CONSTITUTION

Article 1. This body shall be called the Taylor County Association of Kentucky Baptists.

Article 2. Each cooperating church shall be entitled to four (4) messengers, one of whom shall be the pastor, and one additional messenger for each fifty (50) members or fraction thereof, above the first one hundred (100) members, plus four (4) messengers from each mission sponsored.

Article 3. The business of this body shall be, when assembled, to hear reports from the churches with regard to their condition as to members, prosperity, etc., to consult together for their development and growth in all matters pertaining to the evangelism of the world, and shall hold and control such property as shall come into possession of the association.

Article 4. The body shall exercise no authority over the local churches, and recognizes their complete autonomy. The Association reserves the right, as final action, to sever relations with any cooperating church for engaging in practices not considered Biblical.

Article 5. The Time, Place, and Preacher Committee shall, in addition to the annual meeting, select a time and place for a spring session for the purpose of electing officers for the next associational year, at which time the body shall elect by nomination and private ballot, or raising hand vote: Moderator; First Assistant Moderator; Second Assistant Moderator; Clerk; Assistant Clerk; Treasurer; Assistant Treasurer; and Auditor; whose duties shall be as custom imposes on their respective offices. The Nominating Committee shall also make its report at this time, and all auxiliary directors shall be elected. All officers shall continue in office until superseded by their successor, but none shall be eligible to the office of Moderator for more than two successive terms.

Article 6. Churches desiring fellowship in the association must make application to the executive board at least six (6) months prior to the annual meeting. The application shall be referred to a Credentials Committee who shall be responsible for examining the church's articles of faith and record of mission support. The committee will also be responsible for bringing a preliminary report to the Executive Board and a final report to the Annual Meeting.

Article 7. The Executive Board of the Association shall be composed of all pastors of cooperating churches and missions and one lay member from each church. All general associational officers, auxiliary heads, and committee chairmen will by virtue of their office be members of the Executive Board. The retiring Moderator will be a member of the Executive Board for the year following his active service as a moderator. Each associational officer shall hold the same office in the sessions of the Executive Board. The Executive Board shall be responsible for the work of the association between the annual sessions. A quorum of the Executive Board consists of nine (9) members.

Article 8. In the appointment of committees, individuals shall be named instead of churches, and on each committee named, one or more members shall be laymen. The Executive Committee shall consist of Moderator, Clerk, Treasurer, heads of the Associational Organizations, and such other members as the occasion demands.

Article 9. This body shall meet annually, according to adjustment, but in case of emergency, the Executive Board may call a special session, and also change the time and place of the meeting. In addition to the annual meeting, the body shall meet in spring session for the purpose of electing officers for the following associational year.

Article 10. This Constitution may be altered or amended (except Article 4) at any meeting of the body, upon one year's notice, by concurrence of two-thirds of the members present.

Parliamentary Rules: *Kerfoot's Parliamentary Rules* of Order is a guide of the parliamentary order followed by the association.

BYLAWS

ARTICLE I--DUTIES OF OFFICERS

1. Officers elected at the spring session shall assume their duties at the close of the last session in the fall meeting.
2. The Clerk shall keep a record of the proceedings of the Association and the Executive Board, superintend the printing and distribution of the minutes of the Association which shall include statistics from August 1 through July 31 immediately preceding the annual meeting covered by the minutes, send five copies to the Secretary of the Kentucky Baptist Convention, send copies to various other Baptist agencies, and keep a file of the minutes and other important papers of the association.
3. The Treasurer shall receive all money contributed by the churches to the Association or money received from other sources, shall make reports to the Association and the Executive Board covering the Associational year of August 1 through July 31 and shall make disbursements as authorized by the Association and the Executive Board, and shall be authorized to pay all bills and salaries established by the budget adopted at an annual meeting until the next budget is adopted at the following annual meeting. He shall be bonded and the bonding fee paid by the association.
4. An auditor shall be secured by the Executive Board to audit the Treasurer's books and attest his annual report. The auditing expense, if any, shall be paid by the Association.

