composed of all pastors of cooperating churches and missions and one lay member from each church. All general associational officers, auxillary heads, and committee chairmen will by virtue of their office be members of the Executive Board. The retiring Moderator will be a member of the Executive Board for the year following his active service as a moderator. Each associational officer shall hold the same office in the sessions of the Executive Board. The Executive Board shall be responsible for the work of the association between the annual sessions. Quorum of the Executive Board consists of nine (9) members.
- D. A proposed change was made for Item 2 under By-laws dealing with the Duties of Officers. Dr. J. Chester Badgett moved that the proposed change be approved. Seconded by the clerk, the motion carried. This Item now reads as follows: The Clerk shall keep a record of the proceedings of the Association and the Executive Board, superintend the printing and distribution of the minutes of the Association which shall include statistics from August 1 through July 31 immediately preceeding the annual meeting covered by the minutes, send five copies to the Secretary of the Kentucky Baptist Convention, send copies to various other Baptist agencies, and keep a file of the minutes and other important papers of the association.

- E. Bro. George Gaddle moved to approve an amendment to Item 3 under the Duties of Officers. This motion was seconded by Bro. Lynwood Kessler. After discussion clarifying the action, the motion carried. Item 3 now reads as follows: The Treasurer shall receive all money contributed by the churches to the Association or money received from other sources, shall make reports to the Association and the Executive Board and shall make disbursements as authorized by the Association and the Executive Board, and shall be authorized to pay all bills and salaries established by the budget adopted at an annual meeting until the next budget is adopted at the following annual meeting. He shall be bonded and the bonding fee paid by the association.
- F. A third proposed amendment to the By-laws concerning Committees was read. Bro. J. V. Mullen moved that this amendment be approved. Bro. Tom Gupton seconded the motion and it was amended. The change added the Time, Place, and Preacher Committee and the Resolutions Committee to the list of standing committees. Item 4 of the By-laws now reads as follows: The standing committees of the Association shall be Budget Committee; Program Committee; Missions Committee; Evangelism Committee; Christian Education Committee; Time, Place, and Preacher Committee; Resolutions Committee; and the Nominating Committee which shall be responsible for nominating all Standing Committee Members. Members of the Standing Committees will serve three years on a rotating basis with one member rotating off each year, with the exception of the Missions Committee which shall have, in addition to the three members, a representative from the Women's Missionary Union and a representative from the Brotherhood selected annually. All other committees shall be appointed by the Moderator unless specified by special motion.
- G. A question concerning the progress which the association is making concerning the obtaining of Baptist Telecommunications Network was raised. This question was referred to the Media Committee since there was no provision in the budget for it.
31. There being no further Miscellaneous Business, the second session was adjourned by Bro. Bob Martin's prayer which served as a Blessing on the bountiful meal which followed.

35. The moderator welcomed the visitors and several announcements were made.

36. Bro. Don Gowin, Sunday School Director for the association, made the Sunday School Awards for the associational year, 1985-86.
- A. Greatest Enrolment Gains--Campbellsville-19, Meadowview-20, and Elkhorn-97.
  - B. Greatest Percentage Enrolment Gains--Saloma-15.73%, Elkhorn-31.9%, and Meadowview-58.82%.

  - D. Greatest Percentage Average Attendance Gain--South Campbellsville-7.44%, Elkhorn-15.43%, and Meadowview-33.33%.
37. The proposed budget for the 1986-87 Associational Year was presented by Bro. Homer Kirtley, the Stewardship Chairman, who moved for its adoption. The motion was seconded by Bro. Marshall Black and carried.
38. Bro. Tom Gupton, a member of the Resolutions Committee, presented the report of that committee and moved that the resolutions be adopted. This motion was carried after a second by Bro. Tony Rodgers.
39. Bro. Tony Rodgers requested the floor and made the following motion: I move that the Association establish a Baptist Telecommunication Network Fund, inviting individual churches in the association to participate at a cost of at least \$50.00 per church. This motion was seconded by Bro. Terry Bright and was approved.
40. Miss Lisa Gupton led the congregation in the singing of "Set My Soul Afire, Lord."
41. Bro. Henry Parrott, Director of Missions, presented the Association and State Missions report. This report was approved after a motion and second.
42. The clerk reported that a total of one hundred forty-seven messengers and thirty-nine visitors had been registered for the three sessions.
43. Prior to the special music, Bro. Glen Canada introduced Dr. Allen West, the missionary speaker for the evening. The special music consisted of two numbers, "Victory in Jesus" and "It Is Well With My Soul," sung by church music directors in the association. Those singing were Miss Lisa Gupton, and Bros. David Shaffer, Tom Biggs, Tony Rodgers, Ed Hamlin, and Ed Garr.
44. Dr. Allen West, an assistant in the Direct Missions Department in the Kentucky Baptist Convention who works with the Kentucky-Kenya Partnership, brought the annual missionary message, based on Matthew 9:35. His challenge was for volunteers from our association to go to Kenya.
45. After the message, Bro. Darrell Hunt, the moderator for the coming associational year, closed the final session of the twenty-ninth Annual Meeting of Taylor County Baptists with prayer.

