## **TAYLOR COUNTY ASSOCIATION OF KENTUCKY BAPTISTS CONSTITUTION**

**Article 1.** This body shall be called the Taylor County Association of Kentucky Baptists.

**Article 2.** Each cooperating church shall be entitled to four (4) messengers, one of whom shall be the pastor, and one additional messenger for each fifty (50) members or fraction thereof, above the first one hundred (100) members, plus four (4) messengers from each mission sponsored.

**Article 3.** The business of this body shall be, when assembled, to hear reports from the churches with regard to their condition as to members, prosperity, etc., to consult together for their development and growth in all matters pertaining to the evangelism of the world, and shall hold and control such property as shall come into possession of the association.

**Article 4.** The body shall exercise no authority over the local churches, and recognizes their complete autonomy. The Association reserves the right, as final action, to sever relations with any cooperating church for engaging in practices not considered Biblical.

**Article 5.** The Time, Place, and Preacher Committee shall, in addition to the annual meeting, select a time and place for a spring session for the purpose of electing officers for the next associational year, at which time the body shall elect by nomination and private ballot, or raising hand vote: Moderator; First Assistant Moderator; Second Assistant Moderator; Clerk; Assistant Clerk; Treasurer; Assistant Treasurer; and Auditor; whose duties shall be as custom imposes on their respective offices. The Nominating Committee shall also make its report at this time and all auxiliary directors shall be elected. All officers shall continue in office until superseded by their successor, but none shall be eligible to the office of moderator for more than two successive terms.

**Article 6.** Churches desiring fellowship in the association must make application to the executive board at least six (6) months prior to the annual meeting. The application shall be referred to a Credentials Committee who shall be responsible for examining the church's articles of faith and record of mission support. The committee will also be responsible for bringing a preliminary report to the Executive Board and a final report to the Annual Meeting.

**Article 7.** The Executive Board of the Association shall be composed of all pastors of cooperating churches and missions and one lay member from each church. All general associational officers, auxiliary heads, and committee chairmen will by virtue of their office be members of the Executive Board. The retiring Moderator will be a member of the Executive Board for the year following his active service as a moderator. Each associational officer shall hold the same office in the sessions of the Executive Board. The Executive Board shall be responsible for the work of the association between the annual sessions. Quorum of the Executive Board consists of nine (9) members.

**Article 8.** In the appointment of committees, individuals shall be named instead of churches, and on each committee named, one or more members shall be laymen. The Executive Committee shall consist of Moderator, Clerk, Treasurer, heads of the Associational Organizations, and such other members as the occasion demands.

**Article 9.** This body shall meet annually, according to adjustment, but in case of emergency, the Executive Board may call a special session, and also change the time and place of the meeting. In addition to the annual meeting, the body shall meet in spring session for the purpose of electing officers for the following associational year.

**Article 10.** This Constitution may be altered or amended (except Article 4) at any meeting of the body, upon one year's notice, by concurrence of two-thirds of the members present.

**Parliamentary Rules:** *Kerfoot's Parliamentary Rules of Order* is a guide of the parliamentary order followed by the association.

## **BY-LAWS**

### **ARTICLE 1--DUTIES OF OFFICERS**

1. Officers elected at the spring session shall assume their duties at the close of the last session in the fall meeting.
2. The Clerk shall keep a record of the proceedings of the Association and the Executive Board, superintend the printing and distribution of the minutes of the Association which shall include statistics from August 1 through July 31 immediately preceding the annual meeting covered by the minutes, send five copies to the Secretary of the Kentucky Baptist Convention, send copies to various other Baptist agencies, and keep a file of the minutes and other important papers of the association.

3. The Treasurer shall receive all money contributed by the churches to the Association or money received from other sources, shall make reports to the Association and the Executive Board covering the Associational year of August 1 through July 31 and shall make disbursements as authorized by the Association and the Executive Board, and shall be authorized to pay all bills and salaries established by the budget adopted at an annual meeting until the next budget is adopted at the following annual meeting. He shall be bonded and the bonding fee paid by the association.
4. An auditor shall be secured by the Executive Board to audit the Treasurer's books and attest his annual report. The auditing expense, if any shall be paid by the Association.