ARTICLE II--COMMITTEES

1. The Executive Committee shall be responsible for planning, developing, and promoting a program of activities for the year in all phases of church work. This committee shall give a monthly report on the progress of their program.
2. The Program Committee will plan the programs for the annual meetings and shall report as far in advance as possible.
3. The Nominating Committee, after consulting with the Auxiliaries of the Association, shall recommend to the Association at its annual meeting nominations for all Associational Sunday School Officers, Associational W. M. U. Officers, Associational Church Training Officers, Associational Brotherhood Officers, Church Music Officers, and such other officers as the body may from time to time assign them.
4. The standing committees of the Association shall be Budget Committee; Program Committee; Missions Committee; Evangelism Committee; Christian Education Committee; Time, Place, and Preacher Committee; Resolutions Committee; Youth Committee; and the Nominating Committee which shall be responsible for nominating all standing committee members. Members of the Standing Committees will serve three years on a rotating basis with one member rotating off each year, with the exception of the Missions Committee which shall have, in addition to the three members, a representative from the Women's Missionary Union and a representative from the Brotherhood selected annually. All other committees shall be appointed by the Moderator unless specified by special motion.

Started a new Sunday School class; Ordained Mike Forbis, Brad Lacky, and Richard Durham as Deacons; Purchased a new equalizer and tape deck for the sound system; Purchased brass cross and candle holders for the communion table; Baptist Men started a nursing home ministry; Installed a new heating and air conditioning system.

EXECUTIVE BOARD REPORT

August 1996

It was reported that this has been a good year for youth involvement outside Taylor County. Robinson Creek sent a team into the Baltimore area, Lowell Avenue and Campbellsville sent teams into Tennessee, and Friendship sent a team into Northern Kentucky. It was also decided that the association continue to support the Russian Sunday School work at the same level already in place.

September 1996

Meadowview took top honors in all four categories of Sunday School growth for 1995-1996. Their statistics indicated Numerical Enrollment Gain of forty, Percentage Enrollment Gain of 51.95%, Numerical Attendance Gain of thirty-one, and Percentage Attendance Gain of 91.18 %.

October 1996

Clearing an oversight of the spring meeting, the executive board approved the selection of officers for the Women's Missionary Union.

November 1996

Liberty Pastor Bill Carroll announced that the Migrant Worker Ministry has outgrown the resources of Liberty and appealed to the association for assistance in continuing the ministry. This was referred to the Missions Committee.

Ad Hoc Census Committee Chairman George Gaddie reported that the Lord is ready to do something important and there is a tremendous need in Taylor County. He further indicated that churches were interested in evangelism and outreach.

January 1997

It was announced that Charles Hedrick and his wife are now missionaries in residence at Campbellsville University. Also, it was noted that Russian Baptists have issued an urgent request to the Foreign Mission Board for one hundred fifty missionaries.

February 1997

It was decided that Taylor County Association cooperate with the Home Mission Board in Celebrating Jesus 2000 to win souls.

March 1997

It was reported that Lowell Avenue Baptist Church had suffered a break in and that the association had experienced the following damage. The office door, a paper cutter, and a filing cabinet were all destroyed.

April 1997

Kentucky Baptist Disaster Relief (including Taylor County people) activities in Cane Valley was announced. Also, a quarterly W. M. U. meeting was held at Good Hope with Missionaries Charles and Carrie Hedrick presenting the program.

May 1997

The spring session was at Friendship, already talking about their one hundred ninetieth anniversary celebration. Dr. Dwayne Howell, pastor at Pleasant Hill was elected Moderator.

June 1997

The progress of the census was discussed. Several reported on work that was being done by the various churches.

July 1997

It was reported that Ruth Campbell represented Campbellsville Baptist Church in Kentucky Baptist All State Youth Choir this summer. Also, Laura, Campbell, Michelle Creason, and Jennie Moore, from Campbellsville, and Bonnie Moore from Palestine are working at Ridgecrest this summer.

