# CONSTITUTION

## Mission Statement/Preamble

We, the Taylor County Association of Kentucky Baptist, shall cooperate in fulfilling the Great Commission through missions, ministry, and fellowship; and shall serve as a resource and equipping center for the churches and as a liaison between the churches and the association.

**Article 1.** This body shall be called the Taylor County Association of Kentucky Baptists.

**Article 2.** Each cooperating church shall be entitled to four (4) messengers, one of whom shall be the pastor, and one additional messenger for each fifty (50) members or fraction thereof, above the first one hundred (100) members, plus four (4) messengers from each mission sponsored.

**Article 3.** The business of this body shall be, when assembled, to hear reports from the churches with regard to their condition as to members, prosperity, etc., to consult together for their development and growth in all matters pertaining to the evangelism of the world, and shall hold and control such property as shall come into possession of the association.

**Article 4.** The body shall exercise no authority over the local churches, and recognizes their complete autonomy. The Association reserves the right, as final action, to sever relations with any cooperating church for engaging in practices not considered Biblical.

**Article 5.** The Executive Team shall, in addition to the annual meeting, select a time and place for a spring session for the purpose of electing officers and team leaders for the next Associational year, at which time the body shall elect by nomination and private ballot, or raising hand vote: Moderator; Assistant Moderator; Clerk; Assistant Clerk; Treasurer; Assistant Treasurer; and Auditor; whose duties shall be as custom imposes on their respective offices. The Executive Team shall also nominate all team leaders at this time. All officers and team leaders shall continue in office until superseded by their successor, but none shall be eligible to the office of Moderator for more than two successive terms. In the absence of moderator and assistant moderator, the clerk shall convene the meeting and a moderator pro tem shall be elected for that one meeting. The treasurer shall serve in absence of clerk.

**Article 6.** Churches desiring fellowship in the association must make application to the executive board at least six (6) months prior to the annual meeting. The application shall be referred to a Credentials Committee who shall be responsible for examining the church's articles of faith and record of mission support. The committee will also be responsible for bringing a preliminary report to the Executive Board and a final report to the Annual Meeting.

**Article 7.** The Executive Board of the Association shall be composed of all pastors of cooperating churches, missions, and one lay member from each church. All general associational officers and team leaders will by virtue of their office be members of the Executive Board. The retiring Moderator will be a member of the Executive Board for the year following his active service as a moderator. Each associational officer shall hold the same office in the sessions of the Executive Board. The Executive Board shall be responsible for the work of the association between the annual sessions and shall be empowered to fill any vacancy in associational leadership. A quorum of the Executive Board consists of nine (9) members.

**Article 8.** In the appointment of teams, individuals shall be named instead of churches, and on each team named, one or more members shall be laymen. The Executive Team shall consist of Moderator, Clerk, Treasurer, Team Leaders, and such other members as the occasion demands.

**Article 9.** This body shall meet annually, according to adjustment, but in case of emergency, The Executive Board may call a special session, and also change the time and place of the meeting. In addition to the annual meeting, the body shall meet in spring session for purpose of electing officers for the following associational year.

**Article 10.** This Constitution may be altered or amended (except Article 4) at any meeting of the body, upon one year's notice, by concurrence of two-thirds of the members present. The labeling terminology, not including any original intent of the article of the constitution, adopted by Southern Baptist Convention, Kentucky Baptist Convention, and/or this association may be incorporated by vote at an annual meeting by a concurrence of two-thirds of the members presents.

**Parliamentary Rules:** Kerfoot's Parliamentary Rules of Order is a guide of the parliamentary order followed by the association.

## BYLAWS

### ARTICLE 1—DUTIES OF OFFICERS

1. Officers and team leaders elected at the spring session shall assume their duties at the close of the last session in the fall meeting.
2. The moderator shall chair all Associational and executive board meetings, shall make Ad Hoc committee appointments; shall serve as ex officio member of all teams and committee, shall direct the activities of the association, shall serve as contact person for Director of Missions, shall lead in and maintain constant supervision of all phases of Associational work, and shall perform other duties the office of moderator requires.
3. The Clerk shall keep a record of the proceedings of the Association and the Executive Board; superintend the printing and distribution of the minutes of the Association, which shall include statistics from August 1 through July 31 immediately proceeding the annual meeting covered by the minutes, send five copies to the Secretary of the Kentucky Baptist Convention, send copies to various other Baptist agencies, and keep a file of the minutes and other important papers of the association.
4. The Treasurer shall receive all money contributed by the churches to the Association or money received from other sources, shall make reports to the Association and the Executive Board covering the Associational year of August 1 through July 31, and shall make disbursements as authorized by the Association the Executive Board, and shall be authorized to pay all bills and salaries established by the budget adopted at an annual meeting until the next budget is adopted at the following annual meeting. All checks issued by the association shall bear the signatures of the treasurer and the Director of Missions. In an emergency, the assistant treasurer may sign in the absence of either the treasurer or the Director of Missions. The treasurer shall be bonded and the bonding fee paid by the association.



