TAYLOR COUNTY ASSOCIATION OF KENTUCKY BAPTISTS CONSTITUTION

- Article 1.** This body shall be called the Taylor County Association of Kentucky Baptists.
- Article 2.** Each cooperating church shall be entitled to four (4) messengers, one of whom shall be the pastor, and one additional messenger for each fifty (50) members or fraction thereof, above the first one hundred (100) members, plus four (4) messengers from each mission sponsored.
- Article 3.** The business of this body shall be, when assembled, to hear reports from the churches with regard to their condition as to members, prosperity, etc., to consult together for their development and growth in all matters pertaining to the evangelism of the world, and shall hold and control such property as shall come into possession of the association.
- Article 4.** The body shall exercise no authority over the local churches, and recognizes their complete autonomy. The Association reserves the right, as final action, to sever relations with any cooperating church for engaging in practices not considered Biblical.

Article 5. The Time, Place, and Preacher Committee shall, in addition to the annual meeting, select a time and place for a spring session for the purpose of electing officers for the next associational year, at which time the body shall elect by nomination and private ballot, or raising hand vote: Moderator; First Assistant Moderator; Second Assistant Moderator; Clerk; Assistant Clerk; Treasurer; Assistant Treasurer; and Auditor; whose duties shall be as custom imposes on their respective offices. The Nominating Committee shall also make its report at this time and all auxiliary directors shall be elected. All officers shall continue in office until superseded by their successor, but none shall be eligible to the office of moderator for more than two successive terms.

Article 6. Churches desiring fellowship in the association must make application to the executive board at least six (6) months prior to the annual meeting. The application shall be referred to a Credentials Committee who shall be responsible for examining the church's articles of faith and record of mission support. The committee will also be responsible for bringing a preliminary report to the Executive Board and a final report to the Annual Meeting.

Article 7. The Executive Board of the Association shall be composed of all pastors of cooperating churches and missions and one lay member from each church. All general associational officers, auxiliary heads, and committee chairmen will by virtue of their office be members of the Executive Board. The retiring Moderator will be a member of the Executive Board for the year following his active service as a moderator. Each associational officer shall hold the same office in the sessions of the Executive Board. The Executive Board shall be responsible for the work of the association between the annual sessions. Quorum of the Executive Board consists of nine (9) members.

Article 8. In the appointment of committees, individuals shall be named instead of churches, and on each committee named, one or more members shall be laymen. The Promotional Committee shall consist of Moderator, Clerk, Treasurer, heads of the Associational Organizations, and such other members as the occasion demands.

Article 9. This body shall meet annually, according to adjustment, but in case of emergency, the Executive Board may call a special session, and also change the time and place of the meeting. In addition to the annual meeting, the body shall meet in spring session for the purpose of electing officers for the following associational year.

Article 10. This Constitution may be altered or amended (except Article 4) at any meeting of the body, upon one year's notice, by concurrence of two-thirds of the members present.

Parliamentary Rules: Kerfoot's Parliamentary Rules of Order is a guide of the parliamentary order followed by the association.

BY-LAWS

ARTICLE 1--DUTIES OF OFFICERS

1. Officers elected at the spring session shall assume their duties at the close of the last session in the fall meeting.
2. The Clerk shall keep a record of the proceedings of the Association and the Executive Board, superintend the printing and distribution of the minutes of the Association which shall include statistics from August 1 through July 31, immediately preceding the annual meeting covered by the minutes, send five copies to the Secretary of the Kentucky Baptist Convention, send copies to various other Baptist agencies, and keep a file of the minutes and other important papers of the association.

3. The Treasurer shall receive all money contributed by the churches to the Association or money received from other sources, shall make reports to the Association and the Executive Board covering the Associational year of August 1 through July 31 and shall make disbursements as authorized by the Association and the Executive Board, and shall be authorized to pay all bills and salaries established by the budget adopted at an annual meeting until the next budget is adopted at the following annual meeting. He shall be bonded and the bonding fee paid by the association.
4. An auditor shall be secured by the Executive Board to audit the Treasurer's books and attest his annual report. The auditing expense, if any shall be paid by the Association.