## ARTICLE II--COMMITTEES

1. The Executive Committee shall be responsible for planning, developing, and promoting a program of activities for the year in all phases of church work. This committee shall give a monthly report on the progress of their program.
2. The Program Committee will plan the programs for the annual meetings and shall report as far in advance as possible.
3. The Nominating Committee, after consulting with the Auxiliaries of the Association, shall recommend to the Association at its annual meeting nominations for all Associational Sunday School Officers, Associational W. M. U. Officers, Associational Church Training Officers, Associational Brotherhood Officers, Church Music Officers, and such other officers as the body may from time to time assign them.
4. The standing committees of the Association shall be Budget Committee; Program Committee; Missions Committee; Evangelism Committee; Christian Education Committee; Time, Place, and Preacher Committee; Resolutions Committee; Youth Committee; and the Nominating Committee which shall be responsible for nominating all Standing Committee Members. Members of the Standing Committees will serve three years on a rotating basis with one member rotating off each year, with the exception of the Missions Committee which shall have, in addition to the three members, a representative from the Women's Missionary Union and a representative from the Brotherhood selected annually. All other committees shall be appointed by the Moderator unless specified by special motion.

## FIFTH ANNUAL SPRING MEETING

### Friendship Baptist Church

07 May, 1989

1. The fifth annual spring meeting of the Taylor County Baptist Association, meeting at Friendship Baptist Church, was called to order at 7:01 P.M. by the Moderator, Rev. Bob E. Martin.
2. Bro. Milton Jones, music director the host church, led the congregation in the singing of "Set My Soul Afire."
3. Rev. George Ray Gaddie read several passages from the book of Nehemiah, commented briefly about each, and then led in prayer.
4. Rev. K. J. Miller, associate pastor of Friendship, welcomed those who were present and made several announcements.

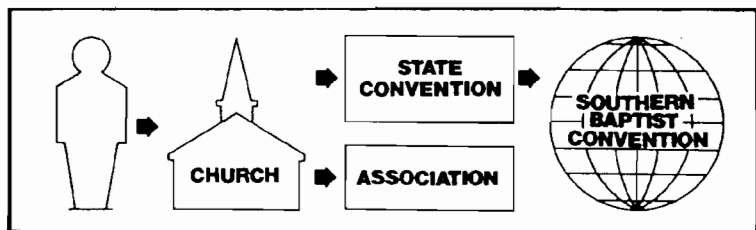

### **CHRISTIAN EDUCATION REPORT**

Taylor County Baptists are proud to have one of Kentucky's three Baptist institutions of Christian higher education located within the association. This has been an exciting and exhilarating year for Campbellsville College. Total enrollment was increased by approximately eleven percent, and resident enrollment was up by fifteen percent, with dormitories almost filled to capacity. Approximately twelve hundred individuals visited the campus this summer for retreats, camps, and conference activities.

Great strides were made in the academic program, with the addition of courses to meet the needs of traditional and non-traditional students of Central Kentucky, and the music program was accredited by the National Association of Schools of Music.

Physical facilities were greatly improved with the assistance of Campbellsville, Green River Memorial, and Pleasant Hill, who sent teams of workers to assist with the refurbishing of classrooms and offices. Fifteen churches from the Taylor County Association supported the college with donations to the college or through the Kentucky Baptist Foundation. A ground-breaking ceremony initiated the renovation of the old gymnasium into a student activities center.

Funds donated through the adopt-a-room program furnished fifteen dormitory rooms last year. For the first time in the history of the college, gift receipts at the end of the fiscal year totaled in excess of \$2,000,000.

In January of 1990, Campbellsville College received a gift of a television station, TV-4, and Campbellsville College Channel 4 went on the air on Saturday, April 23.

Campbellsville College covets the prayers, the participation, and the financial support of the churches within the Taylor County Association as she strives to meet the challenge of preparing our students for the twenty-first century.

