# TAYLOR COUNTY ASSOCIATION OF KENTUCKY BAPTISTS

## CONSTITUTION

- Article 1.** This body shall be called the Taylor County Association of Kentucky Baptists.
- Article 2.** Each cooperating church shall be entitled to four (4) messengers, one of whom shall be the pastor, and one additional messenger for each fifty (50) members or fraction thereof, above the first one hundred (100) members, plus four (4) messengers from each mission sponsored.
- Article 3.** The business of this body shall be, when assembled, to hear reports from the churches with regard to their condition as to members, prosperity, etc., to consult together for their development and growth in all matters pertaining to the evangelism of the world, and shall hold and control such property as shall come into possession of the association.
- Article 4.** The body shall exercise no authority over the local churches, and recognizes their complete autonomy. The Association reserves the right, as final action, to sever relations with any cooperating church for engaging in practices not considered Biblical.
- Article 5.** The Time, Place, and Preacher Committee shall, in addition to the annual meeting, select a time and place for a spring session for the purpose of electing officers for the next associational year, at which time the body shall elect by nomination and private ballot, or raising hand vote: Moderator; First Assistant Moderator; Second Assistant Moderator; Clerk; Assistant Clerk; Treasurer; Assistant Treasurer; and Auditor; whose duties shall be as custom imposes on their respective offices. The Nominating Committee shall also make its report at this time and all auxiliary directors shall be elected. All officers shall continue in office until superseded by their successor, but none shall be eligible to the office of moderator for more than two successive terms.
- Article 6.** Churches desiring fellowship in the association must make application to the executive board at least six (6) months prior to the annual meeting. The application shall be referred to a Credentials Committee who shall be responsible for examining the church's articles of faith and record of mission support. The committee will also be responsible for bringing a preliminary report to the Executive Board and a final report to the Annual Meeting.
- Article 7.** The Executive Board of the Association shall be composed of all pastors of cooperating churches and missions and one lay member from each church. All general associational officers, auxiliary heads, and committee chairmen will by virtue of their office be members of the Executive Board. The retiring Moderator will be a member of the Executive Board for the year following his active service as a moderator. Each associational officer shall hold the same office in the sessions of the Executive Board. The Executive Board shall be responsible for the work of the association between the annual sessions. Quorum of the Executive Board consists of nine (9) members.
- Article 8.** In the appointment of committees, individuals shall be named instead of churches, and on each committee named, one or more members shall be laymen. The Promotional Committee shall consist of Moderator, Clerk, Treasurer, heads of the Associational Organizations, and such other members as the occasion demands.
- Article 9.** This body shall meet annually, according to adjustment, but in case of emergency, the Executive Board may call a special session, and also change the time and place of the meeting. In addition to the annual meeting, the body shall meet in spring session for the purpose of electing officers for the following associational year.
- Article 10.** This Constitution may be altered or amended (except Article 4) at any meeting of the body, upon one year's notice, by concurrence of two-thirds of the members present.
- Parliamentary Rules:** Kerfoot's Parliamentary Rules of Order is a guide of the parliamentary order followed by the association.

**BY-LAWS**  
**ARTICLE I--DUTIES OF OFFICERS**

1. Officers elected at the spring session shall assume their duties at the close of the last session in the fall meeting.
2. The Clerk shall keep a record of the proceedings of the Association and the Executive Board, superintend the printing and distribution of the minutes of the Association which shall include statistics from August 1 through July 31 immediately preceding the annual meeting covered by the minutes, send five copies to the Secretary of the Kentucky Baptist Convention, send copies to various other Baptist agencies, and keep a file of the minutes and other important papers of the association.
3. The Treasurer shall receive all money contributed by the churches to the Association or money received from other sources, shall make reports to the Association and the Executive Board covering the Associational year of August 1 through July 31 and shall make disbursements as authorized by the Association and the Executive Board, and shall be authorized to pay all bills and salaries established by the budget adopted at an annual meeting until the next budget is adopted at the following annual meeting. He shall be bonded and the bonding fee paid by the association.
4. An auditor shall be secured by the Executive Board to audit the Treasurer's books and attest his annual report. The auditing expense, if any shall be paid by the Association.