ARTICLE II--COMMITTEES

1. The Promotion Committee shall be responsible for planning, developing, and promoting a program of activities for the year in all phases of church work. This committee shall give a monthly report on the progress of their program.
2. The Program Committee will plan the programs for the annual meetings and shall report as far in advance as possible.
3. The Nominating Committee, after consulting with the Auxiliaries of the Association, shall recommend to the Association at its annual meeting nominations for all Associational Sunday School Officers, Associational W. M. U. Officers, Associational Church Training Officers, Associational Brotherhood Officers, Church Music Officers, and such other officers as the body may from time to time assign them.
4. The standing committees of the Association shall be Budget Committee; Program Committee; Missions Committee; Evangelism Committee; Christian Education Committee; Time, Place, and Preacher Committee; Resolutions Committee; Youth Committee; and the Nominating Committee which shall be responsible for nominating all Standing Committee Members. Members of the Standing Committees will serve three years on a rotating basis with one member rotating off each year, with the exception of the Missions Committee which shall have, in addition to the three members, a representative from the Women's Missionary Union and a representative from the Brotherhood selected annually. All other committees shall be appointed by the Moderator unless specified by special motion.

AUGUST, 1988--The dates of 14-16 April, 1989, were established for the Simultaneous Lay-led Revivals in Taylor County Association.

SEPTEMBER, 1988--**FALL MEETING**--Bro. Darrell Hunt completed his second term as Moderator and gave the gavel to incoming Moderator, Rev. Bob E. Martin.

OCTOBER, 1988--The rally against the State Lottery was announced. It was suggested that pastors were to encourage members from their churches to attend. The rally was to have media coverage.

NOVEMBER, 1988--Dr. J. Chester Badgett read a letter from a former Taylor County Pastor, Rev. Bud Wall, expressing needs for his church in Convoy, Ohio. JANUARY, 1989--The Evangelism Committee announced that ten Taylor County Churches had agreed to participate in the Lay-led Revival Effort.

FEBRUARY, 1989--The dates of 8-15 April, 1990, were set for 1990 Simultaneous Revivals in Taylor County with the theme of "Here's Hope."

MARCH, 1989--Twenty (20) had been enrolled in the Soul-winning Clinic in preparation for the Lay-led Revivals.

APRIL, 1989--Bro. Glen Canada announced that David Minor from Liberty had won the Regional Royal Ambassador Speak-out.

MAY, 1989--**SPRING MEETING**--Seventeen churches were represented at the annual Spring Meeting. Rev. Donald Berry brought the message, "Working as One: A Call to Taylor County Baptists," based on 1 Corinthians 3:9.

JUNE, 1989--Dr. Bill Jones spoke on "MISSIONKENTUCKY" to the executive board. He discussed the potential areas of reaching people outside of church buildings and suggested that all pray for the leadership of the Holy Spirit to these areas of service.

Our enrollment declined this past year from 4,229 to 4,116, a decrease of 113, or 2.67 %.

Another important statistic is average attendance in Sunday School. Again this year average attendance declined by 3.43 %.

These statistics translated tell us that we are failing to reach our community with Bible study. This is one reason our baptismal statistics are low.

VACATION BIBLE SCHOOL REPORT

We hope next year to have a 100 % participation of our churches in Vacation Bible School.

STEWARDSHIP-COOPERATIVE PROGRAM REPORT

As you will see, Taylor County Baptists continue to show interest and concern for the lost and needy by giving to and through mission programs. Gifts through the Cooperative Program in 1989 show an increase of \$15,410 above 1988 gifts.

Taylor County Baptists also gave \$14,567 more to Christian Education in 1989 than in 1988. Total mission gifts in 1988 were \$496,781, \$29,722 less than the total of \$526,503 in 1989. If we are to continue our efforts to reach the world by the year 2000, we must not only give, but we must pray, send witnesses, and take advantage of every opportunity we have to proclaim God's Word.

