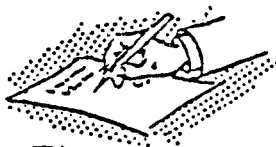


## TAYLOR COUNTY EXECUTIVE BOARD AND ANNUAL MEETINGS 2001

# CONSTITUTION

## Mission Statement/Preamble

We, the Taylor County Association of Kentucky Baptist, shall cooperate in fulfilling the Great Commission through missions, ministry, and fellowship; and shall serve as a resource and equipping center for the churches and as a liaison between the churches and the association.

**Article 1.** This body shall be called the Taylor County Association of Kentucky Baptists.

**Article 2.** Each cooperating church shall be entitled to four (4) messengers, one of whom shall be the pastor, and one additional messenger for each fifty (50) members or fraction thereof, above the first one hundred (100) members, plus four (4) messengers from each mission sponsored.

**Article 3.** The business of this body shall be, when assembled, to hear reports from the churches with regard to their condition as to members, prosperity, etc., to consult together for their development and growth in all matters pertaining to the evangelism of the world, and shall hold and control such property as shall come into possession of the association.

**Article 4.** The body shall exercise no authority over the local churches, and recognizes their complete autonomy. The Association reserves the right, as final action, to sever relations with any cooperating church for engaging in practices not considered Biblical.

**Article 5.** The Executive Team shall, in addition to the annual meeting, select a time and place for a spring session for the purpose of electing officers and team leaders for the next Associational year, at which time the body shall elect by nomination and private ballot, or raising hand vote: Moderator; Assistant Moderator; Clerk; Assistant Clerk; Treasurer; Assistant Treasurer; and Auditor; whose duties shall be as custom imposes on their respective offices. The Executive Team shall also nominate all team leaders at this time. All officers and team leaders shall continue in office until superseded by their successor, but none shall be eligible to the office of Moderator for more than two successive terms. In the absence of moderator and assistant moderator, the clerk shall convene the meeting and a moderator pro tem shall be elected for that one meeting. The treasurer shall serve in absence of clerk.

**Article 6.** Churches desiring fellowship in the association must make application to the executive board at least six (6) months prior to the annual meeting. The application shall be referred to a Credentials Committee who shall be responsible for examining the church's articles of faith and record of mission support. The committee will also be responsible for bringing a preliminary report to the Executive Board and a final report to the Annual Meeting.

**Article 7.** The Executive Board of the Association shall be composed of all pastors of cooperating churches, missions, and one lay member from each church. All general associational officers and team leaders will by virtue of their office be members of the Executive Board. The retiring Moderator will be a member of the Executive Board for the year following his active service as a moderator. Each associational officer shall hold the same office in the sessions of the Executive Board. The Executive Board shall be responsible for the work of the association between the annual sessions and shall be empowered to fill any vacancy in associational leadership. A quorum of the Executive Board consists of nine (9) members.

**Article 8.** In the appointment of teams, individuals shall be named instead of churches, and on each team named, one or more members shall be laymen. The Executive Team shall consist of Moderator, Clerk, Treasurer, Team Leaders, and such other members as the occasion demands.

**Article 9.** This body shall meet annually, according to adjustment, but in case of emergency, The Executive Board may call a special session, and also change the time and place of the meeting. In addition to the annual meeting, the body shall meet in spring session for purpose of electing officers for the following associational year.

**Article 10.** This Constitution may be altered or amended (except Article 4) at any meeting of the body, upon one year's notice, by concurrence of two-thirds of the members present. The labeling terminology, not including any original intent of the article of the constitution, adopted by Southern Baptist Convention, Kentucky Baptist Convention, and/or this association may be incorporated by vote at an annual meeting by a concurrence of two-thirds of the members presents.

**Parliamentary Rules:** Kerfoot's Parliamentary Rules of Order is a guide of the parliamentary order followed by the association.