5. The Director of Missions shall be recommended by the executive team and shall be elected by the executive board or at an annual meeting. His (Her) duties shall be commensurate with the job description initially adopted by the executive board in March 1999, unless changed by subsequent action.
6. An auditor shall be secured by the Executive Board to audit the Treasurer's books and attest his annual report. The auditing expense, if any, shall be paid by the Association.

## **ARTICLE II—TEAMS**

1. The Executive Team shall be responsible for planning, developing, and promoting a program of activities for the year in all phases of church work. This team shall give a monthly report on the progress of their program. This team shall also serve as the personnel committee of the association.
2. The Executive Team will plan the program for the annual meeting, name program participants, and shall report to the executive board as far in advance as possible.
3. The Executive Teams, after consulting with the Auxiliary Teams of the Association shall Recommend to the Association at its annual meeting nominations for leaders. The Administrative Team, The Spiritual Growth Ministries Team, Leadership Growth Ministries Team and the Kingdom Growth Ministries Team; and such other officers as the body may from time to time assign them.
4. The Executive Team shall be responsible for presenting a proposed budget in the annual Fall Meeting.
5. The Standing Teams of the Association shall be The Administrative Team, The Spiritual Growth Ministries Team, The Leadership Growth Ministries Team, and The Kingdom Growth Ministries Team. The Executive Team shall be responsible for nominating all standing team members. Members of these Standing Teams shall serve a term of three years. Standing Team members may be nominated for successive three-year terms. A representative from the Women's Missionary Union and a representative from the Brotherhood shall be selected from recommendations made by the Executive Team to the Executive Board. All other teams and Ad Hoc Committees shall be appointed thru the moderator unless specified by special motion of the Executive Board.

  - E. Dr. J. Chester Badgett made a motion that David Gaddie be nominated as Treasurer. John Chowning made a motion that nominations cease and that he be elected by acclamation. It was duly seconded. Motion carried.
  - F. David Gaddie made a motion that Dave Walters be nominated as Assistant Treasurer. John Chowning made a motion that nominations cease and he be elected by acclamation. It was duly seconded. Motion carried.
  - G. Dr. James Jones made a motion that Gene Hall be nominated as Auditor. Larry Frisby made a motion that nominations cease and that he be elected by acclamation. It was duly seconded. Motion carried.
  - H. John Chowning gave a report on the **Kentucky Heartland Outreach**. A brochure was given out showing what **KHO** does which is giving students, faculty and staff opportunities to serve the community by repairing homes free of charge. Some highlights for its first year of operations are: Nearly \$90,000 was raised, over 40 homes were repaired and **KHO** partnered with **Habitat for Humanity** and the **Taylor County Crisis Relief Center** on some area projects. John Chowning

requested we support this ministry by our prayers and by having young people in our churches be involved. He also stated that financial help from our churches help them gain support from foundations, grants, and other churches by showing we support this local ministry.