### **HOME MISSIONS REPORT**

**HOME MISSIONS**--evident truth that God blesses in the midst of diversity as He has blessed throughout history, as this past year we have cooperated with thirty-seven state conventions in eighty-seven different languages, utilizing 3,723 missionaries coming from unique backgrounds, many of whom witness in more than one language.

Major programs, trying to encourage and assist in all associations statewide are: Afro-Americans in church relations with 2,000 college students, one hundred twenty-eight new pastors, two hundred ninety-seven scholarships, and sponsoring forty-two internships in our seminaries; chaplaincy in counseling, clothing and food centers for the destitute, aging, youth in trouble, substance addiction in the military, business, and industry, V. A. and general hospitals, law enforcement agencies, etc.; church extension and loans, metropolitan evangelism and church developments in populations more than 50,000 in more than three hundred thirty-seven centers; understanding and witnessing to cults; language missions in eighty-seven languages; rural-urban ministries; and special mission ministries with 49,138 volunteers.

The Home Mission Board cooperates in a very constructive way with Baptists in Kentucky to reach people for Jesus Christ. Total Mission gifts from the churches in our association this past year was \$435,771, or nearly 25% of the total tithes and offerings given through the churches.

## CHRISTIAN EDUCATION REPORT

Christian education sponsored by the Convention is offered at the High School level by Oneida Baptist Institute, Oneida--Barclay M. Moore, President; and at the College level by Campbellsville College, Campbellsville--W. R. Davenport, President, Cumberland College, Williamsburg--James H. Taylor, President, and Georgetown College, Georgetown--Morgan Patterson, President. Specialized minister education is provided by Clear Creek Baptist School, Pineville--Leon A. Simpson, President.

While none of these institutions was established by the Kentucky Baptist Convention, all have been adopted heartily and are very important to Kentucky Baptist life. The love and concern of Kentucky Baptists for Christian education in Kentucky is well established in the fact that almost 24% of our Kentucky Baptist Budget is allocated to this phase of our work. This is by far the largest allocation in our budget. This is more than goes to Foreign Missions, Home Missions, or State Missions. The fact that we help support five schools means that none receives adequate support.

We rejoice in the fact that every church in the association shared in the support of Christian education through the Cooperative Program. We commend the fourteen churches who, in addition to the support through the Cooperative Program, included Campbellsville College in your budget. In addition, we commend the many Taylor County Baptists who individually contributed to the support of Campbellsville College.

We urge every church to increase its support to Christian education by increasing the percentage of your church budget to the Cooperative Program since this is the lifeline of all our Baptist work. We encourage every church to include Campbellsville College in your budget next year until we have all our churches with the College in the budget. We also encourage Individual Baptists to make an annual investment in Campbellsville College.

We commend the work of all the administrators and faculty members in all our Baptist schools and pledge them our continued spiritual and financial support.

## SUNDAY SCHOOL REPORT

Our Sunday Schools continue to be a major way to reach people for Christ and his Church. The Sunday School enrolment across Kentucky has reached 374,949. The national figure of eight million represents an all-time high and forms a good base for launching our goal of reaching ten million by 1990. The 10/90 emphasis will be our major concern in the days ahead. Taylor County Baptists will want to support this effort of outreach and growth.

This year our association we have conducted the following:

A Central Training School in which sixty-five (65) were enrolled.

Two Vacation Bible School Clinics in which ninety (90) workers were trained.

Six out of seven of our ASSIST team members attended the ASSIST training at Ridgecrest.

In our statistics department, there's not much to bring rejoicing. Total Sunday School enrolment now stands at 4,527. That is an increase of eighty-three (83) over last year. However, our average attendance dropped ninety from last year. Eight (8) churches had an increase in average attendance. The largest percentage of enrolment gain was in the senior adults.

The challenge goal for 1986-1987 will be an increase in enrolment of five percent (5%). This can be done if each church in our association begins to take seriously the challenge of reaching people.

Finally, and of major importance, will be the State Sunday School Convention to be held October 9 and 10, 1987, at Bowling Green at the First Baptist Church. Please mark these dates and plan now to be a part of this exciting gathering.

## WOMEN'S MISSIONARY UNION REPORT

The act or process of providing the learner with knowledge, skill and competence in order to equip church members to extend their witness and ministry beyond themselves is **MISSION EDUCATION**. The purpose is to bring all persons to Christ and to glorify God. Missions is what the church does, either directly or through representative agents, to take the love of Jesus Christ to persons not now enrolled in the church or its programs.

Women's Missionary Union provides the opportunity for persons to become missions educated. This is done through W M U tasks: Teach Missions, Engage in Mission Action and Personal Witnessing, Support Missions, and Interpret and undergird the work of the church and the denomination.

In 1985-86 W. M. U. emphasis has been "Multiply the Vision." With enlistment in quality missions education as a major thrust, Taylor County Association Baptist W. M. U. has continued with the goal to have 1,552 members by 1988, or 50% of potential enrollment reached. The present membership is eight hundred fifth-four (854), in seventeen (17) organizations in the association. Three (3) churches and the one (1) mission do not have W. M. U.