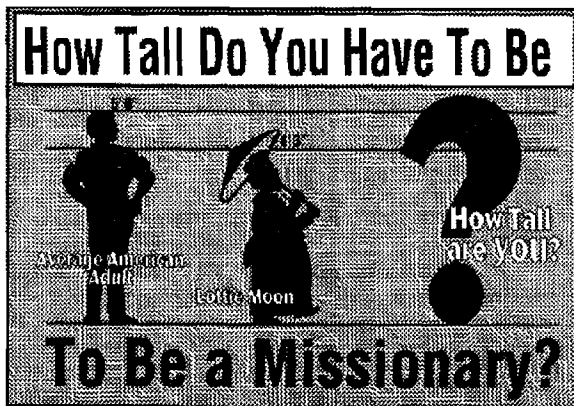
TIME, PLACE AND PREACHER COMMITTEE

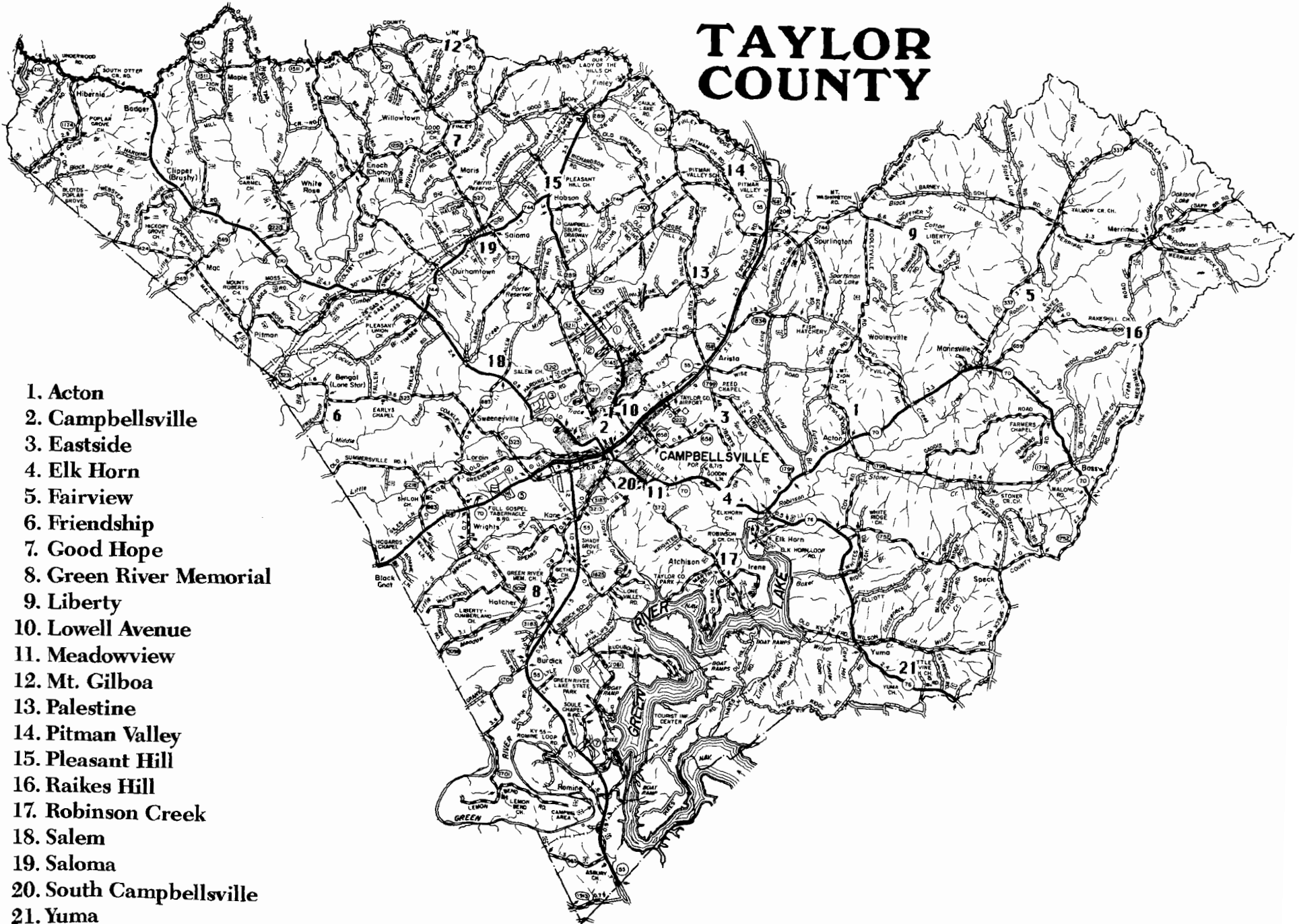
VACATION BIBLE SCHOOL REPORT

EVANGELISM COMMITTEE

The primary work of the Evangelism Committee for the past year has been the taking of a religious census of Taylor County. Other people were added to the committee and became known as the *Ad Hoc* Census Committee.

The committee attempted to enlist all the Southern Baptist churches in Taylor County in this effort. There are a total of twenty-six congregations in Taylor County affiliated with Southern Baptists. MISSIONS COMMITTEE

Many of our youth and adults from our churches have been engaged in Volunteer Mission Service this past year. Campbellsville had six who labored in Kolpina, Russia, helping to build a church building, distribute Bibles, and witnessing for our Lord. The New England Partnership found fifty-three youth and adults from Elk Horn serving in Washington, Vermont, where they conducted a week long Day Camp and did construction work. Two adults and four youth from Friendship labored in Pikeville, Kentucky, with the Kentucky Changers. Lowell Avenue sent eight youth to Middlesboro to work in Back Yard Bible Clubs. Robinson Creek had twenty-eight who assisted in Back Yard Bible Clubs and a food pantry in Buffalo, New York.

We continue our partnership with Russian Baptists in the support of Nikolai Syrovatka. If you did not attend our Mission Rally, you missed a real blessing as he reported to us about his work and pled with us for our continued support. Thirteen of our churches contributed \$4,087.00 to his work with the Learning Center and the Sunday Schools of the St. Petersburg Oblast (state), as well as his teaching in seven pastors' schools throughout Russia Last year. We sent \$1,000.00 last spring to pay for printing materials used in the production of three manuals he has written. One is for pastors and Sunday School directors, one is for teacher training seminars, and the third is a curriculum journal to be used by teachers in Sunday School classes. This fall we will be able to send another \$1,000.00 for printing materials in addition to \$200.00 per month for the operation of the learning center.

