CONSTITUTION

Mission Statement/Preamble

We, the Taylor County Association of Kentucky Baptist, shall cooperate in fulfilling the Great Commission through missions, ministry, and fellowship; and shall serve as a resource and equipping center for the churches and as a liaison between the churches and the association.

Article 1. This body shall be called the Taylor County Association of Kentucky Baptists.

Article 2. Each cooperating church shall be entitled to four (4) messengers, one of whom shall be the pastor, and one additional messenger for each fifty (50) members or fraction thereof, above the first one hundred (100) members, plus four (4) messengers from each mission sponsored.

Article 3. The business of this body shall be, when assembled, to hear reports from the churches with regard to their condition as to members, prosperity, etc., to consult together for their development and growth in all matters pertaining to the evangelism of the world, and shall hold and control such property as shall come into possession of the association.

Article 4. The body shall exercise no authority over the local churches, and recognizes their complete autonomy. The Association reserves the right, as final action, to sever relations with any cooperating church for engaging in practices not considered Biblical.

Article 5. The Executive Team shall, in addition to the annual meeting, select a time and place for a spring session for the purpose of electing officers and team leaders for the next Associational year, at which time the body shall elect by nomination and private ballot, or raising hand vote: Moderator; Assistant Moderator; Clerk; Assistant Clerk; Treasurer; Assistant Treasurer; and Auditor; whose duties shall be as custom imposes on their respective offices. The Executive Team shall also nominate all team leaders at this time. All officers and team leaders shall continue in office until superseded by their successor, but none shall be eligible to the office of Moderator for more than two successive terms. In the absence of moderator and assistant moderator, the clerk shall convene the meeting and a moderator pro tem shall be elected for that one meeting. The treasurer shall serve in absence of clerk.

Article 6. Churches desiring fellowship in the association must make application to the executive board at least six (6) months prior to the annual meeting. The application shall be referred to a Credentials Committee who shall be responsible for examining the church's articles of faith and record of mission support. The committee will also be responsible for bringing a preliminary report to the Executive Board and a final report to the Annual Meeting.

Article 7. The Executive Board of the Association shall be composed of all pastors of cooperating churches, missions, and one lay member from each church. All general associational officers and team leaders will by virtue of their office be members of the Executive Board. The retiring Moderator will be a member of the Executive Board for the year following his active service as a moderator. Each associational officer shall hold the same office in the sessions of the Executive Board. The Executive Board shall be responsible for the work of the association between the annual sessions and shall be empowered to fill any vacancy in associational leadership. A quorum of the Executive Board consists of nine (9) members.

Article 8. In the appointment of teams, individuals shall be named instead of churches, and on each team named, one or more members shall be laymen. The Executive Team shall consist of Moderator, Clerk, Treasurer, Team Leaders, and such other members as the occasion demands.

Article 9. This body shall meet annually, according to adjustment, but in case of emergency, The Executive Board may call a special session, and also change the time and place of the meeting. In addition to the annual meeting, the body shall meet in spring session for purpose of electing officers for the following associational year.

Article 10. This Constitution may be altered or amended (except Article 4) at any meeting of the body, upon one year's notice, by concurrence of two-thirds of the members present. The labeling terminology, not including any original intent of the article of the constitution, adopted by Southern Baptist Convention, Kentucky Baptist Convention, and/or this association may be incorporated by vote at an annual meeting by a concurrence of two-thirds of the members presents.

Parliamentary Rules: Kerfoot's Parliamentary Rules of Order is a guide of the parliamentary order followed by the association.

BYLAWS

ARTICLE 1—DUTIES OF OFFICERS

1. Officers and team leaders elected at the spring session shall assume their duties at the close of the last session in the fall meeting.
2. The moderator shall chair all Associational and executive board meetings, shall make Ad Hoc committee appointments; shall serve as ex officio member of all teams and committee, shall direct the activities of the association, shall serve as contact person for Director of Missions, shall lead in and maintain constant supervision of all phases of Associational work, and shall perform other duties the office of moderator requires.
3. The Clerk shall keep a record of the proceedings of the Association and the Executive Board; superintend the printing and distribution of the minutes of the Association, which shall include statistics from August 1 through July 31 immediately proceeding the annual meeting covered by the minutes, send five copies to the Secretary of the Kentucky Baptist Convention, send copies to various other Baptist agencies, and keep a file of the minutes and other important papers of the association.
4. The Treasurer shall receive all money contributed by the churches to the Association or money received from other sources, shall make reports to the Association and the Executive Board covering the Associational year of August 1 through July 31, and shall make disbursements as authorized by the Association the Executive Board, and shall be authorized to pay all bills and salaries established by the budget adopted at an annual meeting until the next budget is adopted at the following annual meeting. All checks issued by the association shall bear the signatures of the treasurer and the Director of Missions. In an emergency, the assistant treasurer may sign in the absence of either the treasurer or the Director of Missions. The treasurer shall be bonded and the bonding fee paid by the association.