**ARTICLE II--COMMITTEES**

1. The Promotion Committee shall be responsible for planning, developing, and promoting a program of activities for the year in all phases of church work. This committee shall give a monthly report on the progress of their program.
2. The Program Committee will plan the programs for the annual meetings and shall report as far in advance as possible.
3. The Nominating Committee, after consulting with the Auxiliaries of the Association, shall recommend to the Association at its annual meeting nominations for all Associational Sunday School Officers, Associational W. M. U. Officers, Associational Church Training Officers, Associational Brotherhood Officers, Church Music Officers, and such other officers as the body may from time to time assign them.
4. The standing committees of the Association shall be Budget Committee; Program Committee; Missions Committee; Evangelism Committee; Christian Education Committee; Time, Place, and Preacher Committee; Resolutions Committee; Youth Committee; and the Nominating Committee which shall be responsible for nominating all Standing Committee Members. Members of the Standing Committees will serve three years on a rotating basis with one member rotating off each year, with the exception of the Missions Committee which shall have, in addition to the three members, a representative from the Women's Missionary Union and a representative from the Brotherhood selected annually. All other committees shall be appointed by the Moderator unless specified by special motion.

  - III. One of Kentucky Baptists' biggest concerns across the state is ministry. Ministry is defined as how we help Kentucky Baptist as leaders and followers. The Minister/Church Support division leads in providing counseling for ministers and families, financial assistance, annuity, scholarship assistance, and more. In the Brotherhood ministry is accomplished as it relates to Disaster Relief and Baptist Builders, spreading the Gospel by word and deed.
  - IV. Perhaps the area we see signatures written boldly is Missions (Kentucky-Kenya, Missions Kentucky, and a Missions Coordinator).
  - V. What is our own personal signature to the work of Kentucky Baptists? Supporting Cooperative Program through giving, participating in leadership development as a volunteer, going to where needs are in the community, in the state, or around the world.

Conclusion: Whatever we do, our signature should be written boldly and with a sense of direction so that people may come to know Jesus Christ and grow in His Spirit.

## 27. MISCELLANEOUS BUSINESS SESSION

- A. Rev. George R. Gaddie reported that the Nominating Committee wished to nominate Rev. Howard Davenport to fill the one-year unexpired term of Rev. Roger Alford on the Time, Place, and Preacher Committee. The motion carried after several seconds.

- B. After several comments as to the historical precedence of the his motion, the clerk moved that the Annual Meeting of Taylor County Baptists in Kentucky go on record to allow the clerk to limit the written reports in the Annual Book of Minutes beginning with the 1988 book of minutes to a maximum of two hundred fifty words and that the clerk be given the privilege of returning any report grossly exceeding this amount to its author to be edited to the prescribed number of words and that the clerk not be required to include a report in the book of minutes unless it is presented in written form. That person would be designated "Evangelism Director" and would be the contact person with KBC and SBC evangelism bodies and would oversee local efforts. This director, as with other associational directors would be eligible to serve as long as the association continues to elect that individual.

As in the past, there would be a three-member Evangelism Committee with members serving a three-year term. They would choose one member to be Assistant Evangelism Director.

At all times at least two of the four above mentioned would be lay people.

If this (request) is adopted, the present Evangelism Committee will recommend to the Nominating Committee a person to serve as director. If that person is now serving on the Evangelism Committee, they will also recommend someone to serve whatever remains of his term on the Evangelism Committee.

- B. Eleven past Moderators who were in attendance.
- C. Those who were on the original Constitutional Committee.
- D. Mr. Jeremiah Cox, who served the association for thirteen years as treasurer (1972-1985).

We rejoice to report that all twenty (20) churches participated in Vacation Bible School this year. However, our total enrollment shows a decrease of three hundred (300) from last year.

