**TAYLOR COUNTY ASSOCIATION OF KENTUCKY BAPTISTS
CONSTITUTION**

Article 1. This body shall be called the Taylor County Association of Kentucky Baptists.

Article 2. Each cooperating church shall be entitled to four (4) messengers, one of whom shall be the pastor, and one additional messenger for each fifty (50) members or fraction thereof, above the first one hundred (100) members, plus four (4) messengers from each mission sponsored.

Article 3. The business of this body shall be, when assembled, to hear reports from the churches with regard to their condition as to members, prosperity, etc., to consult together for their development and growth in all matters pertaining to the evangelism of the world, and shall hold and control such property as shall come into possession of the association.

Article 4. The body shall exercise no authority over the local churches, and recognizes their complete autonomy. The Association reserves the right, as final action, to sever relations with any cooperating church for engaging in practices not considered Biblical.

Article 5. The Time, Place, and Preacher Committee shall, in addition to the annual meeting, select a time and place for a spring session for the purpose of electing officers for the next associational year, at which time the body shall elect by nomination and private ballot, or raising hand vote: Moderator; First Assistant Moderator; Second Assistant Moderator; Clerk; Assistant Clerk; Treasurer; Assistant Treasurer; and Auditor; whose duties shall be as custom imposes on their respective offices. The Nominating Committee shall also make its report at this time and all auxiliary directors shall be elected. All officers shall continue in office until superseded by their successor, but none shall be eligible to the office of moderator for more than two successive terms.

Article 6. Churches desiring fellowship in the association must make application to the executive board at least six (6) months prior to the annual meeting. The application shall be referred to a Credentials Committee who shall be responsible for examining the church's articles of faith and record of mission support. The committee will also be responsible for bringing a preliminary report to the Executive Board and a final report to the Annual Meeting.

Article 7. The Executive Board of the Association shall be composed of all pastors of cooperating churches and missions and one lay member from each church. All general associational officers, auxiliary heads, and committee chairmen will by virtue of their office be members of the Executive Board. The retiring Moderator will be a member of the Executive Board for the year following his active service as a moderator. Each associational officer shall hold the same office in the sessions of the Executive Board. The Executive Board shall be responsible for the work of the association between the annual sessions. Quorum of the Executive Board consists of nine (9) members.

Article 8. In the appointment of committees, individuals shall be named instead of churches, and on each committee named, one or more members shall be laymen. The Executive Committee shall consist of Moderator, Clerk, Treasurer, heads of the Associational Organizations, and such other members as the occasion demands.

Article 9. This body shall meet annually, according to adjustment, but in case of emergency, the Executive Board may call a special session, and also change the time and place of the meeting. In addition to the annual meeting, the body shall meet in spring session for the purpose of electing officers for the following associational year.

Article 10. This Constitution may be altered or amended (except Article 4) at any meeting of the body, upon one year's notice, by concurrence of two-thirds of the members present.

Parliamentary Rules: *Kerfoot's Parliamentary Rules of Order* is a guide of the parliamentary order followed by the association.

BY-LAWS

ARTICLE 1--DUTIES OF OFFICERS

1. Officers elected at the spring session shall assume their duties at the close of the last session in the fall meeting.
2. The Clerk shall keep a record of the proceedings of the Association and the Executive Board, superintend the printing and distribution of the minutes of the Association which shall include statistics from August 1 through July 31 immediately preceding the annual meeting covered by the minutes, send five copies to the Secretary of the Kentucky Baptist Convention, send copies to various other Baptist agencies, and keep a file of the minutes and other important papers of the association.

3. The Treasurer shall receive all money contributed by the churches to the Association or money received from other sources, shall make reports to the Association and the Executive Board covering the Associational year of August 1 through July 31 and shall make disbursements as authorized by the Association and the Executive Board, and shall be authorized to pay all bills and salaries established by the budget adopted at an annual meeting until the next budget is adopted at the following annual meeting. He shall be bonded and the bonding fee paid by the association.
4. An auditor shall be secured by the Executive Board to audit the Treasurer's books and attest his annual report. The auditing expense, if any shall be paid by the Association.

