CONSTITUTION

Mission Statement/Preamble

We, the Taylor County Association of Kentucky Baptist, shall cooperate in fulfilling the Great Commission through missions, ministry, and fellowship; and shall serve as a resource and equipping center for the churches and as a liaison between the churches and the association.

Article 1. This body shall be called the Taylor County Association of Kentucky Baptists.

Article 2. Each cooperating church shall be entitled to four (4) messengers, one of whom shall be the pastor, and one additional messenger for each fifty (50) members or fraction thereof, above the first one hundred (100) members, plus four (4) messengers from each mission sponsored.

Article 3. The business of this body shall be, when assembled, to hear reports from the churches with regard to their condition as to members, prosperity, etc., to consult together for their development and growth in all matters pertaining to the evangelism of the world, and shall hold and control such property as shall come into possession of the association.

Article 4. The body shall exercise no authority over the local churches, and recognizes their complete autonomy. The Association reserves the right, as final action, to sever relations with any cooperating church for engaging in practices not considered Biblical.

Article 5. The Executive Team shall, in addition to the annual meeting, select a time and place for a spring session for the purpose of electing officers and team leaders for the next Associational year, at which time the body shall elect by nomination and private ballot, or raising hand vote: Moderator; Assistant Moderator; Clerk; Assistant Clerk; Treasurer; Assistant Treasurer; and Auditor; and Assistant Auditor whose duties shall be as custom imposes on their respective offices. The Executive Team shall also nominate all team Leaders at this time. All officers and team leaders shall continue in office until superseded by their successor, but none shall be eligible to the office of Moderator for more than two successive terms. In the absence of moderator and assistant moderator, the clerk shall convene the meeting and a moderator pro tem shall be elected for that one meeting. The treasurer shall serve in absence of clerk.

Article 6. Churches desiring fellowship in the association must make application to the executive board at least six (6) months prior to the annual meeting. The application shall be referred to a Credentials Committee who shall be responsible for examining the church's articles of faith and record of mission support. The committee will also be responsible for bringing a preliminary report to the Executive Board and a final report to the Annual Meeting.

Article 7. The Executive Board of the Association shall be composed of all pastors of cooperating churches, missions, and one lay member from each church. All general associational officers and team leaders will by virtue of their office be members of the Executive Board. The retiring Moderator will be a member of the Executive Board for the year following his active service as a moderator. Each associational officer shall hold the same office in the sessions of the Executive Board. The Executive Board shall be responsible for the work of the association between the annual sessions and shall be empowered to fill any vacancy in associational leadership. A quorum of the Executive Board consists of nine (9) members.

Article 8. In the appointment of teams, individuals shall be named instead of churches, and on each team named, one or more members shall be laymen. The Executive Team shall consist of Moderator, Clerk, Treasurer, Team Leaders, and such other members as the occasion demands.

Article 9. This body shall meet annually, according to adjustment, but in case of emergency, The Executive Board may call a special session, and also change the time and place of the meeting. In addition to the annual meeting, the body shall meet in spring session for purpose of electing officers for the following associational year.

Article 10. This Constitution may be altered or amended (except Article 4) at any meeting of the body, upon one year's notice, by concurrence of two-thirds of the members present. The labeling terminology, not including any original intent of the article of the constitution, adopted by Southern Baptist Convention, Kentucky Baptist Convention, and/or this association may be incorporated by vote at an annual meeting by a concurrence of two-thirds of the members presents.

Parliamentary Rules: Robert's Rules of Order (latest edition) is a guide of the parliamentary order followed by the association.

BYLAWS

ARTICLE 1—DUTIES OF OFFICERS

1. Officers and team leaders elected at the spring session shall assume their duties at the close of the last session in the fall meeting.
2. The moderator shall chair all Associational and executive board meetings, shall make Ad Hoc committee appointments; shall serve as ex officio member of all teams and committee, shall direct the activities of the association, shall serve as contact person for Director of Missions, shall lead in and maintain constant supervision of all phases of Associational work, and shall perform other duties the office of moderator requires.
3. The Clerk shall keep a record of the proceedings of the Association and the Executive Board; superintend the printing and distribution of the minutes of the Association, which shall include statistics from August 1 through July 31 immediately preceding the annual meeting covered by the minutes, send five copies to the Secretary of the Kentucky Baptist Convention, send copies to various other Baptist agencies, and keep a file of the minutes and other important papers of the association.
4. The Treasurer shall receive all money contributed by the churches to the Association or money received from other sources, shall make reports to the Association and the Executive Board covering the Associational year of August 1 through July 31, and shall make disbursements as authorized by the Association the Executive Board, and shall be authorized to pay all bills and salaries established by the budget adopted at an annual meeting until the next budget is adopted at the following annual meeting. All checks issued by the association shall bear the signatures of the treasurer and the Director of Missions. In an emergency, the assistant treasurer may sign in the absence of either the treasurer or the Director of Missions. The treasurer shall be bonded and the bonding fee paid by the association.