## BYLAWS

### ARTICLE 1—DUTIES OF OFFICERS

1. Officers and team leaders elected at the spring session shall assume their duties at the close of the last session in the fall meeting.
2. The moderator shall chair all Associational and executive board meetings, shall make Ad Hoc committee appointments; shall serve as ex officio member of all teams and committee, shall direct the activities of the association, shall serve as contact person for Director of Missions, shall lead in and maintain constant supervision of all phases of Associational work, and shall perform other duties the office of moderator requires.
3. The Clerk shall keep a record of the proceedings of the Association and the Executive Board; superintend the printing and distribution of the minutes of the Association, which shall include statistics from August 1 through July 31 immediately proceeding the annual meeting covered by the minutes, send five copies to the Secretary of the Kentucky Baptist Convention, send copies to various other Baptist agencies, and keep a file of the minutes and other important papers of the association.
4. The Treasurer shall receive all money contributed by the churches to the Association or money received from other sources, shall make reports to the Association and the Executive Board covering the Associational year of August 1 through July 31, and shall make disbursements as authorized by the Association the Executive Board, and shall be authorized to pay all bills and salaries established by the budget adopted at an annual meeting until the next budget is adopted at the following annual meeting. All checks issued by the association shall bear the signatures of the treasurer and the Director of Missions. In an emergency, the assistant treasurer may sign in the absence of either the treasurer or the Director of Missions. The treasurer shall be bonded and the bonding fee paid by the association.
5. The Director of Missions shall be recommended by the executive team and shall be elected by the executive board or at an annual meeting. His (Her) duties shall be commensurate with the job description initially adopted by the executive board in March 1999, unless changed by subsequent action.



6. An auditor shall be secured by the Executive Board to audit the Treasurer's books and attest his annual report. The auditing expense, if any, shall be paid by the Association.

## **ARTICLE II—TEAMS**

1. The Executive Team shall be responsible for planning, developing, and promoting a program of activities for the year in all phases of church work. This team shall give a monthly report on the progress of their program. This team shall also serve as the personnel committee of the association.
2. The Executive Team will plan the program for the annual meeting, name program participants, and shall report to the executive board as far in advance as possible.
3. The Executive Teams, after consulting with the Auxiliary Teams of the Association shall Recommend to the Association at its annual meeting nominations for leaders. The Administrative Team, The Spiritual Growth Ministries Team, Leadership Growth Ministries Team and the Kingdom Growth Ministries Team; and such other officers as the body may from time to time assign them.
4. The Executive Team shall be responsible for presenting a proposed budget in the annual Fall Meeting.
5. The Standing Teams of the Association shall be The Administrative Team, The Spiritual Growth Ministries Team, The Leadership Growth Ministries Team, and The Kingdom Growth Ministries Team. The Executive Team shall be responsible for nominating all standing team members. Members of these Standing Teams shall serve a term of three years. Standing Team members may be nominated for successive three-year terms. A representative from the Women's Missionary Union and a representative from the Brotherhood shall be selected from recommendations made by the Executive Team to the Executive Board. All other teams and Ad Hoc Committees shall be appointed thru the moderator unless specified by special motion of the Executive Board.

## PROCEEDINGS—FIFTEENTH ANNUAL SPRING SESSION

May 8, 2000

7:00 P.M.

1. The fifteenth annual Spring Meeting of the Taylor County Baptist Association meeting at Salem Baptist Church, called to order at 7:00 PM by moderator Al Hardy.

- \* The university has nearly 1600 students of which 365 are from Taylor County

With 66 of them freshmen and 19 transfer students. The freshmen class has increased from last year and the number of students living in the residence halls has increased from last year. A slight decrease in overall student enrollment is due to the graduation of the adult learners who were laid off from Fruit of Loom. The graduate school in Theology which offers an MA has over 30 students in its second year and the MBA which will start this fall has over 20 students enrolled. These numbers amount to an increase of enrollment in the graduate programs of around 58%.