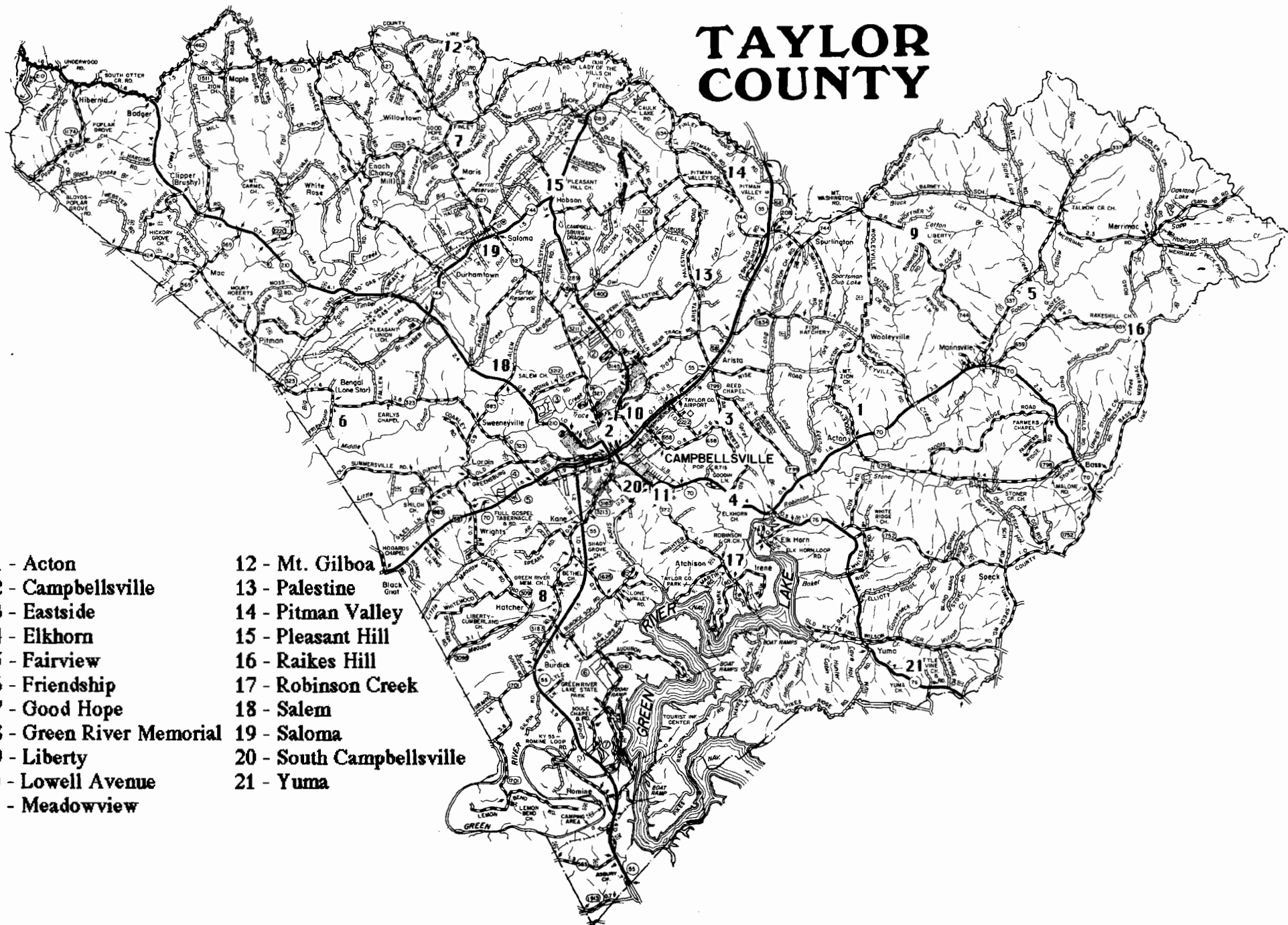

## CHURCH TRAINING REPORT 1987-1988

Fifteen church reported having some form of Church Training this year, compared to fourteen churches in 1987 and thirteen in 1986. Enrollment was up by 14.6 % this year.

Five (5) churches used materials from Equipping Centers, five (5) used Survival Kits, and three (3) had MasterLife groups. The use of all these materials has increased.