CHURCH TRAINING REPORT

Not only will this be my last report, but it will be the last Church Training report ever given at Taylor County Baptist Association. This is because on October 1, 1989, by action of the Southern Baptist Convention, the name will be changed officially to Discipleship Training, which more clearly designates what we ought to be doing.

Discipleship Training will be the most flexible of all our church programs. We may have continuing groups, short term groups using modules or study course materials, individual study, or one-on-one study.

Our resource materials are rich and varied, including dated quarterlies; over forty-five Equipping Center modules; Survival Kits for children, youth, and adults; LIFE courses; doctrinal books; new church member materials; Bible drill kits; the Youth Speaker's Tournament pack; WIN and CWT materials; and BTN tapes.

Statistics from Uniform Church Letters reveal that churches that have Church Training

enroll more member in Sunday School,
baptize more new converts, and
give more through the Cooperative Program.

This year thirteen of our churches reported having some form of Church Training, with total enrollment up 7.7 % over last year. Seven churches used at least one module from the Equipping Center, four used "Survival Kit for New Christians," and Elkhorn reported MasterLife groups.

Campbellsville and Mt. Gilboa churches participated in Children's Bible Drill and both had winners on the associational and state levels. Bonnie Moore of Campbellsville was a state winner in the Youth Bible Drill.

WOMEN'S MISSIONARY UNION REPORT

Fifteen of our Taylor County Churches have active W.M.U.'s. There are twelve Mission Friends, fifteen Girls in Action, ten Acteens, nine BYW's, and 21 Baptist Women's organizations. Mrs. Joyce Martin, Pleasant Hill Baptist Church, represents us on the State WMU Executive Board. Marilyn Bault, Yuma Baptist Church, was one of five Acteen panelists in Kentucky this past year. Several of our ladies attended the State WMU Convention in Hopkinsville on April 21 and 22.

We have had three quarterly meetings this year with the following emphases: Foreign Missions--with Rev. and Mrs Eugene Milby, former missionaries to Zimbabwe, Africa, as speakers; Home Missions--with Rev. Mike Crain as the speaker; and State Missions--with several giving testimonies concerning lay-witnessing and personal witnessing. Our annual Associational Family Night, sponsored jointly by the WMU and Brotherhood, was at Pleasant Hill in July. Four men shared concerning the Lay-led revivals and Baptist Builders.

Twenty-four Acteens and their leaders attended the National Acteen Convention in San Antonio, Texas, in July. Three attended the Conference-Leading-Conference at Cedarmore, and five attended Leadership Training in Shelbyville. We are planning a Leadership Training session in the association in the near future. There will be a retreat a Cedarmore in October for Baptist Women and Nurses.

As we are entering our second century of WMU work, Taylor County WMU's are encouraged to observe the weeks of prayer for Home, State, and Foreign Missions; to increase mission giving through church-wide offering; and to become more missions-conscious through mission study in all age groups in each church.

MUSIC DEPARTMENT REPORT

The music program of Taylor County churches remains strong, although losses were reported in several areas of the program. Specific losses occurred in several age group choirs, along with average weekly attendance. A gain was seen in Older Children's choirs, however, suggesting promotion as a possible reason for some of the decline in younger choirs. Vocal Ensembles, Music Leadership, Mission Enrollment, and Total Music Enrollment increased. The greatest increase was in Handbell Ringers, where enrollment jumped by 114% from twenty-eight to sixty. Total enrollment is 835.

Twenty-nine persons representing twelve churches attended the Annual Shoptalk on March 27, led by Marvin Reynolds, Minister of Music at Beacon Hill Baptist Church in Somerset. He shared ideas on improving church congregational singing.

A Hymn Player was purchased by the Association in July and is available for churches from the associational office to use for camps, retreats, fellowship, as well as for congregational singing.