- A. Debbie Carter gave a presentation on the Christian Women's Job Corps which is an organization of the Women Missionary Union started in the mid 1990's. She gave a hand out which gave the purpose statement, goals, objectives, eight key elements and the faith statement of the CWJC. Its purpose is to help women be successful in life by mentoring them in life skills as well as job skills. A unique aspect of the CWJC is that it requires its clients to do one hour weekly Bible study because CWJC is concerned with the spiritual well being of the people with which they are working. To have the CWJC in a community several steps are required. First you must have a trained site coordinator. Debbie Carter has completed training and is certified to be a site coordinator. Second, a location must have an advisory board. A board was established in November of 2000. Third a community needs assessment must be completed and the CWJC must network with other area agencies in the community. Fourth, each client must have their own personal mentored. In this aspect, the CWJC needs female volunteers to work with these ladies. Debbie Carter asked for prayers, prayers for volunteers and funding. She said feel free to call her at 789-5500 and or email her at [dcarter@campbellsvil.edu](mailto:dcarter@campbellsvil.edu).
- B. Wanda Dobbins gave the Cornerstone Counseling report. She opened by reading Philippians 4:13-14. She said that verse 13 tell us that we can do all things through Christ but verse 14 tells us that it is good when other Christians help us through the tough times and that Christian counseling is helping others through the tough times. Through Cornerstone's Counseling clients both Christian and non-Christian wrestle with issues, set goals and objectives and set target dates to reach these goals and objectives. She is at Campbellsville Baptist Church every Thursday and the local phone number is 469-4181; but someone will answer the 1-800-981-7493 phone number 24 hours a day. She thanked our association for the contributions which help make it possible for those who cannot afford counseling to receive it and was also thankful for the four volunteers who help her greet clients and take phone calls.
- C. Dr. James Jones made the motion that all these reports be accepted. Jeff Newton seconded the motion. Motion carried.
- D. Dr. Jerry Kibbons gave an up-date on Nikolai Syrovatka's work in Russia and told the people to pray because the U.S. Embassy in St. Petersburg has denied Nikolai's visa application to visit America. Dr. Kibbons displayed some pictures of Nikolai and his work in Russia.
- E. Aaron Gabehart ask for \$500.00 for co-ed softball team at city park made up of youth ministers from the TCBA and young ladies from the college. He stated this team would be a witness to the 18-25 year olds and that this segment of our society is largely missing from our churches. 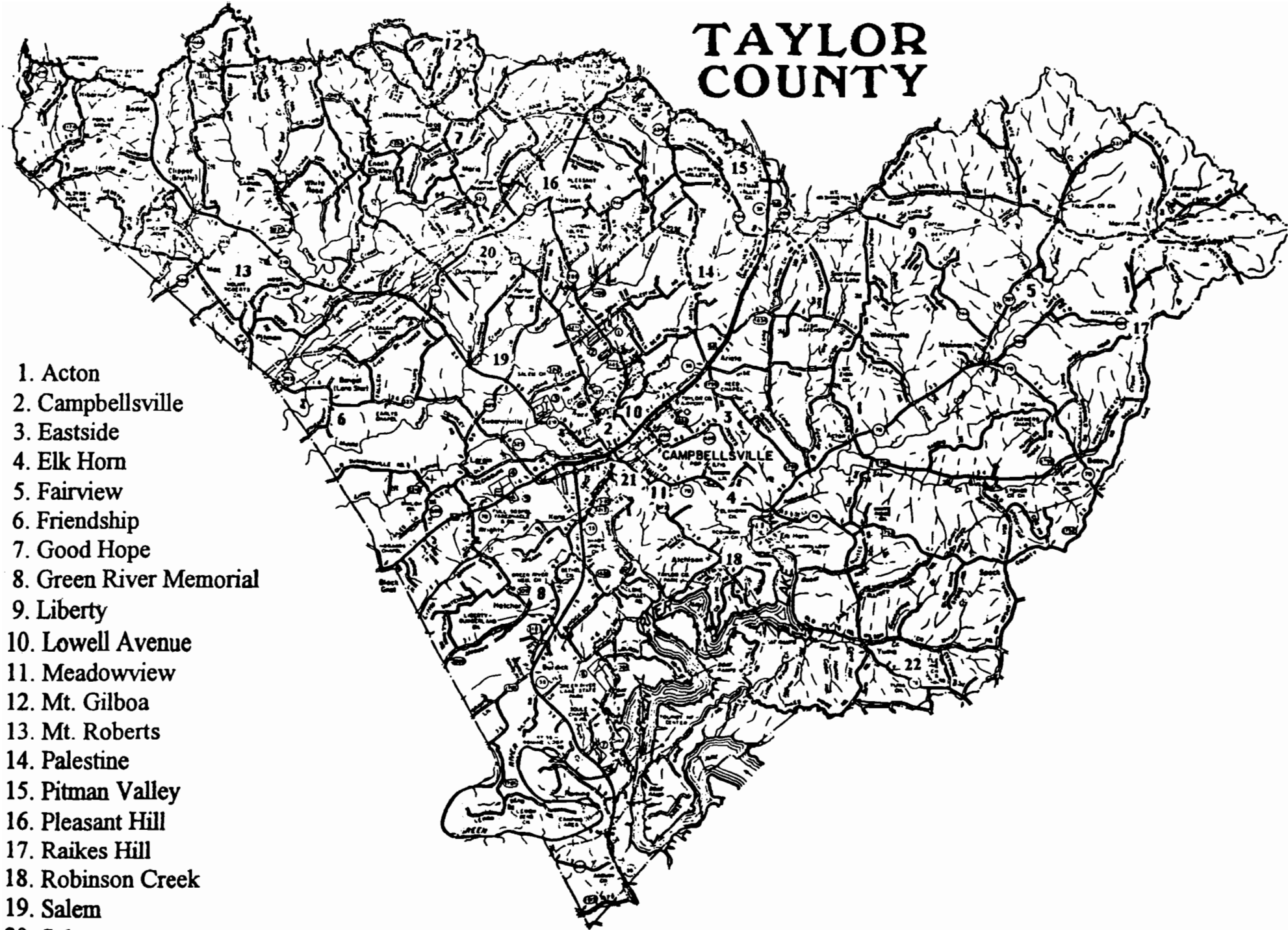