Greatest percentage enrollment gain was made by Mt. Gilboa (650 %); second was Green River Memorial (58.8 %). Greatest numerical enrollment gain was made by Campbellsville (54); second was Mt. Gilboa (52). Greatest percentage attendance gain was made by Pitman Valley (71.4 %); second was Pleasant Hill (31.7 %).

Campbellsville and Mt. Gilboa participated in Children's Bible Drills on both associational and state levels. One from Campbellsville and three for Mt. Gilboa were state winners. All of our churches should participate in this meaningful activity for children.

## MUSIC REPORT 1987-1988

This has been a year of transition for the Church Music Department in Kentucky. On March 1st, Dr. Eugene Quinn retired as Director of the department after thirty-one (31) years of faithful service to our Lord through the Kentucky Baptist Convention. His nine years of ministry in Illinois, prior to coming to Kentucky in 1958, makes a total of forty (40) years in denominational music ministry. Dr. Quinn was the first director of the Church Music Department in Kentucky.

At the Executive Board Meeting in May, Jim Cordell was elected to serve as the new director of the Church Music Department. Mr. Cordell has served for two years as an associate under Dr. Quinn.

The Kentucky Baptist Convention Church Music Department has seen twenty-one (21) consecutive years of growth. Our association helped make this possible. Churches from our association reported an enrollment of 835 from twenty churches this year, representing an gain for 2.7 % from 1987. Only three areas showed losses in enrollment this year, Preschool and Younger Children's Choirs and Handbell ringers, which showed greatest loss (48.1 %). Music leadership, which was down 40.2 % in 1987, showed an increase of 15.5 % for 1988. Gains were also seen in Older Children's Choirs, Adult Choirs, Vocal and Instrumental Ensembles, and Youth Choirs which increased by 28.9 %.

I am encouraged by the rise in Music Leadership enrollment and hope the coming year will find even more people involved in the Music Ministry.

**MISSIONS COMMITTEE REPORT**  
**1987-1988**

One important mission endeavor this year was the World Missions Conference in May. Eighteen (18) of the twenty (20) churches and one (1) mission participated. Four (4) foreign missionaries, (3) three home missionaries, and two (2) state missionaries were involved. The total attendance, including services in the churches and other meetings associated with the conference, was 4,837. Sixteen (16) people made recommitments and twelve (12) people made other decisions for a total of twenty-eight (28) decisions. Total expenses amounted to \$5,639.18.

Another very exciting mission activity has been the beginning of a jail ministry. Bro. Eugene Smith has led in the formation of this ministry and enlisted the help of Bro. Ray Flewellin and Mrs. Leona Davis. They visit the Taylor County jail each Sunday afternoon. Since starting this ministry they have made a total of one hundred fifty-three (153) contacts. Six (6) have made professions of faith, and there have been four (4) rededications. A number have requested to be remembered in prayer. One prisoner, now released, is now attending church services and has, himself, led another person to Christ. We commend these people for this very needed ministry and pray God's continued blessings upon them.

All twenty (20) churches and one (1) mission contributed to missions through the Cooperative Program and to Associational Missions. Total gifts through the Cooperative Program were \$297,128. Total Associational Missions gifts were \$24,292. The total of all mission giving was \$496,781.

**EVANGELISM COMMITTEE REPORT**  
**1987-1988**

During 1987-1988 we again conducted Associational Evangelism Rallies. As a result of a request made during discussion of such rallies in last year's fall meeting, one was held on a night other than a Wednesday. A local rally last June emphasizing youth evangelism included training sessions and was well attended by youth and adult alike.

Taylor County Association was well represented at the State Youth Evangelism Conference, and some of our young people made significant spiritual decisions.

This year's one hundred forty (140) baptisms is the smallest total in three years. This should be a matter of deep concern for every Taylor County Baptist. It should motivate us to do the following:

1. Get the priorities in our lives and our churches in line with the Biblical emphasis on evangelizing our home territory.
2. Pray for the success of the revival efforts in all our churches and serve in the witnessing work of your congregation.
3. Continue taking part in the Simultaneous Lay-led Revival in our association, April 14-16, 1989. This committee stands ready to inform and assist your church.
4. Develop an effective Sunday School Evangelism Team. There is no better tool. This will be the emphasis of our first Evangelism Rally of the coming year (November 2, 1988).
5. Make October 1988 through September 1989 truly a "Year of the Laity in Evangelism and Discipleship" in your church. This committee and the associational Church Training Director can recommend ways to implement this worthwhile emphasis of our Southern Baptist Convention Home Mission Board.