EVANGELISM REPORT

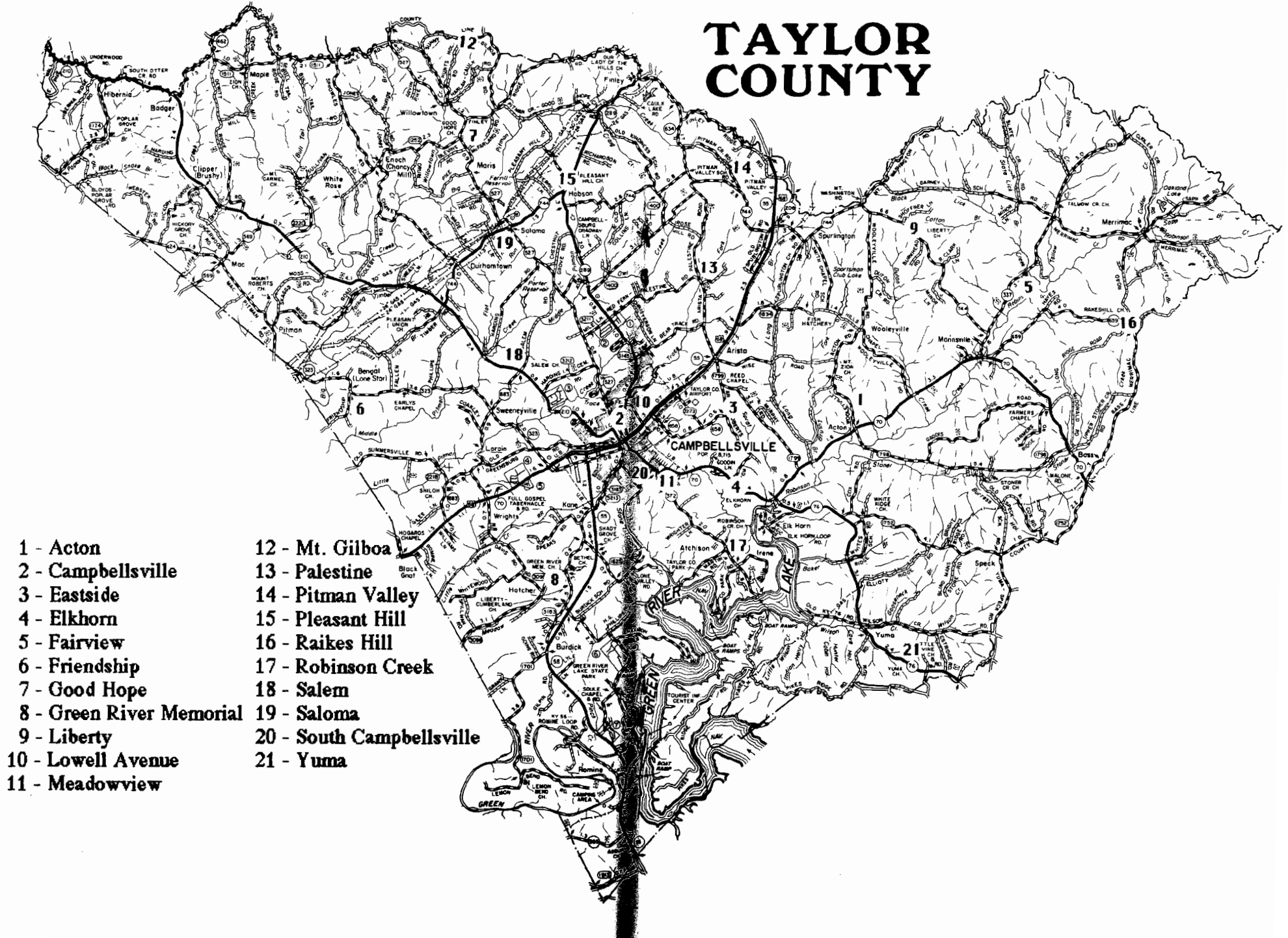
Three Evangelism Rallies were held this year as was a Soul Winning Study in preparation for the April Lay-led Revival effort.