5. The Director of Missions shall be recommended by the executive team and shall be elected by the executive board or at an annual meeting. His (Her) duties shall be commensurate with the job description initially adopted by the executive board in March 1999, unless changed by subsequent action.
6. An auditor shall be secured by the Executive Board to audit the Treasurer's books and attest his annual report. The auditing expense, if any, shall be paid by the Association.

ARTICLE II—TEAMS

1. The Executive Team shall be responsible for planning, developing, and promoting a program of activities for the year in all phases of church work. This team shall give a monthly report on the progress of their program. This team shall also serve as the personnel committee of the association.
2. The Executive Team will plan the program for the annual meeting, name program participants, and shall report to the executive board as far in advance as possible.
3. The Executive Teams, after consulting with the Auxiliary Teams of the Association shall recommend to the Association at its annual meeting nominations for leaders. The Administrative Team, The Spiritual Growth Ministries Team, Leadership Growth Ministries Team and the Kingdom Growth Ministries Team; and such other officers as the body may from time to time assign them.
4. The Executive Team shall be responsible for presenting a proposed budget in the annual Fall Meeting.

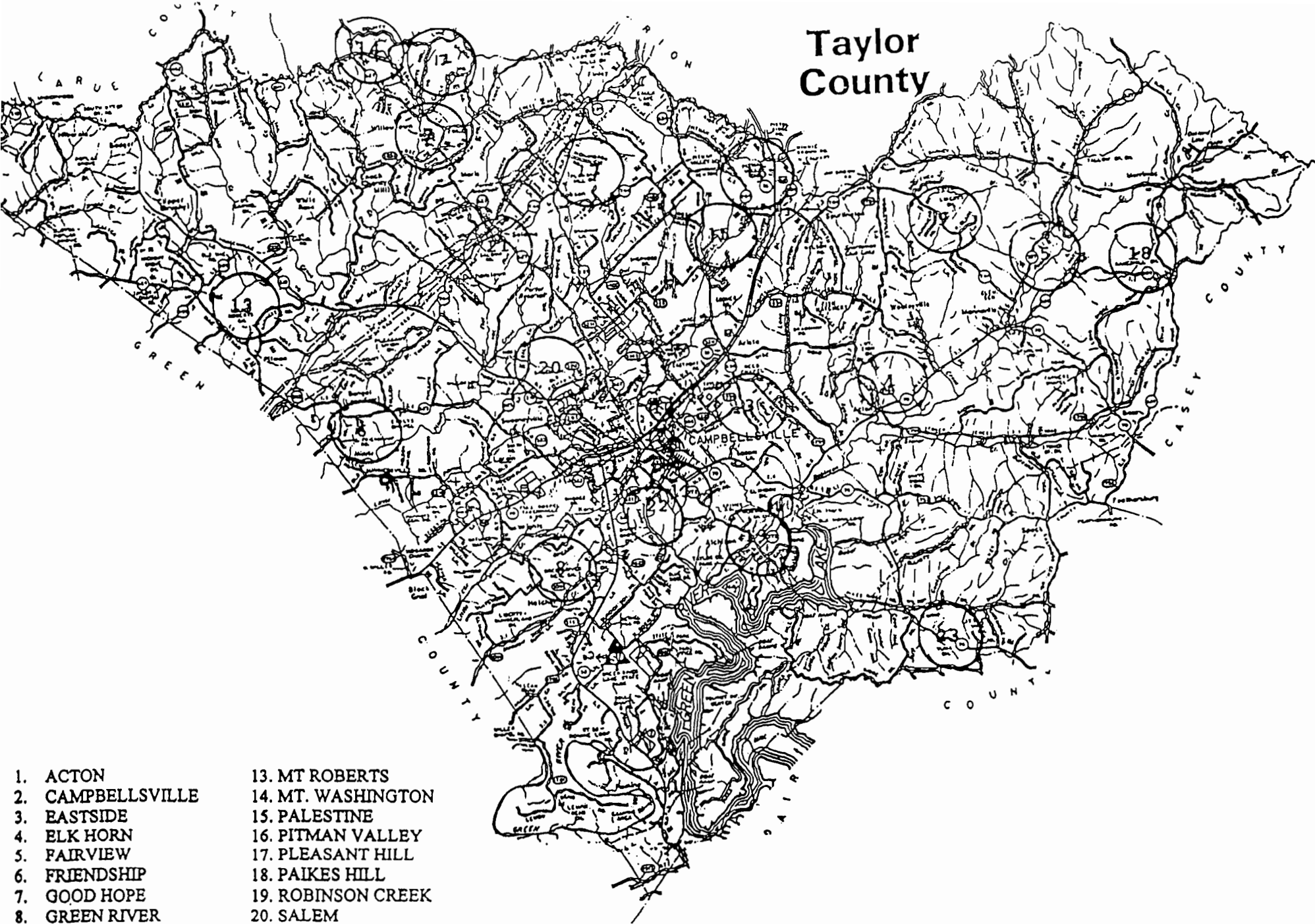

LETTER FROM NICKOLAI SYROVATKO

Dear brothers,

I greet you in the name of Jesus Christ and give brotherly greetings from many Russian Baptist churches and in particular from my co-workers on a field of church education. Today I want to add my several last letters and tell about the beginning of new learning year. I hope that information and examples about my ministry can add also some results of work Taylor County Baptist Association during last year as Partnership with Russian Baptist Churches.

I feel some emotion because every meeting of Brotherly Counsel always is special fellowship when we remember whole way with Jesus Christ and as God's co-workers during last months. Like annual meeting gives us a possibility for undertaking, that God leads at our lives. At the same time we can praise the Lord together with each other and ask Him to bless our plans in the future.

During last two weeks, we had different meetings and two seminars where we talked about our plans and preparation for new training year at our groups. On Tuesday, September 7th, we had special prayer worship where we asked the Lord that He will open His will and bless our churches and Russia at taking of God's Word. During these seminars, I had several meetings with brothers from other regions of Russia that studied at Pastor Schools at different learning years during last five years. A few brothers from them now study at Saint Petersburg Christian University. They and other Sunday school teachers remember our help through work of the Learning Center and thanks for this help them and their churches. They know and remember that a support of the churches of Kentucky gives us a possibility for kind studying, Bible study, and different contacts through training programs with many churches of Russia.