**STEWARDSHIP AND COOPERATIVE PROGRAM REPORT**  
**1987-1988**

Continued efforts to reach the world by the year 2000 are evidenced by our continued increase in our financial giving, as well as other methods of support in proclaiming the gospel.

Taylor County Baptist seem to dig a little deeper each year. Cooperative Program giving increased in 1988 by \$15,102, a 5.4 % increase over 1987, a statistic for which we are indeed grateful. We also have a very good increase in our associational mission gifts. From gifts of \$16,746 in 1987, there was an increase of 45.1 % to \$24,292 in 1988.

Total mission giving in 1987 was \$474,421. These gifts totaled \$496,781 in 1988 for an increase of 4.7 %.

The churches of the association gave 19.8 % of undesignated receipts through the Cooperative Program, an increase of 0.6 % over 1987.

**MEDIA COMMITTEE REPORT**  
**1987-1988**

Taylor County Baptist Association will soon be celebrating its first year as a member of the Baptist Telecommunications Network (BTN). We have taped over four hundred (400) hours of undated material this year, valued at over \$1,688.35 in the current BTN catalog. We have also taped over three hundred (300) hours of dated material; Sunday School, Church Training, Music, and Missions. Currently, seven (7) churches are taking advantage of the weekly Sunday School preparation tapes. Two other churches are receiving the monthly Preschool and Children's preparation tapes.

We are sincerely grateful to Campbellsville Baptist Church for allowing us to use their down-link facilities. Programs are listed on the monthly BTN Newsletter. The Director of Missions and BTN Coordinator decide which programs will be taped each month. Churches can always request special programs to be taped as needed.

We wish to keep the BTN ministry self-supporting. We are asking churches participating on a weekly basis to contribute \$100.00 each year and churches who receive any help from BTN to contribute \$50.00 per year to the fund over their regular associational giving. It will take more than \$900.00 to pay the subscription fee and to purchase the necessary tape.

In addition to BTN, Campbellsville and Pleasant Hill have formed the ACTS Board in the association. This board governs the twenty-three (23) hours of local time available on the ACTS network. Acts is currently telecasting on cable channel 23 in Campbellsville.

These two forms of media give the churches of Taylor County the opportunity to receive valuable help from professional sources and to share their message with the community. We are proud to be associated with both.

WHEREAS, the Campbellsville Twin Cinema has refused to show this movie,

Therefore, be it RESOLVED that Taylor County Baptist Association in annual meeting on September 19, 20, 1988, express its sincere appreciation to Mr. Gary Strange, the manager of the Campbellsville Twin Cinema, for refusing to show this movie.

## RESOLUTION ON STATE-SPONSORED LOTTERIES

WHEREAS, there are between four and eight million compulsive gamblers in the United States, compulsive gambling being recognized as a disease by the American Psychiatric Association, and there are millions of others who are affected by gambling activity, including the families of those who engage in gambling, and

WHEREAS, open discussion has been held in Kentucky about the establishment of a state lottery to attempt to cure part of the state's financial pressures, and

WHEREAS, state-operated lotteries are among the most regressive forms of raising revenue for the state, appealing primarily to the poor and locating distribution outlets in poor neighborhoods, and

WHEREAS, states which increasingly become dependent upon gambling as a source of revenue discover that legalized gambling does not produce the revenue that is projected for it and instead ensnares the state in a web which compromises the state regulatory agencies and encourages the state to become an active promoter and advertiser for the gambling industry and,

WHEREAS, legalization of gambling engages the state in the business of recruiting citizens into gambling activity, thereby avoiding its responsibility to promote the general welfare of its citizens.

Therefore, be it RESOLVED, that we, the messengers to the Taylor County Baptist Association assembling on September 19, 20, 1988, express our strong opposition to the establishment of a state lottery which would make our state increasingly dependent upon a source of income which derives from an industry which produces no necessary goods or services.