ARTICLE II--COMMITTEES

1. The Executive Committee shall be responsible for planning, developing, and promoting a program of activities for the year in all phases of church work. This committee shall give a monthly report on the progress of their program.
2. The Program Committee will plan the programs for the annual meetings and shall report as far in advance as possible.
3. The Nominating Committee, after consulting with the Auxiliaries of the Association, shall recommend to the Association at its annual meeting nominations for all Associational Sunday School Officers, Associational W. M. U. Officers, Associational Church Training Officers, Associational Brotherhood Officers, Church Music Officers, and such other officers as the body may from time to time assign them.
4. The standing committees of the Association shall be Budget Committee; Program Committee; Missions Committee; Evangelism Committee; Christian Education Committee; Time, Place, and Preacher Committee; Resolutions Committee; Youth Committee; and the Nominating Committee which shall be responsible for nominating all Standing Committee Members. Members of the Standing Committees will serve three years on a rotating basis with one member rotating off each year, with the exception of the Missions Committee which shall have, in addition to the three members, a representative from the Women's Missionary Union and a representative from the Brotherhood selected annually. All other committees shall be appointed by the Moderator unless specified by special motion.

- OCTOBER, 1992**--Dr. D. M. Aldridge, former president of Clear Creek, spoke to the executive board on starting churches. He indicated that he would be willing to work with the association in an Awareness Project to help the association seek out possible mission points.
- NOVEMBER, 1992**--High Attendance Sunday on 25 October, 1992, resulted in 2,917 people attending Baptist Sunday Schools in Taylor County, the highest recorded number to date on record.
- DECEMBER, 1992**--The executive board voted to hold the next World Mission Conference during the week of 14-21 April, 1996.
- JANUARY, 1993**--The Taylor County Ministerial Association County-wide Crusade scheduled for 9-12 September was announced. Plans were discussed at the meeting.
- FEBRUARY, 1993**--It was announced that Campbellsville is putting on four "Experiencing God" programs. Several other churches are also involved in Discipleship Training projects.
- MARCH, 1993**--It was reported that the association had received recognition for being one of twelve in the state to have an increase in baptisms for 1991-1992.
- APRIL, 1993**--A letter of the resignation of Doug Broome as Associational Music Chairman was read. Brother Broome had already accepted and moved to employment outside the area.
- MAY, 1993--SPRING MEETING**--Green River Memorial Youth presented some religious skits and sang one song which they had used in Back Yard Bible Clubs as a part of the program for the evening.
- JUNE, 1993**--The Brotherhood announced that eleven people were involved in a lay-led revival at Yuma. Another lay-led revival is planned for Troy, Missouri, for the weekend of 24-26 September, 1993.
- JULY, 1993**--Rev. David Goatley, Pastor of First Baptist Church and chairman of the Ministerial Association Revival preparations, discussed the county-wide crusade which will be held 09-12 September, 1993, with the executive board.