The churches of Taylor County Association of Baptists shared in the 1985-1986 special mission offerings as follows: Lottie Moon Christmas Offering--\$36,715, Annie Armstrong Easter Offering--\$12,031, and Ellza Broadus (Kentucky State Missions) Offering--\$6,108. The total of these three special offerings is \$54,854.

## BROTHERHOOD REPORT

Kentucky's statewide Brotherhood enrolment has increased this past year by 6.58%, with a total of nine hundred six Brotherhood Organizations in 2,200 churches. There are seventy-two Brotherhood Directors in the seventy-nine Associations.

October 25 and 26, 1985--Hardin Hosey and Glen Canada attended the State Associational Officers Briefing at Cedarmore Baptist Assembly.

January 1986--Baptist Men's Day was observed in several of our churches.

February 14, 1986--The South Central Regional Royal Ambassador Congress was held at First Baptist Church in Russell Springs. Our Association was represented by four of our churches.

April 6, 1986--A Cooperative Program Prayer Breakfast was held at Campbellsville College for all Baptist Men. The speaker was William Faulkner from Green River Memorial Baptist Church.



April 11, 1986--There was a Royal Ambassador Swim and Gym Fellowship at the Campbellsville College Gymnasium.

April 19, 1986--The Associational Royal Ambassador Track Meet was held at Taylor County High School Track Field.

May 9 and 10, 1986--Six (6) boys and two (2) adults spent the night at Cedarmore Baptist Assembly, attending the Conclave and State Baptist Royal Ambassador Track meet. An honor was brought to our association when Lee Kendall, from Friendship, took first place in Cross Country Mile.

### MUSIC REPORT

We are concentrating on being "Musicians on Mission--That All May Hear" this year. The program for the Associational Music Shoptalk was on this theme, and the music leadership received a challenge from the State Music Department for us to take music from our churches and share with others in our community, state, country, and even to foreign countries, such as Kenya. Twenty-nine (29) persons from fourteen (14) churches attended the associational Shoptalk this year.

Choirs from Campbellsville and Lowell Avenue participated in the Regional Music Festival on March 14. Taylor County Association had more representatives at this festival than did any other association in our region.

Many of our churches have participated in Associational Choir Events. We have presented music at each of the Evangelism Rallies and at the Church Training "M" Night service.

The ongoing church music enrolment in our Kentucky Baptist Churches was 81,474 reported by 1,673 churches. In our association twenty (20) churches reported a total music enrolment of nine hundred thirty-three (933) persons for the year. This number represents a gain of one hundred forth-three (143) over last year's enrolment, which is an increase of 18.1%. The areas which experienced the most growth were Instrumental Ensembles and Preschool and Younger Children's Choirs. Youth enrolment was the only area in which a significant decrease was noted.

It is evident from these statistics that our association regards music as an important ministry in each church. May God continue to bless our efforts as we praise Him through song.

The total resident membership of Kentucky Baptist churches in 1985-86 is 543,922. The 2,276 churches in Kentucky reported a total of 15,575 baptisms. This means it took 49 members to baptize 1 person statewide. In Taylor County Association the 20 churches and 1 mission reported a total resident membership of 5,974, with a total number of 166 baptisms, a 9.2% increase over last year. This is one baptism for every 36 Taylor County Baptist members. The total number of baptisms increased over last year by 14.

The major activities in evangelism last year centered around the Good News America Simultaneous Revivals. Taylor County Baptists held four Evangelism Rallies, including the Good News America Rally in April. These meetings were hosted by different churches within the association. An excellent guest speaker brought inspirational messages at each meeting.

The Good News America Revivals were held April 13-20, 1986. Out of these revivals we had 57 baptisms.

The State Evangelism Conference was held February 24-25, 1986, at Walnut Street Baptist Church in Louisville.

The State Youth Evangelism Conference was held June 27 and 28, 1986, at Southern Baptist Seminary, in Louisville.

Area Good News America Celebration Rallies are planned by the Kentucky Baptist Convention's Evangelism Department during September and October 1986. We urge every pastor and church member to attend the celebration rally to be held in our area. These rallies will celebrate the happenings in the Good News America Revivals.

## ASSOCIATIONAL STEWARDSHIP REPORT

Total undesignated budget receipts of the churches for this year were \$1,393,789. This is a decrease from last year of \$23,682 or minus 1.67%.

Our churches contributed \$17,524 for the support of associational missions. This is an increase of \$4,615 and a 35.75% increase over last year. An increase is necessary this year if we are to meet our budget.

Our churches contributed \$281,608 for the support of Missions through the Cooperative Program. This is an increase of \$5,102 or 1.8% increase over last year.

Total gifts to missions were \$435,817. This is an increase of \$15,245 or 3.6% increase over the previous year.

Thanks be unto God for this stewardship report of the Taylor County Association, but only when we do our best will He say, "Well done."
