CONSTITUTION

Mission Statement/Preamble

We, the Taylor County Association of Kentucky Baptist, shall cooperate in fulfilling the Great Commission through missions, ministry, and fellowship; and shall serve as a resource and equipping center for the churches and as a liaison between the churches and the association.

Article 1. This body shall be called the Taylor County Association of Kentucky Baptists.

Article 2. Each cooperating church shall be entitled to four (4) messengers, one of whom shall be the pastor, and one additional messenger for each fifty (50) members or fraction thereof, above the first one hundred (100) members, plus four (4) messengers from each mission sponsored.

Article 3. The business of this body shall be, when assembled, to hear reports from the churches with regard to their condition as to members, prosperity, etc., to consult together for their development and growth in all matters pertaining to the evangelism of the world, and shall hold and control such property as shall come into possession of the association.

Article 4. The body shall exercise no authority over the local churches, and recognizes their complete autonomy. The Association reserves the right, as final action, to sever relations with any cooperating church for engaging in practices not considered Biblical.

Article 5. The Executive Team shall, in addition to the annual meeting, select a time and place for a spring session for the purpose of electing officers and team leaders for the next Associational year, at which time the body shall elect by nomination and private ballot, or raising hand vote: Moderator; Assistant Moderator; Clerk; Assistant Clerk; Treasurer; Assistant Treasurer; and Auditor; whose duties shall be as custom imposes on their respective offices. The Executive Team shall also nominate all team leaders at this time. All officers and team leaders shall continue in office until superseded by their successor, but none shall be eligible to the office of Moderator for more than two successive terms. In the absence of moderator and assistant moderator, the clerk shall convene the meeting and a moderator pro tem shall be elected for that one meeting. The treasurer shall serve in absence of clerk.

Article 6. Churches desiring fellowship in the association must make application to the executive board at least six (6) months prior to the annual meeting. The application shall be referred to a Credentials Committee who shall be responsible for examining the church's articles of faith and record of mission support. The committee will also be responsible for bringing a preliminary report to the Executive Board and a final report to the Annual Meeting.

Article 7. The Executive Board of the Association shall be composed of all pastors of cooperating churches, missions, and one lay member from each church. All general associational officers and team leaders will by virtue of their office be members of the Executive Board. The retiring Moderator will be a member of the Executive Board for the year following his active service as a moderator. Each associational officer shall hold the same office in the sessions of the Executive Board. The Executive Board shall be responsible for the work of the association between the annual sessions and shall be empowered to fill any vacancy in associational leadership. A quorum of the Executive Board consists of nine (9) members.

Article 8. In the appointment of teams, individuals shall be named instead of churches, and on each team named, one or more members shall be laymen. The Executive Team shall consist of Moderator, Clerk, Treasurer, Team Leaders, and such other members as the occasion demands.

Article 9. This body shall meet annually, according to adjustment, but in case of emergency, The Executive Board may call a special session, and also change the time and place of the meeting. In addition to the annual meeting, the body shall meet in spring session for purpose of electing officers for the following associational year.

Article 10. This Constitution may be altered or amended (except Article 4) at any meeting of the body, upon one year's notice, by concurrence of two-thirds of the members present. The labeling terminology, not including any original intent of the article of the constitution, adopted by Southern Baptist Convention, Kentucky Baptist Convention, and/or this association may be incorporated by vote at an annual meeting by a concurrence of two-thirds of the members presents.

Parliamentary Rules: Kerfoot's Parliamentary Rules of Order is a guide of the parliamentary order followed by the association.

BYLAWS

ARTICLE 1—DUTIES OF OFFICERS

1. Officers and team leaders elected at the spring session shall assume their duties at the close of the last session in the fall meeting.
2. The moderator shall chair all Associational and executive board meetings, shall make Ad Hoc committee appointments; shall serve as ex officio member of all teams and committee, shall direct the activities of the association, shall serve as contact person for Director of Missions, shall lead in and maintain constant supervision of all phases of Associational work, and shall perform other duties the office of moderator requires.
3. The Clerk shall keep a record of the proceedings of the Association and the Executive Board; superintend the printing and distribution of the minutes of the Association, which shall include statistics from August 1 through July 31 immediately proceeding the annual meeting covered by the minutes, send five copies to the Secretary of the Kentucky Baptist Convention, send copies to various other Baptist agencies, and keep a file of the minutes and other important papers of the association.
4. The Treasurer shall receive all money contributed by the churches to the Association or money received from other sources, shall make reports to the Association and the Executive Board covering the Associational year of August 1 through July 31, and shall make disbursements as authorized by the Association the Executive Board, and shall be authorized to pay all bills and salaries established by the budget adopted at an annual meeting until the next budget is adopted at the following annual meeting. All checks issued by the association shall bear the signatures of the treasurer and the Director of Missions. In an emergency, the assistant treasurer may sign in the absence of either the treasurer or the Director of Missions. The treasurer shall be bonded and the bonding fee paid by the association.