- \* The University needs strong academics while at the same time being a place where students have the opportunity to let the Holy Spirit guide them. The university offers opportunities of Christian Service such as mission trips and local projects such as Kentucky Heartland Outreach.
- Dr. Carter stated that the university is assessing it's future direction. He thanked Dr. Ken Winters and Dr. Randy Davenport for their past leadership in guiding and directing the University to where it presently is and placing the University in a position to move forward into the future. He stated that in the next 12-14 months the university will go through a strategic planning process to see where it should go in the future and this process will include these four goals: quality, students success, financial strength and Christ first in all that we do.
- He stated that the university would be a partner for churches in their ministry and if he or the university could do anything call on him.

Dr. J. Chester Badgett made a motion that this report be accepted. It was duly seconded. Motion carried. At the suggestion of Rev. James Jones everyone stood and gave a standing ovation for the find job Dr. Carter has done.

15. Mary Beth Skaggs "He is Here".

16. Rev. Donnie Blick brought the Annual Fall Sermon. He read I Samuel 7: 1-6. He encourage the church to do God's business God's way and not the world's way.

17. Brent Gupton dismissed us with prayer.

21. **TEAM REORTS**\_Al Hardy made a motion that all reports be voted on once all reports have been submitted.
  - A. Michael Goodwin gave the Spiritual Growth report.
  - B. Jerry Kibbons gave the Leadership Growth Team report.
  - C. Don Green substitution for Darrell Hunt gave the Kingdom Growth Team report.



- D. Sharon Wayne gave the W.M.U. report.
  - E. Larry Frisby made a motion that these reports be received. It was seconded by Dr. J. Chester Badgett. Motion carried.
22. Buckey Carlin brought the Kentucky Baptist Children's Home report. The theme for this year is "In Everything Give Thanks". He said that the Lord is blessing though the lawsuit brought by the ACLU has hurt referrals; but the KBCH will not back down on its conviction that homosexuality is wrong and will not allow people who practice this lifestyle to be employed. He mentioned that presently for the year 122 professions of faith and 67 re-dedications were recorded. There are 22 Cornerstone Counseling Centers which minister to 4000 people annually and in Owensboro the KBCH was able to purchase a building for a fourth of the normal cost and the owner from whom the building was purchase donated \$82,000 back to them. Marion Bowman made a motion that this report be accepted. Lynwood Newton seconded it. Motion carried.

### 23 MISCELLANEOUS BUSINESS

- A. Jerry Kibbons made a motion that we encourage our churches to continue their support of Nikolai Syrovathka for another two years because the economic conditions in Russia have worsened; and Nikolai not only continues to pastor, teach and produce children's literature in St. Petersburg but has also been encourage by Russian Baptists to expand his work to other areas in Russia. Williard Wise seconded the motion. Motion carried.
  - B. George Gaddie commented on the decline in both our Sunday School Enrollment and Baptisms in our association. He made a motion that all churches in our association be challenged to increase our Sunday School enrollment and attendance by ten percent. Donnie Blick seconded it. Motion carried.
  - C. Dr. Robert Doty promoted Operation Cooperation which is a blood drive across the state of Kentucky sponsored by the KBC to show a tangible way that Baptists show love to people. He gave out t-shirts and bulletin inserts which can be copied for the churches.   - E. Lynwood Newton made a motion that TCBA support Operation Cooperation. Jerry Kibbons seconded the motion. Motion carried.
24. Al Hardy led in the singing of "Amazing Grace".
25. Steve Thompson, associate to the Executive Director at the KBC brought the