5. The Director of Missions shall be recommended by the executive team and shall be elected by the executive board or at an annual meeting. His (Her) duties shall be commensurate with the job description initially adopted by the executive board in March 1999, unless changed by subsequent action.
6. An auditor shall be secured by the Executive Board to audit the Treasurer's books and attest his annual report. The auditing expense, if any, shall be paid by the Association.

ARTICLE II—TEAMS

1. The Executive Team shall be responsible for planning, developing, and promoting a program of activities for the year in all phases of church work. This team shall give a monthly report on the progress of their program. This team shall also serve as the personnel committee of the association.
2. The Executive Team will plan the program for the annual meeting, name program participants, and shall report to the executive board as far in advance as possible.
3. The Executive Teams, after consulting with the Auxiliary Teams of the Association shall Recommend to the Association at its annual meeting nominations for leaders. The Administrative Team, The Spiritual Growth Ministries Team, Leadership Growth Ministries Team and the Kingdom Growth Ministries Team; and such other officers as the body may from time to time assign them.
4. The Executive Team shall be responsible for presenting a proposed budget in the annual Fall Meeting.
5. The Standing Teams of the Association shall be The Administrative Team, The Spiritual Growth Ministries Team, The Leadership Growth Ministries Team, and The Kingdom Growth Ministries Team. The Executive Team shall be responsible for nominating all standing team members. Members of these Standing Teams shall serve a term of three years. Standing Team members may be nominated for successive three-year terms. A representative from the Women's Missionary Union and a representative from the Brotherhood shall be selected from recommendations made by the Executive Team to the Executive Board. All other teams and Ad Hoc Committees shall be appointed thru the moderator unless specified by special motion of the Executive Board.