Now that the survey is about complete, it is time to contact our prospects. I was in one of our churches recently where I met an unsaved, unchurched family attending for the first time. They had not even had a Bible in their home. This is only one result of the survey.

We had some great Vacation Bible Schools and were slightly up in enrollment. The Vacation Bible School ministry helped us to be up in the number reached for the Lord.

Much of the time this past year has been given to assisting and encouraging our smaller churches and working with churches without pastors. At one time we had five churches without pastors; at the present time we have only two.

I met several times with Directors of Missions in our general area. My wife and I worked with Brother Bill Jagers in an associational Evangelism Conference in Northern Kentucky. We also assisted in a Vacation Bible School in Warren, Ohio. We have had a good number of both youth and adult mission teams working in Kentucky and other states.

This past year I have traveled 6,690 miles in associational work and preached forty-six sermons.

For a number of years Liberty Baptist Church has ministered to the migrant workers in this area. They would like for other churches in our association to join with them in this effort. Women's Missionary Union ladies could assist with some meals and Brotherhoods could have some cookouts, Bible studies, and evangelistic services.

HOME MISSIONS

This report marks the one-hundred-fifty-first and final report of the Home Mission Board. The responsibilities of the Home Mission Board, the Radio and Television Commission, and the Brotherhood Commission were combined under the umbrella of the North American Mission Board (NAMB) as a result of the reorganization of the Southern Baptist Convention.

Even with changes in structure, the mission and work of the Home Mission Board will continue. Missions is not a building, and it is not carried on around a conference table. It is in the heart of individuals and groups who love the Lord Jesus Christ and is carried out wherever people are.