HOME MISSION REPORT

With the theme, "A Church for Everyone," the Home Mission Board seeks to carry out its part of the Great Commission through thirteen program tasks.

Home Mission Board statistics are impressive. There are now 6,500 language congregations (some here in Kentucky). With 672 Home Missionaries commissioned in 1987, there are now 3,746 on the field. Specialty training is provided for 889 Black Southern Baptist churches. Inter-faith witnessing is now ministering and witnessing to a growing number of cults in America. The Special Mission Ministries assigned 33,380 Southern Baptists for short-term special missions projects. Many Kentuckians have been involved in these efforts.

According to the Home Mission Board's Research Division, there are more than 167,000,000 Americans who do not have a personal, saving faith in our Lord, Jesus Christ. This number increases approximately 2,000,000 annually. It is estimated that nearly half the United States population has no church affiliation. The Home Mission Board is committed to the establishment of churches whose purpose is to share Christ's saving power to those who do not know Him. This is the purpose for all the planning, money, and programs presently in progress. The Evangelism Department of the Home Mission Board is involved in the planning, support, and promotion of the "Here's Hope" revivals in 1990. We pray for Home Mission Board Director Larry Lewis and his staff. In so doing, we recognize that missions begin at home and continue into the far reaches of this world!

Dr. Keith Parks, President of the Foreign Mission Board, states, "I remain convinced that We Southern Baptists are a missionary people. CHRISTIAN EDUCATION REPORT

Taylor County Baptists continued their tradition of generous support for Christian education during 1989. Of the twenty-one churches in the association, eleven gave official recognition to Baptist Schools Day. Gifts to education totaled \$59,445, a \$14,567 increase over last year. Heading the list was Campbellsville which gave \$31,043. As a percentage of undesignated offerings, Good Hope and Mt. Gilboa were leaders, giving 11.41 % and 7.61 % respectively. Average associational giving to education was 3.83%.

Campbellsville College continued to change and grow. Dr. Ken Winters was inaugurated as the new president; football was played for the first time in fifty years; and the freshman enrollment was the largest in ten years. The academic program was enhanced to provide more off-campus programs for factory employees of local and neighboring communities and more on-campus courses for non-traditional students. Many physical improvements and renovations were also undertaken. A financial development campaign, entitled VISION 2000, was launched and, during the initial thrusts, realized its challenge goal of \$125,000 from college faculty and staff, and reached its Trustee/Former Trustee goal of \$600,000. The year 1990 promises to be one of continued growth and excitement.

The association recognizes the value of Christian education in the development of faith and character in people both young and old. We approach the 1990's with enthusiasm and optimism, confident that, with the Lord's help, we can meet the challenges that lie ahead.

The Kentucky-Kenya Partnership came to a close in 1987. 779 people participated in the effort, with 750 of those being Kentuckians. Between forty-five and fifty thousand professions of faith were reported. Approximately six hundred new churches were started. The Kentucky Baptist Convention reported starting one hundred new churches in 1987-1988, exceeding the Mission Kentucky goal of seventy-five.

NEW WORK: Ken Foreman now directs Church Extension and "Mission Kentucky." Kentucky Baptist Convention churches and associations have started 276 churches and missions toward the goal of four hundred by 1990.

PARTNERSHIPS: Directed by Calvin Wilkins, partnerships with Brazil, Utah-Idaho, Ohio, and within Kentucky are in progress.

INTER-FAITH WITNESS: One hundred people have been involved in Witness Training in dealing with Mormonism and Jehovah's Witnesses.

MISSIONS DEVELOPMENT: Fifty persons were trained in associational and church development programs.

ASSOCIATIONAL STRATEGY PLANNING: Two associations (West Union and Severns Valley) were involved in long-range planning.

MISSIONARY ASSISTANCE PROGRAM (MAP): A new plan was formulated to provide financial assistance for churches and associations.