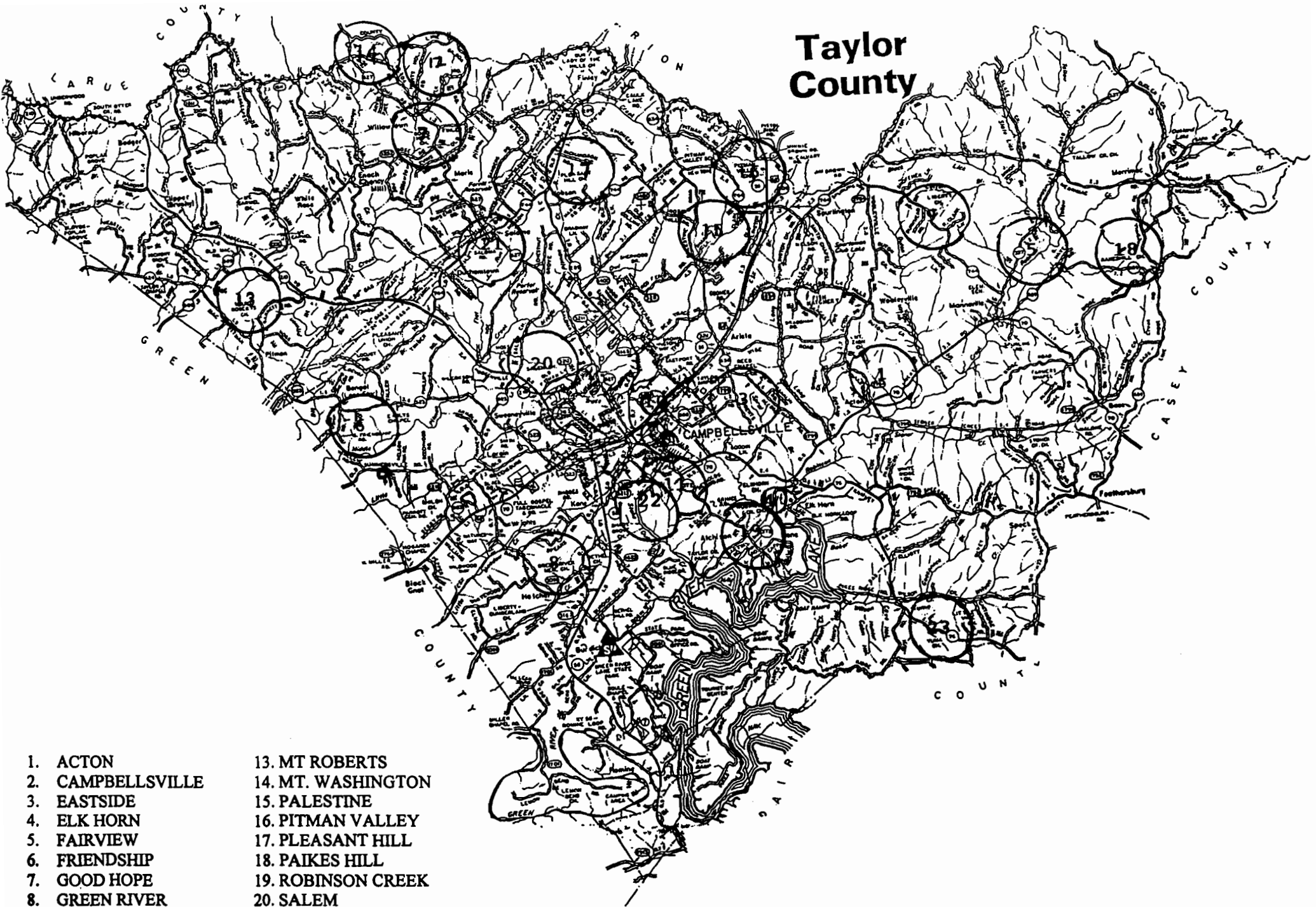

The mission statement of the Collegiate Ministries Department of the Kentucky Baptist Convention is "As a Campus Ministry family, committed to integrity and love, we nurture students toward maturity in Christ." At Campbellsville University the BSU is working hard to provide a framework within which students are maturing in their walk of faith with Jesus Christ. The ministry strategy on campus is similar to that of the local church. We plan opportunities for worship, fellowship, missions, discipleship, ministry, and evangelism. Examples of student participation are:

- Average attendance in weekly worship for all 2001 was 223. For the spring semester attendance averaged 163. For the year, we averaged about 200.
- More than 75 students participated in one or more of our creative ministry teams: Drama, Puppets, Blacklight, and Interpretive Movement.
- More than 40 students participated on one or more of our Revival teams.
- Over 600 students, faculty, and staff attended the BSU picnic during Welcome Week last August.
- Finals Week Care Packages were delivered to over 320 students last fall and 300 students last spring. This event helps us raise money to support missions. This year we raised more than \$3,000.00
- Students participated in mission trips during fall, Christmas, spring and summer breaks.
- Fall break 12 students went to Oneida, KY
- Christmas break 12 students went to Arlington, TX; 13 went to Bel Air, MD; and 8 students went to Dearborn, MI.
- **Spring break:**
 - * Seven students went to Cleveland, OH to work in the inner-city
 - * A team of eight including four students, one CU staff member, one CU adjunct faculty member and two Campbellsville residents served in Hawaii. They led revival services, led a block party, and did some repair work around The Gospel Lighthouse on Ewa Beach
 - 13 students went to Los Angeles to work with the LA Dream Center in inner-city Los Angeles.
 - 8 students went to Panama City Beach, FL to work with Beach Reach.
 - 14 students went to Philadelphia to work with an organization called New Hope for Women.
 - 4 students went to Washington DC to work with CU alumni Lonnie and Fran Turner. Their main focus for the week dealt with homelessness.
 - 14 students went to Costa Rica to work with CU alumni Bill and Linda Egbert among the Guaymi Indians.
 - 8 students went to Abidjan, Ivory Coast to work with Larry and Edwina Rowell among the Jula tribe there. The Rowell were missionaries-in-residence at CU during the 2000-01 academic year.
 - 6 students went to Paris, France to work among the Muslim population there.
 - 5 students went to Warsaw, Poland to work with university students.

- Students raised \$60,000 to support spring break mission trips.
- We sent \$7,500 to the Kentucky Baptist Convention to support summer missions.
- There were 78 students who were involved in summer missions in 2002.
- A total of 229 students participated in one of our mission opportunities.
- Students led monthly servant-evangelism projects in the dorms on campus.
- BSU co-hosted Deeper Love/Deeper Life in April. Over 300 Jr. and Sr. High School youth attended the four day event. Clayton King was our evangelist. There were 24 professions of faith during the week.