- Kentucky Baptist Convention Message. He read from Philippians 1:. He talked about the 75 anniversary of the Cooperative Program and that for the very first time we not only met but exceeded the challenge goal by over \$300,000. Also Taylor County's giving had increased over \$20,000 from last year. On Tuesday, night November 14 at First Baptist of Bowling Green there will be a big celebration of the 75 anniversary of the Cooperative Program. He also mentioned our partnerships with the New England area, Tanzania, Poland and beginning January 1, 2001, the European Baptist Convention. Don Green made a motion that we accept this report. It was seconded by Larry Frisby. Motion carried.
26. Al Hardy noted that the Temperance Report was not ready because of a death in Rodney Burnett's family. He, however, informed the messengers that the Kentucky Legislature had recently passed a bill that allows precincts in dry counties to vote whether to sell alcohol in their precinct.
  27. Don Green offered the benediction and blessing on the evening meal.
  28. Moderator Al Hardy called to order the third session of the forty-third annual Fall Meeting of the Taylor County Baptist Association, meeting at Campbellsville Baptist church, at 7:00 p.m.
  29. Brent Gupton read Romans 8: 1-2 and led in prayer.
  30. John Chowning recognized visitors.
  31. Ed Pavy, Campbellsville University Campus Minister, shared the Baptist Student Union report. He shared that BSU worship services have increased to 150 and believes that is directly related to the prayers of the many students who have been praying for this happening for years. He shared many other items of interest that can be read in the written report he presented to the clerk.
  32. The resolution committee report was presented by Henry Pippin who move for its approval. The motion was seconded by Tom Gupton. Motion carried.