The New Learning Year is started. Today I know and have a plan of all my work and ministry for next four months as the teacher of Publishing House and volunteer of our Brotherhood. (I pray and dream that this will be more long period of time for my ministry for God's glory. Therefore I ask that you keep me up through your prayers at this my need and spiritual desire.) Now I am doing next things. (1) I continue to prepare curriculum materials for different training groups. (2) At this learning year, I will be training five groups of different ages and ministries also. Three groups are a part of my work at Publishing House. And two groups are a part of a ministry at Central Baptist Church. (3) Then I act as tutor to Sunday school teachers and leaders of small groups at local churches of the Association. (4) I continue to visit other churches as a preacher and a helper for pastors of local churches. Usually I preach during three Sunday or every month. (5) I have also a few invitations from other regions of Russia. Pastors of these churches ask me to help them at church programs. Therefore, I am happy that God gives me new possibilities for teaching and training leaders of Sunday school and small groups. Finally, I continue to write a textbook for Sunday school teachers and leaders of church education. I like this work. I feel how God blesses me on this way of my ministry. A subject of the textbook is questions of specific character of church teaching and principles of its organization

I am glad that I have rich plan of my work and ministry. I thank you and all friends for your support of my ministry. At the same time I ask all brothers and sisters to pray for me that God will give me like possibility for work on His' field in the future.

Dear brothers, I thank yours churches for donation for my ministry and family's needs also. I use funds for next expenses: transport and trains, a computer, printing of curriculum materials and stationery. Sometimes I can buy books for me and for training groups if I have any money left for this need.

Dear friends, thank you very much for your prayers and spiritual backing through your letters also. I feel that many persons pray for me, my ministry and family. I thank God for your desire to keep up our work at church education. Today I feel a peace in my heart and big desire for continuation of my ministry. Please, pray for me.

May God bless you, your families, churches, Campbellsville and America. With Christ's love and better wishes, brother in Christ.

The second session met with Lowell Avenue Baptist Church on Tuesday, September 9th.

Kentucky Heartland Outreach, a non-profit, faith-based organization located here in Campbellsville, has reached new heights through God's blessings. We have just completed our fifth summer camp and God has allowed us to set even more records. We worked on over 65 homes this summer in 8 counties and in the process of completing 3 new homes here in Taylor County, all for low-income individuals. This will take our four-year historical statistics to over 225 homes repaired, 7 new homes built, and over 2700 volunteers from 16 states and 7 foreign countries.

Currently, KHO is finalizing the summer camp program, which is our main focus of what we do. We have painted, roofed, built decks and wheelchair ramps, and many other things for low-income families all summer long. Through this ministry, we meet people's physical needs, but more importantly, this opens the door for us to minister to their spiritual needs as well.