The list below list number totals for mission trips, students, states and countries, and money raised.

SPIRITUAL GROWTH TEAM REPORT 2001-2002

The following is a report of the activities and accomplishment of the Spiritual Growth Team, which is comprised, of Sunday School, Discipleship, Creative Ministries, and Music:

1. Chuck Pollard was elected to head up the Music Team.
2. Don Gowin was elected to head up the Sunday School Team.
3. VBS clinic was held in April at Salem Baptist for both the Taylor County Baptist Association and East Lynn Association. We had 57 people in attendance representing both associations and 15 churches.

CORNERSTONE COUNSELING REPORT

Cornerstone Counseling is beginning its fourth year in partnership with the Taylor County Baptist Association and Campbellsville University. Campbellsville's office is one of 22 Cornerstone offices located across the state of Kentucky.

Affiliated with the Kentucky Baptist Homes for Children, Cornerstone is celebrating its tenth anniversary this fall. Cornerstone is a professional Christian counseling ministry dedicated to helping individual, couples, and families solve problem in a healthy way.

Our local Cornerstone office is located in the Campbellsville Baptist Church. Our counselors is Wanda Dobbins, a certified social worker and a member of the American Association of Pastoral Counselors. A former Southern Baptist missionary for 18 years in Chili where her work centered on pastoral counseling and hospital chaplaincy, Ms. Dobbins is beginning her third year with our local counseling office.

Janet Davenport, Carolyn Harris, Donabeth Doyle, and Shirley Young continue to serve as volunteer receptionists. John Chowning and Sylvia Morris, both of Campbellsville University, serve as co-chair of Cornerstone's local advisory council.

This past year our local Cornerstone office served 170 person from Taylor and surrounding areas. During the past year, 46 new clients were referred to the counseling ministry primarily from churches and other ministries. The most common concerns of clients are individual issues and grief. These concerns were addressed in a Christian context through 209 hours of counseling. While serving members of our churches and the university, Cornerstone's ministry also extends to our local community.

All counseling is confidential. There is a charge per counseling hour. The association and university's financial contribution to Cornerstone make scholarship help available.

KBHC also provides residential treatment, foster care, adoption, independent living, child development and other support services to children and families. Kentucky Baptist Homes for Children is licensed by the Kentucky Cabinet for Families and Children and has provided services since 1869. The agency is accredited by the Joint Commission on Accreditation for Healthcare Organizations.

STEWARDSHIP DEPARTMENT

Financial Stewardship Education continues to be one of the greatest needs among our Kentucky Baptist Convention churches. The latest figures we have from our churches in the 2001 Kentucky Baptist Convention Annual, reveals that the per capita giving from resident members last year was \$443.33. That means that on average each Kentucky Baptist resident church member only gave a little over \$433 last year.

I have been meeting with pastors and laymen in five different location. Our intent is to see what we are doing well in the area of financial stewardship, what areas we need improvement, and how we can learn from each other. So far each group has concluded that we do need to give serious attention to stewardship education because most of the money given in our churches is given by the people who are 55 years of age and older. The group has also concluded that many of the younger families and individuals are having a problem with too much consumer debt. We have concluded that we need to offer money management seminars for our people. We are also discussing ways to increase giving among all age groups, thereby hoping to find ways to increase the per capita giving of our church members.

We continue to provide materials to churches for budget promotion purposes. This year's materials are entitled **Encouraging the Heart**. All the materials for the three Sunday emphases are available from our office. And they are provided free of charge because of your faithfulness in giving through the Cooperative Program.

I have led several Successful Christian Financial Management workshops during this past year. This is a one day workshop designed to help people understand the Biblical principles of money, understand the Biblical principle of tithing, learn how to set up a family budget, how to be debt free and to become a grace-giver like the Macedonians are recorded in Paul's Second Letter to the Corinthians. This is one way a church can begin to address the money management issues with there members.

We also trained ten people from across the state to do these workshops. If you are interested in having a workshop in your church, you can contact our office at the Kentucky Baptist Convention office.

Challenge to Build

We continue to do **Challenge to Build** program across the state. This year we did 7 programs so far and we have 3 already scheduled for this fall. This year we worked with 3 churches that plan to change locations and construct all new facilities. We have worked with other churches that plan to build new buildings at their present campus site, while other were for the purpose of paying off indebtedness from a previous construction project. Phil Basinger, Truett Cocanougher and Harold Rice continue to serve as consultants and to lead **Challenge to Build** programs across the state.