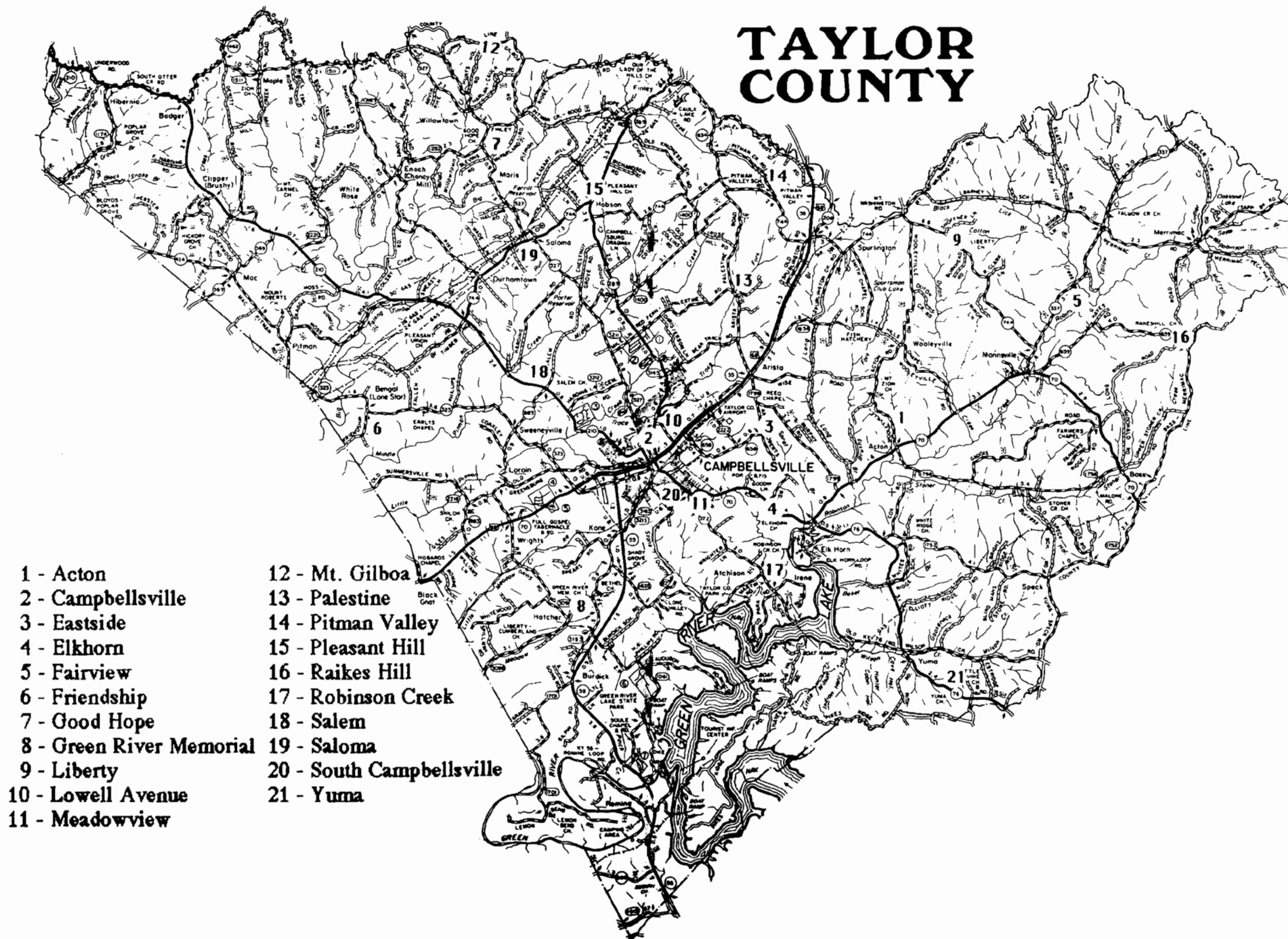

## **EVANGELISM COMMITTEE REPORT**

"Here's Hope, Jesus Cares for You!" What a theme! What a year! The gospel was proclaimed from churches across our county, state, nation, and to the ends of the earth. With the "Here's Hope" theme and other evangelistic endeavors, Taylor County Baptists report 134 baptisms in 1989-1990, fourteen above the previous year (an 11% increase). Kentucky Baptists estimate nearly 4,200 professions through "Here's Hope" endeavors, while Southern Baptists report 101,000 professions of faith. God brought hope to our world through Jesus Christ, and we proclaim this hope to our world. May God grant us opportunity, courage, wisdom, and love to share His hope to all people everywhere.

Your associational Evangelism Committee wishes to make three recommendations for your consideration.

**First**, we wish to schedule two evangelism events: an Evangelism Rally on May 29, 1991, 7:30 p.m. at Green River Memorial and a Youth Evangelism Conference on July 31, 1991. This will follow the State Youth Evangelism Conference, June 21, 22, at the Frankfort, Kentucky, Civic Center.

**Second**, we wish to recommend that the churches of the association work with the Evangelism Committee and the Campbellsville College Baptist Student Union to have a simultaneous weekend of Youth-led Revivals February 15-17, 1991.

**Third**, we recommend that an area crusade be held in 1993. In planning for this, we wish to recommend that 1991-1992 be designated as the Year of Prayer, that 1992-1993 be designated as the Year of Personal Evangelism, and that the crusade be held in August or September of 1993.

The Evangelism Committee will coordinate these activities with other associational committees.

## **STEWARDSHIP-COOPERATIVE PROGRAM REPORT**

In spite of a decrease in total receipts, our mission gifts increased in 1990. Total receipts decreased by \$5,174, but Cooperative Program giving was up \$24,329. Since the Cooperative Program is a means of reaching and helping more people, we need to increase our gifts as much as possible.