5. The Director of Missions shall be recommended by the executive team and shall be elected by the executive board or at an annual meeting. His (Her) duties shall be commensurate with the job description initially adopted by the executive board in March 1999, unless changed by subsequent action.
6. An auditor shall be secured by the Executive Board to audit the Treasurer's books and attest his annual report. The auditing expense, if any, shall be paid by the Association.

ARTICLE II—TEAMS

1. The Executive Team shall be responsible for planning, developing, and promoting a program of activities for the year in all phases of church work. This team shall give a monthly report on the progress of their program. This team shall also serve as the personnel committee of the association.
2. The Executive Team will plan the program for the annual meeting, name program participants, and shall report to the executive board as far in advance as possible.
3. The Executive Teams, after consulting with the Auxiliary Teams of the Association shall Recommend to the Association at its annual meeting nominations for leaders. The Administrative Team, The Spiritual Growth Ministries Team, Leadership Growth Ministries Team and the Kingdom Growth Ministries Team; and such other officers as the body may from time to time assign them.
4. The Executive Team shall be responsible for presenting a proposed budget in the annual Fall Meeting.
5. The Standing Teams of the Association shall be The Administrative Team, The Spiritual Growth Ministries Team, The Leadership Growth Ministries Team, and The Kingdom Growth Ministries Team. The Executive Team shall be responsible for nominating all standing team members. Members of these Standing Teams shall serve a term of three years. Standing Team members may be nominated for successive three-year terms. A representative from the Women's Missionary Union and a representative from the Brotherhood shall be selected from recommendations made by the Executive Team to the Executive Board. All other teams and Ad Hoc Committees shall be appointed thru the moderator unless specified by special motion of the Executive Board.