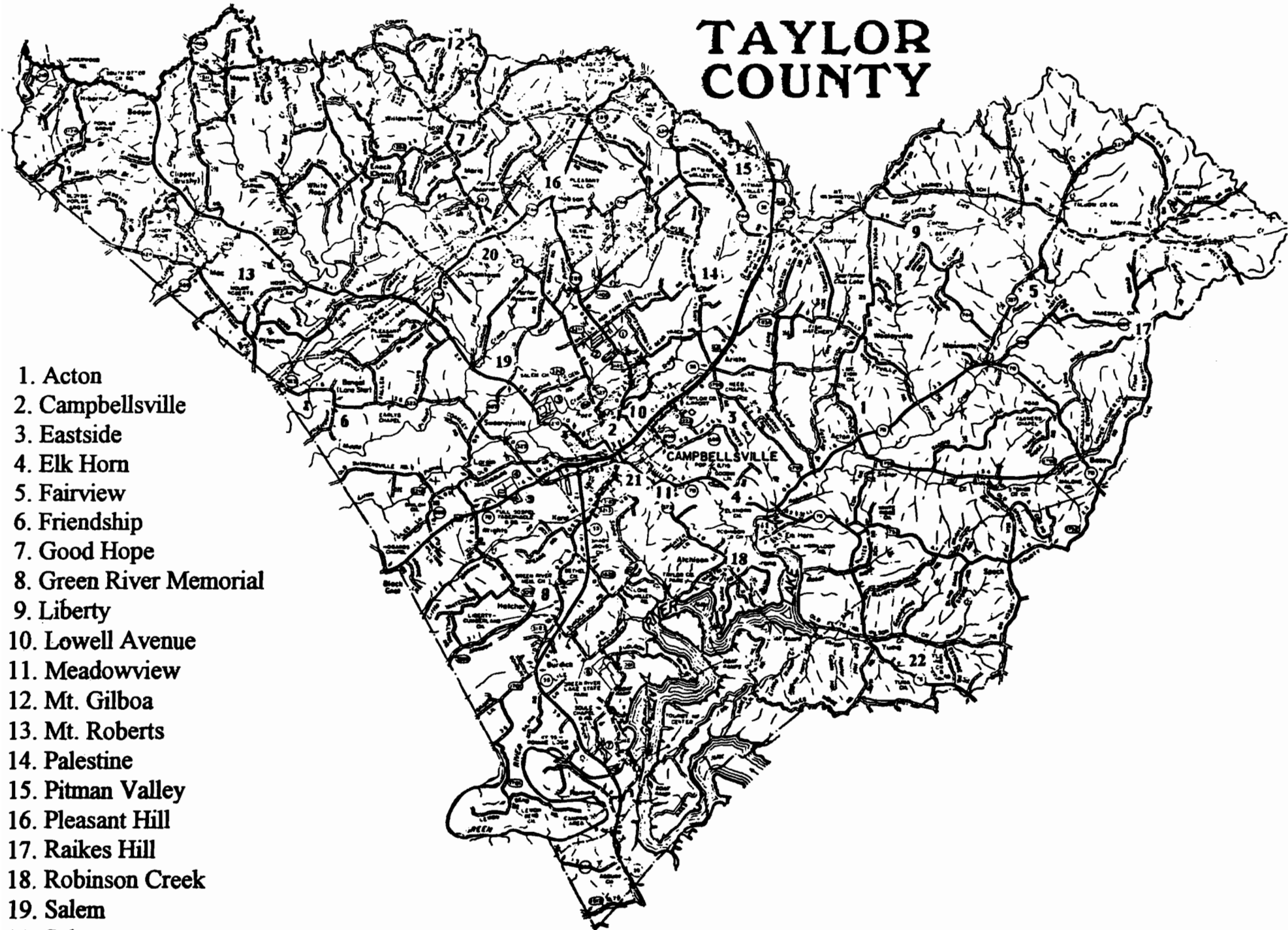

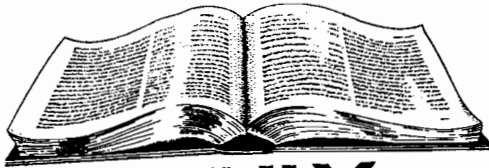

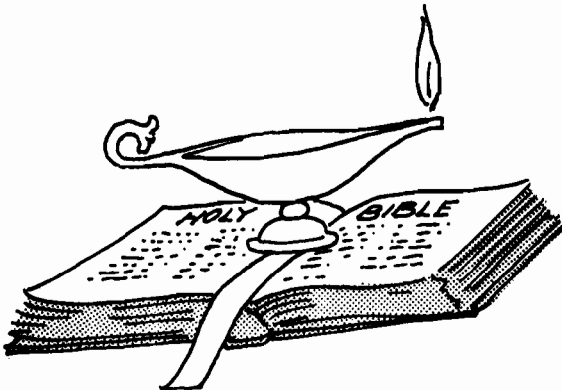

They provide consultation and assistance to churches and ministers who are experiencing conflict. This department also provides counseling and assistance to ministers and their families who have experienced involuntary termination from a church.

The Family Ministry Department sponsors Marriage Enrichment Conferences, various workshops relating to strengthening families and this past year hosted 5 Senior Adult Celebrations scattered across the state. Attendance ranged from 100 at Whitesburg in Eastern Kentucky, 200 at Campbellsville, and 400 in Lexington. Dr. Robert Clark, Rev. J. Alvin Hardy, and Jerry Kibbons had the privilege of leading breakout sessions at the Celebration here in Campbellsville and Bro. Hardy also served in 2 other Celebrations.

Our Team encourages your participation in these kinds of events during the coming year.

Jeff Newton is the leader of the Discipleship Team and Dr. Badgett is a team member.

Dr. Jim Clontz who is the KBC's Discipleship Training Director has been contacted about helping our association with some training with our discipleship programs. At this moment, no date for this training has been set but we hope to have it set up for early next year.

We are also looking for 3 or 4 additional people to become part of this team.

## **KINGDOM GROWTH TEAM REPORT**

We are excited about what the Lord is doing through our team! There is much to celebrate, but there is also much to do. We rejoice in the doors of service and opportunity our Lord is opening and we praise His name for the privilege of service.

Our State Evangelism Conference will be held February 26 and 27, 2001 at Immanuel Baptist Church in Lexington. Themes of encouraging and inspiring pastors, staff, and lay leaders in the area of Evangelism, with inspiring messages and uplifting music for the conference along with several helpful resource conferences are being planned. One of the focuses will be in reaching youth and young adults.

Celebrate Jesus 2000 is an Evangelistic Emphasis promoted by the North American Mission Board, with the intent to pray for and share Christ with every person in North America by the end of 2000. We trust that every church in our association will participate.

The Acts revolution is an intensive Youth Evangelism effort that is done in middle and high schools. Our goal is to have this program in operation in both our school systems with in the next 2 years. Over 85 middle schools and high schools across our state are now using the plan and over 400 teenagers have come to Christ as a result.