Be it further RESOLVED that we call upon Taylor County Baptists to urge state government leaders to work for responsible financial policies which provide for the general welfare rather than exploiting the misery of citizens in economic stress through establishing, advertising, and promoting a state lottery which holds out the promise of solving financial woes through winning a lottery.

Be it further RESOLVED that Taylor County Baptists and other citizens be encouraged to be active in opposing the well-financed efforts of the gambling industry to extend its tentacles into the lives of Kentucky families and communities.

Be it further RESOLVED that the Taylor County Baptist Association affirm the efforts of CASL (Citizens Against State Lottery) and support its efforts to defeat the lottery in the November election.

## RESOLUTION ON "IN GOD WE TRUST"

WHEREAS, an ad placed by the National Legal Foundation in the July 22, 1988, edition of USA Today claims that Madalyn Murray O'Hare is preparing to renew her attempts to have the slogan, "In God We Trust," removed from the currency of the United States, and

WHEREAS, National Legal Foundation's executive director, Robert Skolrood, has confirmed that the organization American Atheists does plan such action, and

WHEREAS, Mr. John Murray, president of American Atheists, said "One of the organization's chapter presidents does plan to file suit against the government again, and the organization is pledged to help with the suit," and

WHEREAS, Mr. Murray said that "His organization has three main targets in its effort to secularize the government: to remove 'Under God' from the Pledge of Allegiance, to remove 'In God We Trust' from United States currency, and to change the national motto from 'In God We Trust' to 'E Pluribus Unum,'" and

WHEREAS, Mr. Murray has said, "We're going to keep at it until the laws are changed, under those public arenas or secular. We want a nation with a government that is completely neutral about religion."

THEREFORE, be it RESOLVED, that Taylor County Baptist Association meeting September 19, 20, 1988, affirm the factual belief that our beloved nation was established by men and women who strongly believed in God, intended for this nation to be founded upon Godly principles and hoped that the United States would always honor and follow the leadership of almighty God.

Be it further RESOLVED that Taylor County Baptists strongly oppose the efforts by American Atheists and any other individual or organization to remove "In God We Trust" from United States currency.

Be it further RESOLVED that Taylor County Baptists affirm the retention of the phrase, "In God We Trust," from our currency.

Be it further RESOLVED that copies of this resolution be sent to all Kentucky Representatives, Senators, and prominent public leaders.

1. To Mt. Gilboa Baptist Church and its congregation, who in a very gracious manner have provided worshipful facilities and Christian hospitality.

A highlight of this past year was the World Missions Conference in May. Eighteen (18) churches participated with nine (9) missionaries spending the week with us. As a result of this conference, several churches increased their percentage of gifts through the Cooperative Program.

Another highlight of the year was the beginning of a jail ministry. A number were saved, and as a result of follow-up, some have attended our churches.

We continue to emphasize lay involvement in the churches and the association. Ten (10) from Taylor County attended the Lay Renewal Conference in Louisville last spring. We look forward to the Lay-led Revivals in the spring of 1989 and to the development of revival teams to be used in other areas.

Our people continue to be used in partnership missions around the world. In addition to those who went to Kenya, Bro. and Mrs. Boyd Robertson went to Mexico and to Bolivia this year.

Our pastors have begun a monthly fellowship of devotional and sharing time. Several youth groups have served in Kentucky and other states during the summer.

Our greatest need is in the area of evangelism and witnessing. In 1970 our churches baptized 169; in 1980, they baptized 177. However, this year our churches reported only 120 baptisms.

We were happy to see an increase in support for associational work. Our continued support through the Cooperative Program and special offerings is essential to maintaining our work at home and abroad.

**STATE MISSIONS REPORT**  
**1987-1988**

Kentucky Baptists are committed to start four hundred (400) new churches by 1990 to help reach the more than 1,000,000 unchurched people in Kentucky. Four Kentucky counties; Pike, Floyd, Warren, and Fayette; were listed by the Home Mission Board as among the top two hundred fifty (250) in America which need new church work.