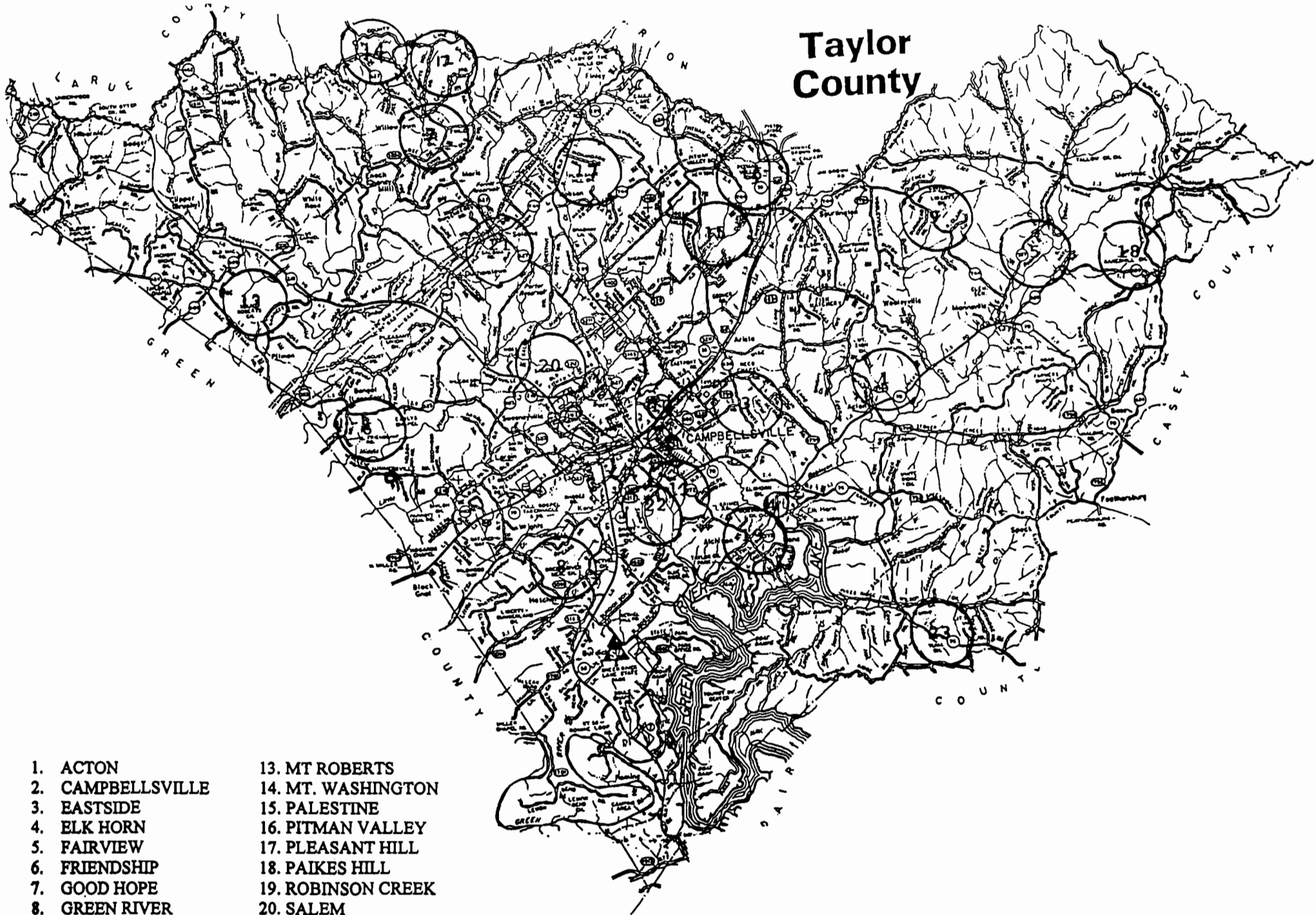

Excerpts from an E-Mail letter from Nikolai Syrovatka August 23, 2003

Thank you very much for your prayers, spiritual backing and support of our ministry of the Learning Center and my family. Your care, help and support gives me the possibility to continue my ministry as the Director of the Learning Center. I believe and hope the Lord will use me as His tool in the future. I understand our position and role is to the churches of the Northwest Region as the first priority and then in the other different regions of Russia also.

The Northwest Region has 9 large areas. St. Petersburg and Leningrad area is one of the areas of the region. We have 6 Baptist churches in St. Petersburg and 28 other Baptist churches in the Leningrad area where people worship. These (34) churches have roughly 3,700 members. The other areas (7) of the Northwest Region have about 200-300 members each in their church. Therefore I think we must show the churches of our brotherhood examples for the organization of ministries and help them do this work as we have opportunities.

I believe we can and must take progressive steps through Church Education to open new opportunities for contact between churches and help the churches of Russia fulfill the Great Commission. We ask you to pray for us that the Lord will help the Russian Brotherhood in this work.

Dear friends I thank the Heavenly Father for His blessings (through) our contacts meeting and ministries. It is a great joy and honor to know that somewhere brothers and sisters remember me and pray for me and our ministry.

Today we need your backing and care for our ministry. I believe every spiritual victory begins with learning and training, therefore, I want to continue my work which we began together.

Baptist Student Union report
Campbellsville University
September 9, 2003

Just as the theme for Campbellsville University is "Find Your Calling", the BSU seeks to help students discover God's calling in their lives. Through worship, campus and community ministries, fellowship, discipleship, evangelism, and mission opportunities the BSU acts as a conduit for God to shape student lives. Over the past year BSU can report the following results of its vital ministry on our campus:

- Average attendance in weekly worship for fall 2002 was 168. For the spring semester attendance averaged 125.
- There were 26 ministry (Revival, Creative and Disciple Now) team trips each involving between five and forty students.
- There were 26 professions of faith recorded during ministry team weekends.
- Over 600 students, faculty, and staff attended the BSU picnic during Welcome Week last August.
- 90 freshmen participated in CAMCOM, a ministry designed specifically for them.
- There were between 15 and 20 small group Bible studies meeting in dorms. Each group had between four and six members.
- Final week Care Packages were distributed to over 300 students at the end of the fall semester and to over 270 at the end of the spring semester.
- Mission trips
 - Spring Break
 - Three students participated in the IMB's "Christmas in China" project.
 - Five students ministered in inner city Philadelphia.
 - Spring Break
 1. Five students did inner-city ministry in Cleveland, Ohio.
 2. Nine students worked with the Guaymi Indians of Costa Rica. This is the third year in a row we have ministered among the Guaymi. Bill and Linda Egbert, CU alumni, are our missionary contacts there.
 3. Eleven students went to Honduras to work with the Baptist Medical and Dental Mission ministry to conduct an evangelistic crusade. This team recorded 200 professions of faith during the crusade!
 4. Four students worked in an orphanage home and in an old soldiers' home in Jamaica.
 5. Two students joined other collegians to work among the homeless in Las Vegas, Nevada.
 6. Four students traveled to Montreal, Canada, to do prayer walking, door-to-door ministry, and distributed the Jesus film.
 7. Three students participated in Beach Reach in Panama City Beach, Florida. This is the eighth consecutive year Campbellsville University has sent students to be a part of this ministry.
 8. Fifteen students worked in a women's ministry in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania.
 9. Seven students and two staff participated in collegiate ministry, homeless ministry, and youth evangelism in Seattle, Washington.

- We sent \$7,500 to the Kentucky Baptist Convention Collegiate Ministries Department to support KBC summer missions.
- We sent \$800 to the Kentucky Baptist Convention to support the MANNA project chosen by the Collegiate Ministries Department as our area of focus for the year.
- There were over 70 students who participated in summer missions.

I want to say “thanks” again to the Taylor County Baptist Association for your unending support of campus ministry at Campbellsville University. You graciously welcome students into your fellowship, nurture and challenge them, then support them as they minister on campus, in our community and literally around the world. May God continue to bless our ministry in our “Jerusalem”.

3. VBS clinic was held April 28<sup>th</sup>, at Salem Baptist for the Taylor County Baptist Association. We had 60 people in attendance representing 11 churches in Taylor County, 2 churches from the Russell Creek Association and 2 churches from the Long Run Association.
4. A Mission fund has been established to help members of Taylor County Baptist Association churches go on missions trips both nationally and internationally. Guidelines were established and a mission committee is in place to review applications and grant monetary support from this fund for mission trips.