A major responsibility of NAMB will be to assist and equip individuals and groups to carry out the task of missions at every opportunity.

The varied ministries supported and encouraged by the Home Mission Board and will continue to be encouraged under the new agency known as NAMB. Next year, a new agency will present the report of missions work in North America. The names, places, and figures may be different, but we can rest assured that the same heart, the same dedication, and the same message of the love of Jesus Christ for lost and hurting humanity will be included in that report.

Because there are some fourteen different programs and six supportive operations administered by the Home Mission Board, it is impossible to report on them all. Programs that may be of special interest to your congregations might be the programs of Chaplaincy Ministries, Church Evangelism Development, Interfaith Witness, Mass Evangelism, and other special evangelistic events. One of the major upcoming events is Celebrate Jesus 2000 with the goal of praying for and witnessing to every person in North America by the year 2000.

Personal Evangelism helps churches in motivating, equipping, and involving pastors and lay persons in a lifestyle of personal witnessing and enabling them to train others for such a lifestyle.

Volunteers in Missions has the goal of "Meeting missions needs with volunteer resources" These volunteers serve in every state, U. S. territory, and Canada and represent more than \$100,000,000 annually in value to the Home Mission Board.

May God richly bless the ministry of NAMB as it continues the ministry of the Home Mission Board and carries it forward into the Twenty-first Century.

FOREIGN MISSIONS

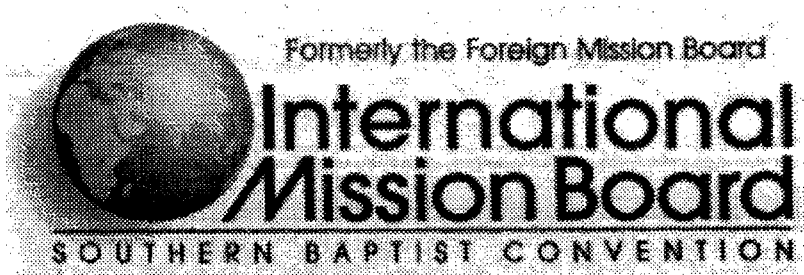
1997 has brought tremendous changes in our Southern Baptist mission program. The Home Mission Board's name has been changed to North American Mission Board with the mission work of Canada changed from the Foreign Mission Board to the newly named board. The name of the Foreign Mission Board has been changed to the International Mission Board. It has the responsibility for evangelizing and ministering to the whole world unchanged except for the above change with Canada.

The income to the International Mission Board in 1996-97 was \$5,477,151--most of which came through the Cooperative Program. The Women's Missionary Union goal for the Lottie Moon Offering for the past few years has been \$1,000,000. This also came from our churches and was almost reached in 1997. This represented increases in both Cooperative Program and Lottie Moon offerings, although Kentucky churches have actually decreased the percentage of church income through the Cooperative Program. Some of this may be due to money being channelled through the so called Cooperative Baptist Mission program, but some of the shortage results from churches and pastors giving priority to local projects.

Dr. Jerry Rankin is seeking to direct more of the effort of the International Mission Board towards reaching more of the 1,680,000,000 people who have never heard the gospel in that part of the world often called "World A" or "the Last Frontier." The past year, 2,200 new churches have been established bringing the total to over 39,000 with total membership of over four million. Southern Baptists have 4,167 missionaries in over one hundred thirty-one countries with assistance being given to twenty-four other countries. For the past several years, Southern Baptists have also had over 15,000 volunteers each year going for short terms of service.

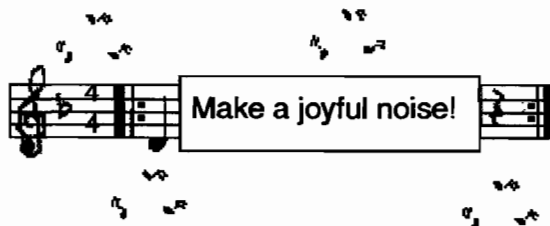