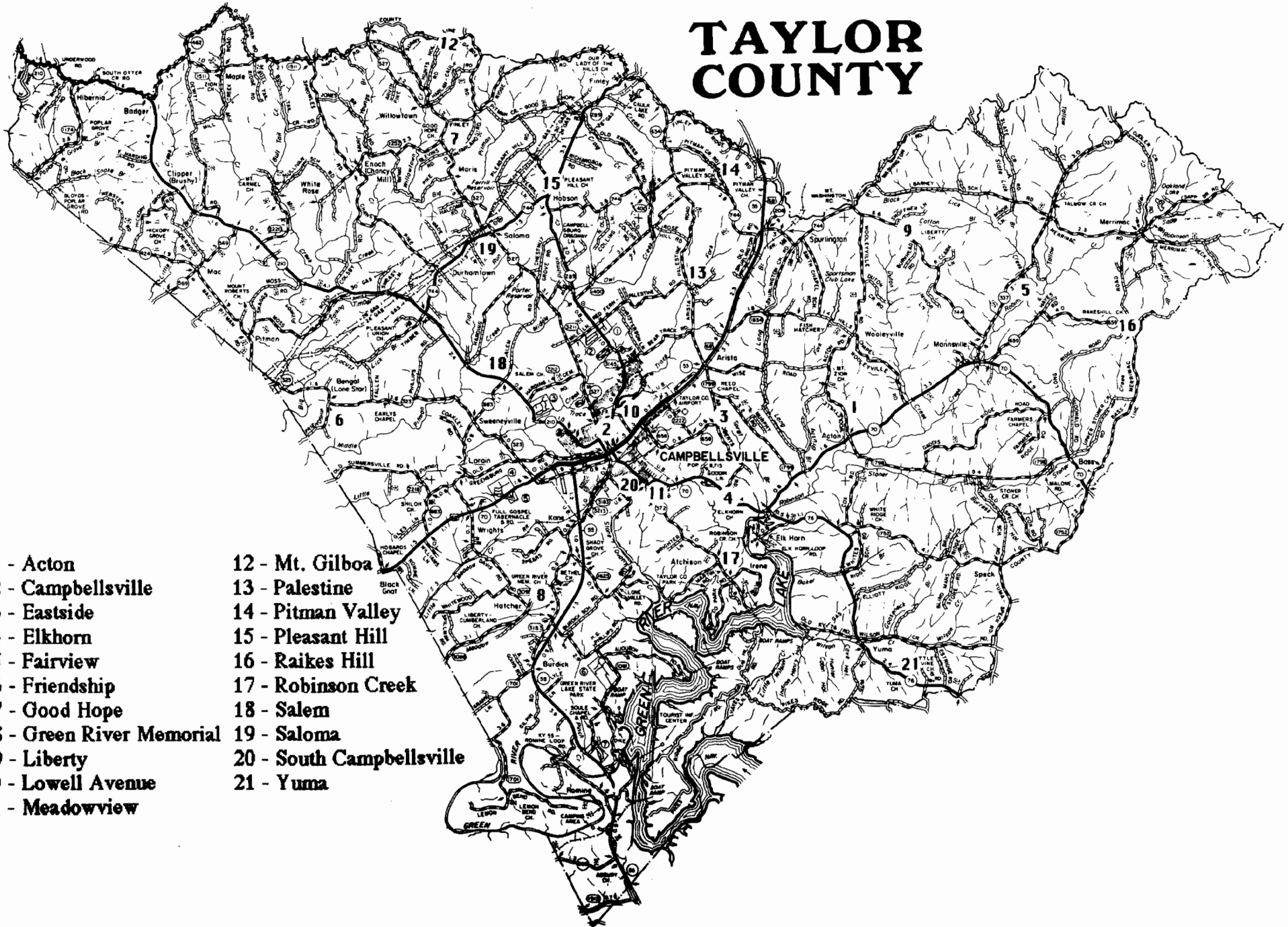

MUSIC REPORT

The Taylor County Baptist churches have once again experienced a year of growth in their music ministries. The overall increase in enrollment in the past year was sixty-four persons or seven percent. STEWARDSHIP AND COOPERATIVE PROGRAM

The Cooperative Program was a gift of Kentucky Baptists to this state and to the Southern Baptist Convention. It was adopted by the Southern Baptist Convention in 1925, and has revolutionized the work of both the state and the convention. It produces a cooperative effort which allowed both the Kentucky Baptist Convention and the Southern Baptist Convention to make unprecedented strides forward in evangelism and other ministries.

The definition of the Cooperative Program adopted by the Southern Baptist Convention in 1979 is as follows: "The Cooperative Program is a financial channel of cooperation between the State Conventions and the Southern Baptist Convention which makes it possible for all persons making undesignated gifts through their church to support the missionary, education, and benevolent work in their State Convention, and also the work of the Southern Baptist Convention."

This is a contract-partnership in which the state convention is collection agency for both the state and convention-wide causes. This depends on the willingness of the constituency to accept a rule of the majority which is under threat at the present time.

The matter of stewardship involves both individual Baptists and Baptist churches. The growth of our ministries involve both. The work can increase as individual Baptists accept the Lordship of Christ in regard to sharing in the Lord's work with their material possessions. Growth of our outreach and other ministries also involves the stewardship of local churches in the percentage going outside the local community. It is easier to see our local needs than the needs of the people around the world. All pastors ask for increase in the support of the Cooperative Program, but not all of them insist on an increase of the percentage in the budget going through the Cooperative Program.

