1999

The Taylor County Association of Kentucky Baptists Executive Board Meets on the second Monday of each month except June and November during which it meets on the first Monday. This allows executive board members to attend the Southern Baptist Convention and the Kentucky Baptist Convention.

CONSTITUTION

- Article 1.** This body shall be called the Taylor County Association of Kentucky Baptists.
- Article 2.** Each cooperating church shall be entitled to four (4) messengers, one of whom shall be the pastor, and one additional messenger for each fifty (50) members or fraction thereof, above the first one hundred (100) members, plus four (4) messengers from each mission sponsored.
- Article 3.** The business of this body shall be, when assembled, to hear reports from the churches with regard to their condition as to members, prosperity, etc., to consult together for their development and growth in all matters pertaining to the evangelism of the world, and shall hold and control such property as shall come into possession of the association.
- Article 4.** The body shall exercise no authority over the local churches, and recognizes their complete autonomy. The Association reserves the right, as final action, to sever relations with any cooperating church for engaging in practices not considered Biblical.
- Article 5.** The Time, Place, and Preacher Committee shall, in addition to the annual meeting, select a time and place for a spring session for the purpose of electing officers for the next associational year, at which time the body shall elect by nomination and private ballot, or raising hand vote: Moderator; First Assistant Moderator; Second Assistant Moderator; Clerk; Assistant Clerk; Treasurer; Assistant Treasurer; and Auditor; whose duties shall be as custom imposes on their respective offices. The Nominating Committee shall also make its report at this time, and all auxiliary directors shall be elected. All officers shall continue in office until superseded by their successor, but none shall be eligible to the office of Moderator for more than two successive terms.
- Article 6.** Churches desiring fellowship in the association must make application to the executive board at least six (6) months prior to the annual meeting. The application shall be referred to a Credentials Committee who shall be responsible for examining the church's articles of faith and record of mission support. The committee will also be responsible for bringing a preliminary report to the Executive Board and a final report to the Annual Meeting.
- Article 7.** The Executive Board of the Association shall be composed of all pastors of cooperating churches and missions and one lay member from each church. All general associational officers, auxiliary heads, and committee chairmen will by virtue of their office be members of the Executive Board. The retiring Moderator will be a member of the Executive Board for the year following his active service as a moderator. Each associational officer shall hold the same office in the sessions of the Executive Board. The Executive Board shall be responsible for the work of the association between the annual sessions. A quorum of the Executive Board consists of nine (9) members.
- Article 8.** In the appointment of committees, individuals shall be named instead of churches, and on each committee named, one or more members shall be laymen. The Executive Committee shall consist of Moderator, Clerk, Treasurer, heads of the Associational Organizations, and such other members as the occasion demands.
- Article 9.** This body shall meet annually, according to adjustment, but in case of emergency, the Executive Board may call a special session, and also change the time and place of the meeting. In addition to the annual meeting, the body shall meet in spring session for the purpose of electing officers for the following associational year.

Article 10. This Constitution may be altered or amended (except Article 4) at any meeting of the body, upon one year's notice, by concurrence of two-thirds of the members present.

Parliamentary Rules: *Kerfoot's Parliamentary Rules of Order* is a guide of the parliamentary order followed by the association.

BYLAWS

ARTICLE I--DUTIES OF OFFICERS

1. Officers elected at the spring session shall assume their duties at the close of the last session in the fall meeting.
2. The Clerk shall keep a record of the proceedings of the Association and the Executive Board, superintend the printing and distribution of the minutes of the Association which shall include statistics from August 1 through July 31 immediately preceding the annual meeting covered by the minutes, send five copies to the Secretary of the Kentucky Baptist Convention, send copies to various other Baptist agencies, and keep a file of the minutes and other important papers of the association.
3. The Treasurer shall receive all money contributed by the churches to the Association or money received from other sources, shall make reports to the Association and the Executive Board covering the Associational year of August 1 through July 31 and shall make disbursements as authorized by the Association and the Executive Board, and shall be authorized to pay all bills and salaries established by the budget adopted at an annual meeting until the next budget is adopted at the following annual meeting. He shall be bonded and the bonding fee paid by the association.
4. An auditor shall be secured by the Executive Board to audit the Treasurer's books and attest his annual report. The auditing expense, if any, shall be paid by the Association.