Associational Missions Gifts increased by \$116. Last year churches were asked to increase gifts to the association by one-half of one percent, and some churches evidently did. If we are to adopt the budget which will be presented tonight, we will need to increase our giving still more. Much more can be done through the association if funds are available.

Christian Education gifts also increased by \$1,138. This is one of our great needs in funding, and needs still more.

These increased figures look great, and we rejoice in them, but we must not be satisfied with giving our money. We must intensify our efforts to reach the lost, not only in Taylor County, but to the ends of the earth if we are to be obedient to our Lord.

## MEDIA COMMITTEE REPORT

In July it was decided to eliminate the Baptist Telecommunications Network. After investing \$14,000,000 and losing \$1,000,000 per year for the past eight years, the Sunday School Board decided that it could use this money more wisely in other areas. As of July, only 2,213 of the anticipated break-even number of 3,500 to 4,000 churches had been reached.

No substitute for any of the programming has been announced, although all current tapes are available through the Direct Marketing Division of the Sunday School Board. We have taped over \$4,000 of undated material which is available through the associational office.

ACTS is still alive, and its financial situation is improving. The Taylor County ACTS Board has the responsibility of scheduling twenty-one hours of local programming on ACTS (channel 23).

The Kentucky Baptist Convention (KBC) Communications Division has been active, assisting churches and associations with promoting "Here's Hope, Jesus Cares for You" simultaneous revivals with over six hundred television advertisements and over seventeen hundred radio advertisements. Twenty-five regional newspapers published two printed ads, and *Kentucky Living* magazine published two full-page advertisements.

The KBC Communications Division publishes the Convention Annual, the pocket planner, the fifteen-month wall calendar, bulletin jackets for associational meetings, and other documents providing information to Kentucky Baptists.

We continue to receive the following video magazines: *Southern Baptist Convention*, *Kentucky Report*, *Missions U.S.A.*, *Home Mission Report*, and *Foreign Missions Update* on a quarterly basis.

## HOME MISSION REPORT

Convention-wide Southern Baptists gave more than \$32,800,000 through the Annie Armstrong Easter Offering, an increase of \$2,000,000 over the previous year. Churches of Taylor County Association gave \$15,273 of that total.

The Home Mission Board appointed 733 missionaries in the past year, the largest number of appointments ever in a single year, yet there remains a tremendous need for church planters, evangelists, and support personnel. The Home Mission Board has identified 22,000 places in the United States where new churches need to be started. For the past two years our churches have reported an increase in the number of people led to the Lord! The Evangelism Department of the Home Mission Board is to be congratulated for the challenge, preparation, and assistance in the Here's Hope Revivals.

Kentucky presently has a partnership with work in the Ohio, Utah, and Idaho Conventions, providing a wonderful opportunity for Christian lay-persons to witness and serve our Lord on this mission field we call Home.

## FOREIGN MISSION REPORT

In the past year, the Foreign Mission Board has undergone several changes and many new challenges, with new countries open to the sharing of the Gospel message. We have seen war and the threat of war place existing work on hold. Convention politics has threatened the very life-blood of our missionaries due to disagreement over the Cooperative Program.

The good news is that our Foreign Mission Board reports 197,863 baptisms for the last year. Our missionaries are now working in 116 countries and over 10,000 volunteers were part of the short-term mission projects around the world.

Southern Baptist gave nearly \$69,000,000 through the Cooperative Program last year with our association giving \$321,457 of that total. The Lottie Moon Christmas offering of almost \$79,000,000 was a 12.7% increase over last year. Taylor County contributed \$42,640 of that total.

The Kentucky Baptist Convention is presently in partnership with the Baptist Convention of Espirito Santo, Brazil, and a number of Taylor Countians have been blessed in their work there. Others in the association have participated in work in Mexico and Argentina during 1989 and 1990.

## **STATE (DIRECT) MISSIONS REPORT**

Kentucky sent 116 volunteers to Brazil, fifty volunteers from nineteen churches to Ohio, and involved forty-one volunteers from twenty-six churches in the Kentucky/Utah-Idaho Partnership. Thirty-two Student Summer Missionaries were sent to the field.

One hundred seventy-eight people from fifteen churches were involved in the Eastern Kentucky Project. Kentucky Baptist churches helped to start thirty-five new churches, missions, or preaching points. Seven new ethnic works were also begun.

One hundred forty-seven people were trained in Outreach Ministries, fifty were trained to aid Ethnic Non-readers, and twenty-eight were trained through Literacy Missions to teach non-readers to read the Bible.

One association was assisted in a Strategy Planning retreat, and forty-one places were identified where new work is still needed.