Total mission giving by our churches amounted to \$611,187. This was an increase over last year of \$21,913. This should tell our pastors and budget committees that the members want more of their giving to support missions, education, and benevolence.

How seriously have we taken the challenge of Bold Mission Thrust in which we stated our intent to see that every person on earth had a chance to hear the gospel by the year 2000? Do we expect someone else to provide the money to see that this challenging goal is met?

The Taylor County Baptist Association continues to provide a resource of video and audio material for training or viewing. Our main purpose is to reach lost people for Christ, and to reach the sick and shut-ins of our community.

Areas of expansion are Sunday School, children's time, community happenings, Bible discussions, and others. This will take investment from churches. Either our ministry will go forward or backward--it will never stand still.

We are presently not paying any fee to be on Visn-ACTS, and we do not have a contract with them. Therefore, we could be removed from Tele-Scripts any time. Now is the time to write to our cable company and let them know of our interest and enjoyment of the Visn-ACTS channel, encouraging them to not remove it from the air.

STATE/DIRECT MISSION REPORT

Brazil Partnership--The Brazil Partnership that began in 1989 will end in 1993. Some one hundred twenty-five volunteers have participated in 1993.

Ohio Partnership--This partnership has been in progress for at least fifteen years. The mission needs continue with Vacation Bible Schools, Back Yard Bible Clubs, revival teams, youth revival teams, and construction teams.

Kentucky-Utah-Idaho Partnership continues through 1994 with witness training, student ministries, resort ministries, survey work, choir concerts, and mission starts.

Russia Partnership--Beginning in January of 1994 and continuing through 1998, the following volunteers will be required: education for pastors, church starters, church school teachers, construction workers, medical workers, along with evangelists and discipleship leaders.

Celebration 400--This recognizes the initiation of four hundred new works during the Mission Kentucky Emphasis. The celebration will be at Severns Valley in Elizabethtown on October 1, 1993. Dr. Larry Lewis of the Home Mission Board will be the speaker.

Kentucky officials expect four thousand migrant workers in ninety counties in 1993.

Thirty grants were made to churches out of the loan and grant fund.
Church building loans were up to \$20,000 with an interest rate of 8%.

These goals are being met and worked toward with much help from the Annie Armstrong Easter Offering. Approximately half of the Home Mission Board's support comes from individual churches through this offering. **One hundred percent** of the offering goes to support the work of home missionaries in the field.

Highlights from the past year are these.

Alternatives to Abortion: As a result of the ministry of twenty-three crisis pregnancy centers, eight hundred thirty-two women found faith in Christ and 2,164 babies were born.

Language Missions: Foreign Missions seem to be coming to us! Home missionaries and pastors in the Language Church Extension Division serve among one hundred two ethnic groups using ninety-eight languages and dialects.

Volunteers: Over 71,000 Southern Baptist adults, college students, and youth group members volunteered for long and short term projects. More than 58,000 volunteers responded to disaster relief efforts in Florida, Louisiana and Hawaii.

FOREIGN MISSION REPORT

Southern Baptists share a rich heritage in missions that endured for near a century and a half. Today's missionaries join a long list of God's servants like Lottie Moon, William Bagby, and Bill Wallace in sharing the mystery mentioned in Colossians 1:27, *Christ in you, the hope of glory*. They are builders, laying the foundation for bridges that we may cross to reach the lost, and bridges to each other. Forming new fellowships, strengthening foreign congregations, sharing the Gospel in new places, evangelizing and nurturing new life among the communist rubble, and actively caring for the suffering and dying are our honest commitments to God.

Overseas, we helped in baptizing a quarter of a million people. We have 3,906 missionaries spread thinly through one hundred twenty-nine countries, and there were 11,343 volunteers. We work among 56,686 chapels and churches with a total membership of 3,450,000 people. Let us never forget that we are a small number working beside a host of committed Christian nationals and beside many other evangelical missionaries and people throughout this world of over 5.25 billion people.

In Kentucky, our partnership with Brazil will end this year. We will be in a partnership with Russia beginning in January, 1994, continuing through 1998.

As we continue to share God's love with others on the planet, let us also show in our local churches and denominational involvements true fraternal love understanding, and peace among ourselves so that we will truly practice what we fervently preach.