8. Several women and youth groups donated toiletry items to hand out along with the trucks at the truckers chapel.

## BAPTIST STUDENT UNION REPORT CAMPBELLSVILLE UNIVERSITY

The Baptist Student Union of Campbellsville University has much for which to be thankful. God has blessed his ministry on our campus. It seems each year there are greater numbers of students who are not simply excited about going to college. They are earnestly seeking God's direction for their lives and they come with energy, motivation, and a desire to serve. They are coming from your churches and other similar congregations. Thank you for sending them our way.

As a result of God's work we can recount numerous instances of his blessing;

- "Oasis", our weekly worship service, saw an average attendance of 202 for the fall semester. Average attendance for the spring semester was 141.
- We recorded eleven professions of faith.
- We received permission and remodeled a classroom into a conference room, student lounge, and office space for BSU and Fellowship of Christian Athletes.

- \* Great Missions participation
    - \* 26 students on fall break went to Covington, Kentucky to work in a downtown mission project.
    - \* 22 students went to Arlington, Texas over Christmas break to work with “Mission Arlington”.
    - \* 16 students went to Philadelphia over Christmas break to work in an inner city mission among their Vietnamese people.
    - \* 3 students went to the Middle East over Christmas to work with Muslim people.
    - \* Spring break domestic trip sites included Arlington, Boston, Cleveland, Miami, St. Louis, and Orlando. International trips went to Venezuela, Jamaica, Poland, and Costa Rica. There were 108 participating in these trips.
    - \* 81 students participated in some sort of summer service.
  - “Real Love Real Life” spring break event saw around 250 church youth participate. Average attendance at worship was 366. During the day BSU worked with Kentucky Heartland Outreach to repair 13 homes in the Campbellsville area.
  - Sent \$7, 000.00 to the Kentucky Baptist Convention to support summer missions through the Collegiate Ministries Department.
  - Sent \$300.00 to the Kentucky Baptist Convention to support the MANNA (Ministering Aid to Needy Nations Abroad) Project.
  - Held our Seventh Annual Dinner Theater in February with 175 in attendance. Through this event we raised around \$900 for missions.
  - Provided care packages during finals week of the fall and spring semesters. The two events helped raise nearly \$2,500.00 for missions.
  - Revival teams and Creative Ministry teams continue to get frequent requests. Every available weekend saw at least one team in service.
  - 75 students participated in the state BSU convention called FOCUS 2000.
  - 24 students attended the state BSU Leadership Training Conference.
  - 25 students attended the state WMU sponsored International Student Conference.
  - Eight missionary kids attended CU last year. We have established a Mu Kappa (MK) club to help address their needs.
  - BSU helped provide leadership for an Awareness Walk which raised over \$1,000.00 for the Cornerstone Counseling Center in Campbellsville.
  - Averaged 79 at Commuter Lunches for the year. Taylor County Baptist churches prepared the 16 lunches.
- Thank you for your support of our Commuter Lunch ministry. Thank you for your support of BSU and all of our ministries at Campbellsville University.

## KENTUCKY BAPTIST HOMES FOR CHILDREN

James tells in his epistle "to count it joy" when faced with trials and tribulations on behalf of the Lord." It's a privilege to be found worthy to take a stand for what is right and best for kids. But we cannot make the stand alone. We need Kentucky Baptist help now more than ever. Even in the midst of public, vocal support from our Baptist community, our Thanksgiving offering is not growing at the rate we need in order to keep our programs up and running and to be able to accept private placements. Kids need a safe place to live, counseling, spiritual growth, opportunities, self-esteem building activities, and someone to listen to them. It is still about taking in a child in a hopeless situation and putting him where he can grow and build a future for himself. Whether he comes to us from the Commonwealth or his home he is "God" child. We want to be able to help and we cannot help unless the Baptist of Kentucky continue to equip us to do so.....