Through the help of many foundations and grant opportunities, we have been able to expand our staff, our board of directors, and also our services to help even more people. BAPTIST STUDENT UNION REPORT 2003-2004

Highlights of Baptist Student Union Ministry includes

1. Sent nearly 30 ministry teams into Kentucky Baptist Churches

Each summer a letter is sent to over 1,400 Kentucky Baptist Churches with information regarding the ministry teams that the Campbellsville University Baptist Student Union is sponsoring. Each of these letters is a "touch" from our Baptist Student Union. We promote the availability of students to come for a day or weekend for the purpose of ministering to/with that church family. The student teams are not promoted as "professional". Neither is there an attempt to downplay their capability. The idea is to enlist students, train them in various ministry skills, and then procure opportunities for them to put those skills into practice. In the initial letter, we include information regarding team make-up and which specific weekends they will be available during the academic year.

Sending students out this way involves the trust of the local church, as well as my trust in the team that they will do well. It also gives opportunity to the local congregation to "grade" the dependability of our students teams. We see this in the evaluation forms that are returned to us. Hopefully, churches will have a good experience, as will the students involved.

2. Averaged over 200 in attendance for the fall and 146 for the spring semester in weekly worship.

Students meet weekly to plan every worship service. Services this year were designed to support our theme, "If my people pray" from II Chronicles 7:14. God blessed our campus in that there were 64 students who make professions of faith. We also recorded 208 professions of faith by those other than students. This number reflects decisions made during mission trips and ministry team weekends in Kentucky Baptist churches.

3. Had nearly 200 students involved in missions.

25 during Christmas break (three teams)

70 during spring break (six teams)

102 involved in summer missions

Christmas and spring break locations included these American cities: Arlington, Texas; New York City; Philadelphia; Councilor, and New Mexico.

International trips were to these countries: Brazil, Indonesia, Honduras, Northern Ireland, and Costa Rica.

Our Summer servants went to places all over our world.

4. Had nearly 300 participate in a discipleship group.

Over 200 students who studied Purpose Driven Life during our fall semester fueled this number. Overall, this was the largest number of students we have ever involved in our discipleship efforts during the last ten years.

5. Raised over \$50,000 to enable Christmas and spring break mission teams, sent \$8,000 to Collegiate Ministries Department of KBC for summer missions, and sent \$600 to Collegiate Ministries department to support a selected IMB MANNA Project.

Baptist Student Union students believe in God's provision. At times we seem to be faced with un-scaleable mountains, but our students have come to depend on God when the task is greater than we can manage.

6. Worked with 15 WMU groups from the Taylor County Baptist Association to provide 18 Commuter Lunches. Average student participation was around 75. Donations collected during these lunches accumulated to the \$600 sent to support the MANNA Project.

7. Organized and sent weekly teams in local nursing home. Students were regular visitors to the Metzmeier Nursing Home. 23 students participated in this ministry during the course of the year.

8. In March Baptist Student Union rented out a theater at Green River Cinema 6 in order to allow Campbellsville University students free admission to see "The Passion of the Christ". We weren't sure how students would respond, but thanked God when an overflow crowd appeared. The cinema folks were gracious enough to allow us to seat students in two theaters. Around 370 students, altogether, were there.

The Ministry of Baptist Student Union on the Campbellsville University campus is very grateful to Taylor County Baptists for their enduring support of this critical effort. Baptist Student Union remains the best arm of ministry Baptists have in reaching young adults with the Gospel of Jesus Christ.

WHEREAS, marriage is the foundation of the God-ordained institution of the family (Genesis 2:18-25; Matthew 19: 4-6; Mark 10:6-8); and

WHEREAS, the union of one man and one woman is the only form of marriage prescribed in the Bible as God's perfect design for the family (Genesis 2:24; Hebrews 13:4); and

WHEREAS, this traditional family is the fabric of all social order and the foundational institution that builds and maintains strong societies; and

WHEREAS, this traditional family provides the best environment for training and nurturing future generations (Deuteronomy 6: 4-9); and

WHEREAS, the institution of marriage is now in crisis; and

WHEREAS, a decision by the Massachusetts Supreme Judicial Court has resulted in legal same-sex "marriages" in the state of Massachusetts; and

WHEREAS, same-sex couples have challenged state laws protecting traditional marriage in the courts, and more challenges are expected; and

WHEREAS, the Kentucky Baptist Convention's Committee on Public Affairs has voted to join the "Vote Yes for Marriage" coalition, a statewide alliance that urges members to elevate the institution of marriage as one man and one woman and to work diligently to ensure passage of the Marriage Protection Amendment on November 2;

THEREFORE LET IT BE RESLOVED, that the messengers to the Taylor County Baptist Association meeting in Campbellsville, Kentucky, declare our support for the Kentucky Marriage Protection Amendment and urge Kentucky citizens to vote for its passage on November 2, 2004.