ARTICLE II--COMMITTEES

1. The Executive Committee shall be responsible for planning, developing, and promoting a program of activities for the year in all phases of church work. This committee shall give a monthly report on the progress of their program.
2. The Program Committee will plan the programs for the annual meetings and shall report as far in advance as possible.
3. The Nominating Committee, after consulting with the Auxiliaries of the Association, shall recommend to the Association at its annual meeting nominations for all Associational Sunday School Officers, Associational W. M. U. Officers, Associational Church Training Officers, Associational Brotherhood Officers, Church Music Officers, and such other officers as the body may from time to time assign them.
4. The standing committees of the Association shall be Budget Committee; Program Committee; Missions Committee; Evangelism Committee; Christian Education Committee; Time, Place, and Preacher Committee; Resolutions Committee; Youth Committee; and the Nominating Committee which shall be responsible for nominating all standing committee members. Members of the Standing Committees will serve three years on a rotating basis with one member rotating off each year, with the exception of the Missions Committee which shall have, in addition to the three members, a representative from the Women's Missionary Union and a representative from the Brotherhood selected annually. All other committees shall be appointed by the Moderator unless specified by special motion.

August 1997

The executive board expressed appreciation to the Ad Hoc Census Committee for their work and it was decided to do follow up on the census and add other people to the committee to assist in the work.

September 1997

Nikolai Syravatko, the Russian Baptist Sunday School worker supported by Taylor County Association spoke in a Missions Rally at Lowell Avenue on September 10. Friendship, Meadowview, Pitman Valley, and South Campbellsville took top honors in Sunday School awards. Raikes Hill, which would have replaced one or more of the above received honorable mention because no data were submitted the year before. Also, Director of Missions Bill Beard submitted his resignation after ten and one-half years of service in the position.

Media Director Rochelle Simpson brought information to the meeting relating to the motion made at the annual meeting. The Evangelism Committee recommended simultaneous revivals over a three to four week period in the spring of 1999. The executive board increased Russia Partnership support for Nikolai Syravatko to \$300.00 per month.

March 1998

It was reported there was a good turnout at the Regional Royal Ambassador Congress at Campbellsville. Thirty-four people from six churches participated in the North American Mission Board Study. There was a good turnout at the Evangelism Conference at Campbellsville.

April 1998

The partially completed census reveals that about 50% of the families in Taylor County are not active in church. It was decided that Dr. Bill Mackey will be asked to bring the Kentucky Baptist Convention message at the annual fall meeting.

May 1998

In the spring meeting at Eastside it was decided that the association conduct strategic planning, utilizing the assistance of our Kentucky Baptist Convention resource staff, to determine the interests of our pastors and churches in Taylor County Association as to the future direction of our association.

June 1998

After Moderator Dwayne Howell appointed five subcommittees to be involved in the self study, it was decided that the July and August meetings would be devoted to self study committee work.

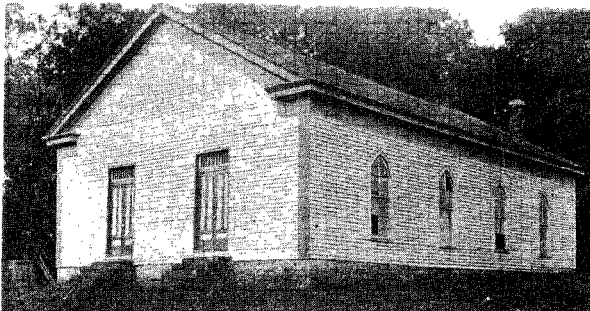
Participation in the Baptist Women's Day of Prayer helped us to understand better how God is working in women's lives around the world.