James 1:2-4 - -12, 18

Consider it all joy, my brethren, when you encounter various trials, knowing that the testing of your faith produces endurance. And let endurance have its perfect result, so that you may be perfect and complete, lacking in nothing. Blessed is the man who perseveres under trial; for once he has been approved, he will receive the crown of life which the Lord has promised to those who love him.

It is through adversity that many of the children in our care find their greatest strengths. The same can be said of this child care ministry itself. We are the longest running childcare ministry of the Baptist in America. Having faced spiritual hardships, depressions, world wars, and many transitions in the field of modern social services, we have prevailed to care for children and families without ever discontinuing care for one day. Our mission says it all and it has not changed. Kentucky Baptist Homes for Children provides care and hope for hurting families and children through Christ-Centered Ministries.

For the past two years, we have faced some very trying times. These tribulations could have distracted us from our mission of caring for children. It's been a painful, heart wrenching time. But we've persevered. And we've considered it pure joy to endure these trials for God and for the children He entrusts to our care.

The lawsuit filed in April 2000 by the ACLU and Americans United for Separation of Church and State alleged that KBHC discriminated against a former employee on the basis of religion when we fired her after learning that she engaged in homosexual behavior. The judge dismissed this claim in July. He said that our employment requirements were based on behavior and not on religion. While there, no doubt, will be an appeal this is an integral step in a long journey.

The second part of the suit will continue in the courts. It addresses the constitutional question of whether or not the state of Kentucky is establishing a state religion by reimbursing KBHC for the care of the state's children. We don't think the state is establishing a religion by contracting with us. This phase of the suit will likely continue for several years. We will have about a year of discovery. And it will likely be a year or 18 months before the judge rules on the case.

Agency staff meetings and community meetings with pastors are being held across the Commonwealth to share why our programs are changing. In 1997, Congress passed a

landmark bill known as the Adoption and Safe Families ACT. (ASFA) The main goals of this legislation were aimed at encouraging states to serve children close to home, unite families when possible and beneficial, and encourage expedited adoption of children unable to return to their parents. Several initiatives resulted from the Cabinet for Families and Children interpretation of the ASFA goals. Two examples are Family to Family, a program aimed at placing children in a foster home within the same neighborhood as their family of origin, and Kinship Care, recruiting family relatives to agree to provide ongoing care for children by paying relatives. Each of these programs are controversial have both proponents and opponents who are interested in the well-being of Kentucky's children. Additionally, the CFC is now beginning recruiting for their own therapeutic foster care homes.

Residential Care providers are under increased pressure to provide positive treatment outcomes in a shorter duration. Children with Level of Care ranked 4 and 5 are the ones being referred to residential programs. This increases the burden on our agency to assess clients quickly and engage them in intense treatment opportunities in order to prepare these clients to return to their families where allowable. States now receive incentive money for removing children from out-of-home care, consequently, we have placements at lower levels than in the past and children committed to the state being kept in care for shorter periods of time. As states compete for the federal incentive monies available, they are focusing on meeting the ASA goals. These changes have not only forced changes in our programs but also other similar programs throughout the state and country.

We want you to know that we are searching for new referral sources. We have achieved and maintained JCAHO Accreditation, which are the highest professional standards of care. Our programs will continue to be evaluated and changed to meet the changing needs of our clientele KBHC has demonstrated a commitment to exceeding the standards of care for families that we serve. While we cannot control which clients DCBS refer to our program, we can prove our agency's ability to improve the well-being of the children of Kentucky. We are searching for new referral sources. To that end, we now have a new director for marketing and research working full time to locate those referral sources.

Children and families are in trouble right now and they will continue to need us in the future. We need you and your involvement and we need your gift to the Thanksgiving Offering to keep our programs running. We need to ensure that this ministry will be here providing care and hope to the hurting regardless of what the world says. We will continue focusing on our mission and take a proactive approach to increasing referrals. We want to take a proactive approach to securing private funds to ensure the future of our ministry and function independently of the Commonwealth.

You can continue to do what companionate Baptist have done since 1968... whether that is providing care to the children or providing support to staff and programs. Take pride in the fact that you support a ministry and an agency that is true to itself and its principles. Be assured that positive changes are on the way. Pray for God's blessing on this ministry.