In Kentucky there are eighty-four (84) counties which have more than half the people without Christ. Twenty-six (26) have more than 70%. Four Kentucky counties have only one Southern Baptist Church. Kentucky Baptist Churches are not keeping up with Kentucky growth.

Fourteen (14) different language groups worship in Kentucky Baptist Churches each week.

The Eliza Broadus State Mission Offering Goal is \$550,000. This offering will help with missionaries, church building grants, interracial work, language missions, student mission projects, rural urban ministries, disaster relief, human need projects, Clear Creek Bible School, and Oneida Baptist School.

We need to remember our Baptist Centers in our state: Baptist Fellowship Center, Marrowbone Baptist Center, Jefferson Street Chapel, Wheelwright Baptist Center, East Baptist Church, Caney Baptist Center, Pippa Passes, Long Run Association, and Elkhorn Association. We have thirty-six (36) churches that minister to the deaf. Bro. Robert C. Jones serves as director of our state mission work.

"A Century to Celebrate..A Future to Fulfill" was an appropriate theme for Women's Missionary Union Centennial Celebration.

Seventeen Taylor County churches elected WMU Centennial chairpersons. A training session was held on March 17, 1987, with twelve (12) churches represented.

Studies of the WMU History for all age levels were held at Green River Memorial on September 10, 1987, with approximately one hundred twenty-four (124) in attendance.

The centennial chairpersons were responsible for the program during the WMU Quarterly meeting, Tuesday, April 12, 1988. The program was a reenactment of the historic organizational meeting held May 14, 1888, in Richmond, Virginia.

Taylor County WMU was represented at the State WMU meeting, April 22, 23, held at St. Matthews Baptist Church. Two hand-made Centennial quilts from Taylor County were on display at this meeting.

In conjunction with the National WMU Centennial Celebration in Richmond, the Baptist women and men of Taylor County met at Campbellsville on May 14 from 1:00-4:00 P.M. to celebrate this historic event. The celebration included viewing the National Celebration on BTN; exhibits by home, foreign, and volunteers in missions; displays of WMU organization; a doll collection; hand-made quilts; and tables of memorabilia. Ladies, in gala period costumes representing the last one hundred years of WMU, added to the occasion. A centennial birthday cake and punch were served to approximately one hundred seventy (170) guests. Dr. Chester Badgett, former pastor of Campbellsville, presented a challenge to the WMU for the second century of missions involvement.

Churches in Taylor County were encouraged to promote the WMU Centennial Thank Offering, to increase missions giving, and to double WMU membership.

Three Baptist women from Taylor County; Ina Blakeman, Ruth Badgett, and Joyce Martin; attended the National WMU meeting in San Antonio, Texas, June 12, 13, 1988.

## HOME MISSION REPORT

1987-1988

The Home Mission Board has undergone some reorganization this past year. We have a new president, Larry L. Lewis, and many staff members we knew so well have been promoted to more responsible positions.

The Home Mission Board works through state conventions, providing finances and resources for all phases of mission activity from evangelism to Christian social ministries. This past year we had 3,693 missionaries and 53,198 volunteers placed on the Home Mission Field.

The Southern Baptist Convention goal is 20,000 new churches here at home this year. Kentucky Baptists are answering the need for new churches by starting "new work." Mission Kentucky is "a commitment" by Kentucky Baptists to start four hundred new preaching points, missions and churches by 1990. Our Kentucky Baptist goal for "new starts" in 1987-88 is seventy-five.

In Taylor County Association, many of the churches have witnessed through choir tours, Backyard Bible Clubs, Vacation Bible Schools, and other endeavors of this type. But I ask you, "Is this enough?"

Over one hundred million adults in this country are unsaved and uninvolved in Bible study, and by the year 2000, three of ever four persons living in this nation will be adults (eighteen years and older). There are 1,000,000 unchurched people in Kentucky alone. What is Taylor County Association doing to reach the 50% to 70% of this county's population who are without faith in Jesus Christ? What are our churches doing to reach them? But most important of all is, "What are we as individuals doing to tell others of Jesus' love and what He can do in their lives?" We in Taylor County give our money, but I challenge you to give (of) yourself!