Partnership Missions continues to offer many opportunities for volunteers to be involved both here at home and internationally. Ministries are available in Tanzania, Poland, New England, and Eastern Kentucky and with the European Baptist Convention. We have had local involvement in many of these. Some of our churches continue to support Bro. Nikolai in Russia. He needs our continued support and we pray that more of our churches will enter into this effort of support. Bro. Kibbons will share more on this in this meeting.

Bro. Ray Flewellin continues to do a great work in Jail Ministry. In his monthly reports he shares that people are being saved on a regular basis, also many rededications are registered. Don Green also is active in the Marion County Jail, with many good words of God working there.

We still need Team Members to serve in the area of Brotherhood, where many opportunities for service exist. We do have members who are actively involved in several areas of ministry in the department.

Cornerstone Counseling Ministry continues to do a great ministry in our community. We welcome Wanda Dobbins as the new Cornerstone Counselor in Campbellsville. She is well qualified and specializes in individual, marriage, and family counseling.

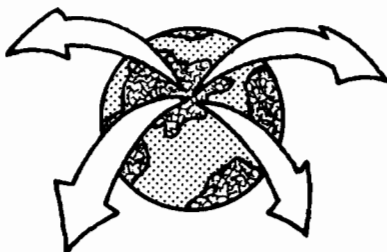

## **BAPTIST STUDENT UNION REPORT CAMPBELLSVILLE UNIVERSITY SEPTEMBER 12, 2000**

The Baptist Student Union of Campbellsville University continues to have a dynamic ministry on our campus. Students have the opportunity to experience worship, ministry, fellowship, discipleship, and missions. Woven throughout these areas is evangelism of our campus, our community, our state, our nation, and our world. Listed below are a few of the highlights of the past year:

- 120 students respond when the plea goes out for student counselors to help at the Bill Glass Crusade. These students will also receive follow-up training on counseling their peers. They were able to counsel nearly 200 teens on Wednesday of the Crusade.
- Monday weekly worship services see an average attendance of 150 for the fall semester. The average for the spring semester is 135. These indicate the largest participation level in the history of BSU at the university.
- Bible study groups were established in every hall of every dormitory.
- Fifteen cell groups met for the purpose of studying scripture, prayer, and discussing of needs on campus.
- Sent \$300 to the Kentucky Baptist Convention for support of the Ministering Aide to Needy Nations Abroad (MANNA) Project.
- Sent \$6,500 to the Collegiate Ministries Department of the Kentucky Baptist Convention to support student summer mission efforts.
- Worked with other school departments and clubs to offer several fellowship opportunities to students including free bowling, movie night, and spring's last blast.
- Over 80 students attended Focus '99 (BSU state convention), 35 attended the state CrossSeekers weekend, and 27 attended the state Leadership Training Conference.
- 26 students went to Wilson, NC to do relief work with Kentucky Disaster Relief workers after the area had experienced severe flooding. Those students also had received training from the state.
- Revival teams and Creative Ministries teams ministered to over seventy churches. A black light team was added to our creative ministries list.
- 25 students attended the International Student Conference.
- Two mission trips were conducted over Christmas break. Eleven students went to Matamoros, Mexico and six went to Amman, Jordan.
- Sixth annual Dinner Theater was held with 150 in attendance.
- Provided Finals Week Care Packages to resident students. Nearly 300 in the fall and 200 in the spring.

- Over 120 students participated in spring break mission trips. Locations were: Cleveland, Boston, Washington D.C., Pierre, SD, Charleston, SC, Arlington, TX, Malta, Mexico, Poland, and Northern Ireland.
- Spring Revival with Dr. Buster Soaries was tremendous. Over 325 church youth came to campus for the services. They also were involved in local ministry project. Over 2,700 man-hours of ministry were committed to work in the Campbellsville area. There were over 20 professions of faith and an additional 37 decisions during the revival.
- Over fifty students involved in some sort of summer missions.