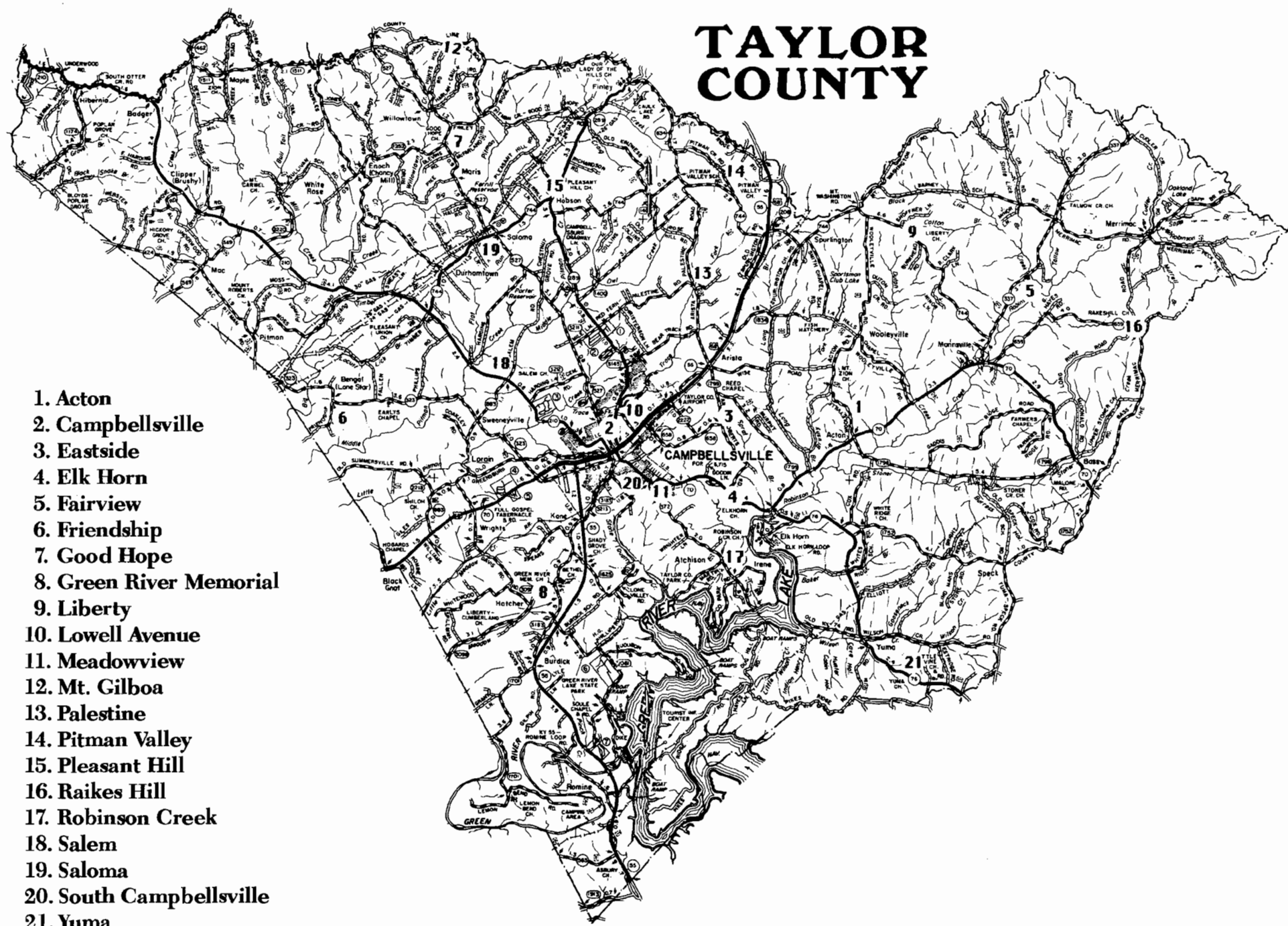
The Associational WMU Council invited all our churches to "Come, Go With Us" as we started the Operation Christmas Child program.

6. Assist churches by involving their members in missions and missions education.
7. Assist churches by communicating the gospel throughout the United States and Canada through communications technologies.

9. Assist churches in relief ministries to victims of disaster.

The new North American Mission Board publication is entitled, "On Mission." It no longer features stories about missionaries but rather reports on the work of volunteers. It also provides information to encourage churches to be on mission in their setting. The number of missionaries on the field totals 4,679. We also have nearly twenty-five hundred Southern Baptist Convention endorsed chaplains serving around the world

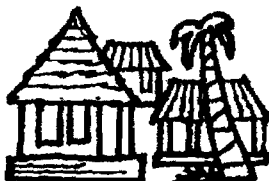

Friendship Baptist Church celebrated its one hundred ninetieth anniversary throughout 1997.

They selected as their theme "Heritage & Hope." This, they felt, reflected on their past victories and future hopes as a church ministering in the name of Jesus. Their motto set the tone for a great year: "Celebrating One Hundred Ninety Years of God's Blessings."

Bless them He has! The church now occupies its third building on as many sites. The first building was host to the Russell Creek Baptist Association in 1815. At that meeting Pioneer Missionary Luther Rice preached and received an offering for foreign missions. Over the years the church has grown and now employs the first full-time pastor.

Several special events marked the anniversary year. Brother Bob Harrington, the Chaplain of Bourbon Street, came for a revival in March. The building was packed and lives were changed by the power of God through Brother Bob's preaching. The journeymen held a concert on the eve of the first homecoming in over ten years. Many former members, family, and friends attended the special service and covered dish dinner.

The culmination of the celebration would be delayed until late Spring of 1998 when the Kentucky Historical Commission placed a marker at the church recognizing its important role in the community and state. The marker notes the presence of Dr. Rice and the contribution of Revolutionary War Brigadier General Elias Barbee as a charter member.

Friendship Baptist Church begins the next one hundred and ninety years of history committed to continue its proud and blessed heritage with a renewed hope and vision for what God has for them in the future.
